THOMAS "SAM" BASS, JR MSGT, United States Air Force, Retired

Thomas "Sam" Bass, Jr. peacefully passed away on August 6, 2012. He was born on December 12, 1932, in Elizabethton, TN, to the late Thomas and Sarah Bass. He grew up in the coal-mining town of Jenkins, KY. After graduating in 1951, from Dunham High School, he joined the United States Air Force.

While stationed in Austin, TX, he met Katherine Cyphers whom he married in June of 1956. From this union they were blessed with two children, Terry and Sarah. He later remarried the late Georgia Armstrong in the fall of 1966. From this union they were blessed with one daughter, Donna Lynn.

During his military career, Thomas was stationed at Andrews and Bolling Air Force Bases. While at Bolling, he worked with the Precision Measurement Equipment Laboratory in the 89th Field Maintenance Squadron. After serving 26 years of active duty he retired in 1979, but remained active at Andrews where he volunteered in the prostate clinic at the Malcolm Grow Medical Center. He was an active member of the East Coast Chapter of the Tuskegee Airmen and longtime treasurer for the Air Force Association.

Education was very important to him. Thomas and several Tuskegee Airmen often spoke at county schools. At each school he encouraged the students to stay in school and spoke on careers in aviation. He received numerous letters from students expressing their gratitude and appreciation for his encouragement. In his latter years, he volunteered as a docent at the Smithsonian Air and Space Museum.

Every year Thomas attended the Eastern Kentucky Social Club reunion to meet with his old classmates and hometown friends. His son will continue this lifelong tradition. Thomas' favorite therapy (as he called it) was singing karaoke at the Fox Den Enlisted Club on Andrews. Everyone enjoyed his rendition of "Old Blue Eyes" by Frank Sinatra.

Thomas loved attending church. He attended the Andrews and Bolling Air Force Base chapels. His son had the pleasure of leading him to Christ, which was an awesome answer to prayer. HALLELUJAH!

In addition to his parents, three brothers preceded Thomas in death, Robert Bass, Charles Bass and Junius Griffin.

Thomas leaves to cherish his memory, one son, Terry Bass; two daughters, Sarah Bass and Donna Hobbs (Jimmy); his loving companion of many years, Lenora Johnson; six grandchildren; four great-grandchildren; best friend, Donald Hudson, and a host of other relatives and friends.
