We have over 40 boys with Influenza, although only a very few are at all seriously sick. Most of the cases are very slight. A number of the Professors have been ailing at odd times, and Major Moore is not back from the Army, so that classes are not going with full steam as they ought to. At his request I also relieved Major Freeman of all duties so that the military work is being conducted as usual by the eadet officers, and there is no theoretical work.

I am pleased with the outlook for the R.O.T.C. and believe that we are going to have some successful work done when we get started.
