COMMENCEMENT ACTIVITIES AT THE CITADEL

CHARLESTON, S.C., May 4.--During The Citadel commencement exercises Saturday, May 12, 434 undergraduate degrees will be conferred by Col. William F. Prioleau Jr., chairman of the military college's Board of Visitors. Commencement exercises will be held in front of Bond Hall at 9:30 a.m.

Vice Adm. James Bond Stockdale, USN, president of the Naval War College and recently named to succeed Maj. Gen. Wallace E. Anderson as president of The Citadel, will deliver the commencement address.

Admiral Stockdale will be awarded a doctor of laws degree by the military college. Others receiving honorary degrees are Rev. Charles A. Graves, a 1953 honor graduate of The Citadel, who will receive a doctor of divinity degree; and former NBC-TV newscaster Frank Blair, South Carolina's former Adjutant General Robert L. McCrady, Charleston Mayor Joseph P. Riley Jr., and retired business executive Horace L. Tilghman, who will receive honorary doctor of laws degrees.

Weekend activities will begin Thursday (May 10) with a 2 p.m. meeting of the Board of Visitors in Jenkins Hall. At 3:45 p.m. there will be a review of the Corps of Cadets and presentation of awards.
