big baby coming along? Fine hope. I'm feeling  
fine but I'm so dog gone lonesome for  
you. Because you're so wonderful and  
such a swell wife. Well I received  
another one of your wonderful letters  
so it seems that everything is on the  
ball again. Well honey that certain  
somebody that's been watching over me  
thinks that I should stay here in  
this camp until Sept 30<sup>th</sup>. Yes honey  
I found out for sure today and I'm  
also off of restrictions so you see  
there must be something to my belief  
that somebody is taking care of me. Say  
after telling me about that terrible  
dream you had. I dreamt about it  
myself. I don't think we better dream  
like that any more. No No, darling it's  
too risky. I'm certainly glad to  
hear that after telling the folks  
in the factory about our baby

that they think its grand and that they treat you so nice. So your girlfriend is going to have a baby after being married five years, well they can't all be as fast and as good as we are, can they honey? Before I go on any further I want to say that I received your beautiful card and a swell box of candy. You sure are a peach darling and thanks loads.

No darling I don't have to keep my clothing ready for shipping anymore because I know that if I do go overseas the lord wants me to see the baby before I go.

So your friends think I look like John Payne. Well thats pretty nice of them to think so. Just tell them that Im really not John Payne but just plain Darling. Ha Ha I can't understand why you love me more than John Payne. yes that is funny.

Honey I'm afraid that I can't help  
in getting you to send to Johnnie  
and Roger because none of the P.K's  
in camp have got any. But I can  
get you the cigars. Will that be  
alright? Honey I went to the  
doctor the second day I got back.  
I told him what happened and how  
it bothered me so everything is  
coming along fine.

See imagine being in war for ten  
years. I even hate to think of it.  
I really have no right to complain  
after hearing something like that. But  
the only reason that I do complain  
is because I love you and I want  
to come home to you and stay with  
you for the rest of my life. Its  
really to bad about how Jean has  
changed. I remember when Emil's  
mother used to think that Emil  
was to good for her and I have

proof that I said he was. Darling  
there's going to be a day when we  
can have a right to look down at  
them and be catty too. just don't  
pay any attention. I won't forget  
these things honey because it burns  
me up too. specially when I can't  
do any thing about it right now.

Honey I don't want you to  
worry about me going overseas because  
if I do go over nothing is going  
to happen to me because the army  
borrowed me from you and they  
just have to give me back to you.  
Do you get what I mean.

Tell mom and Dad that I said  
for them to take care of themselves  
and that if they they don't watch  
out, I'm going to get ambition to  
write them and a few other people  
some mail. (over)

Well honey I had better close now  
or else I won't be able to have much  
to say in my next letter to you.  
So darling please be careful and take  
good care of yourself because I'm  
so deeply in love with you. I  
remain as always
