2. **Each principal** of an elementary school seeking approval must submit a combined report of the school in triplicate, using this form, immediately after the end of the second month of school.

3. **The county superintendent** should send the copy of this report marked "State Office" to the State Department of Education as soon as all schools finish the second month of school. (Include one copy of report card used in county.)
