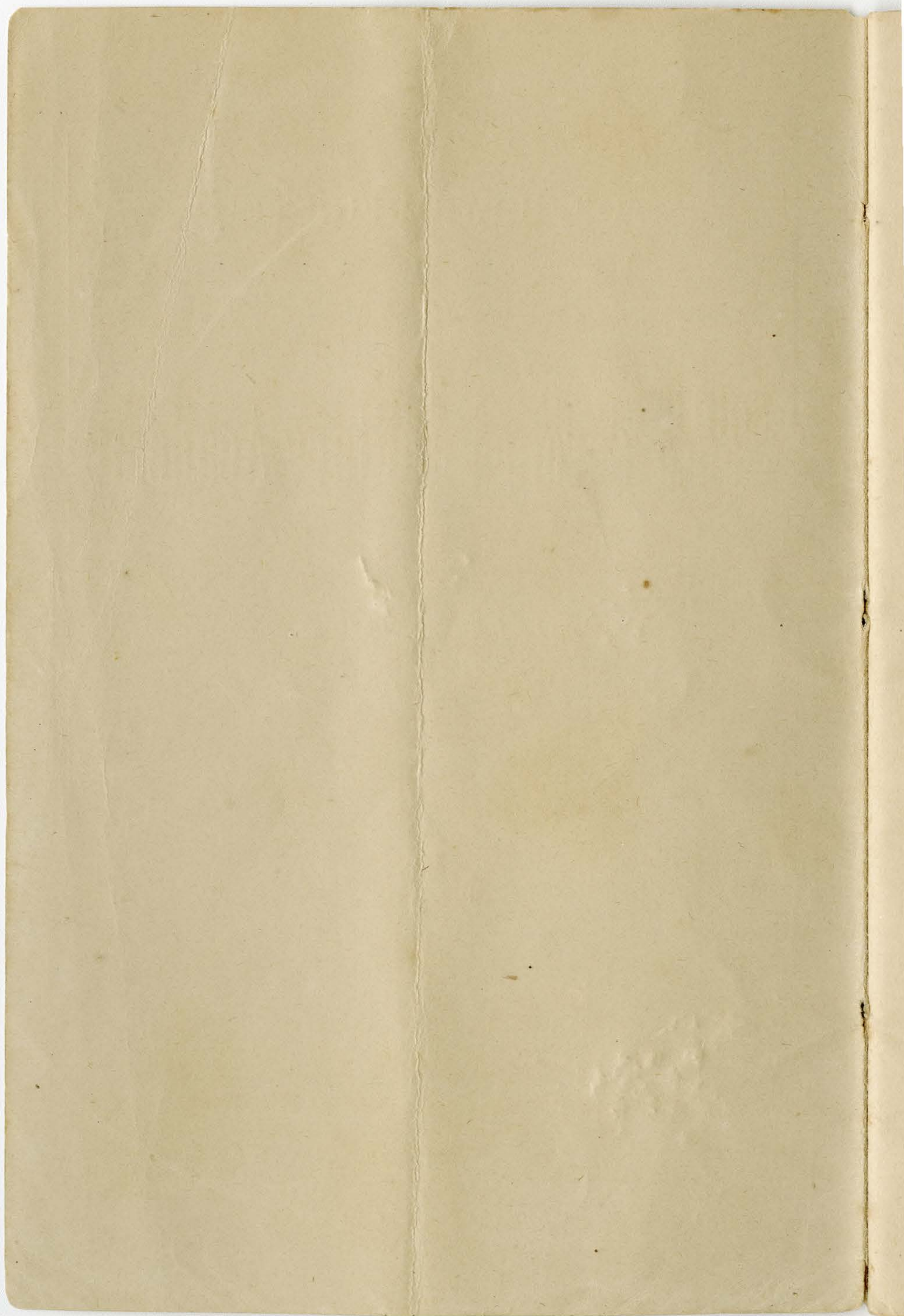

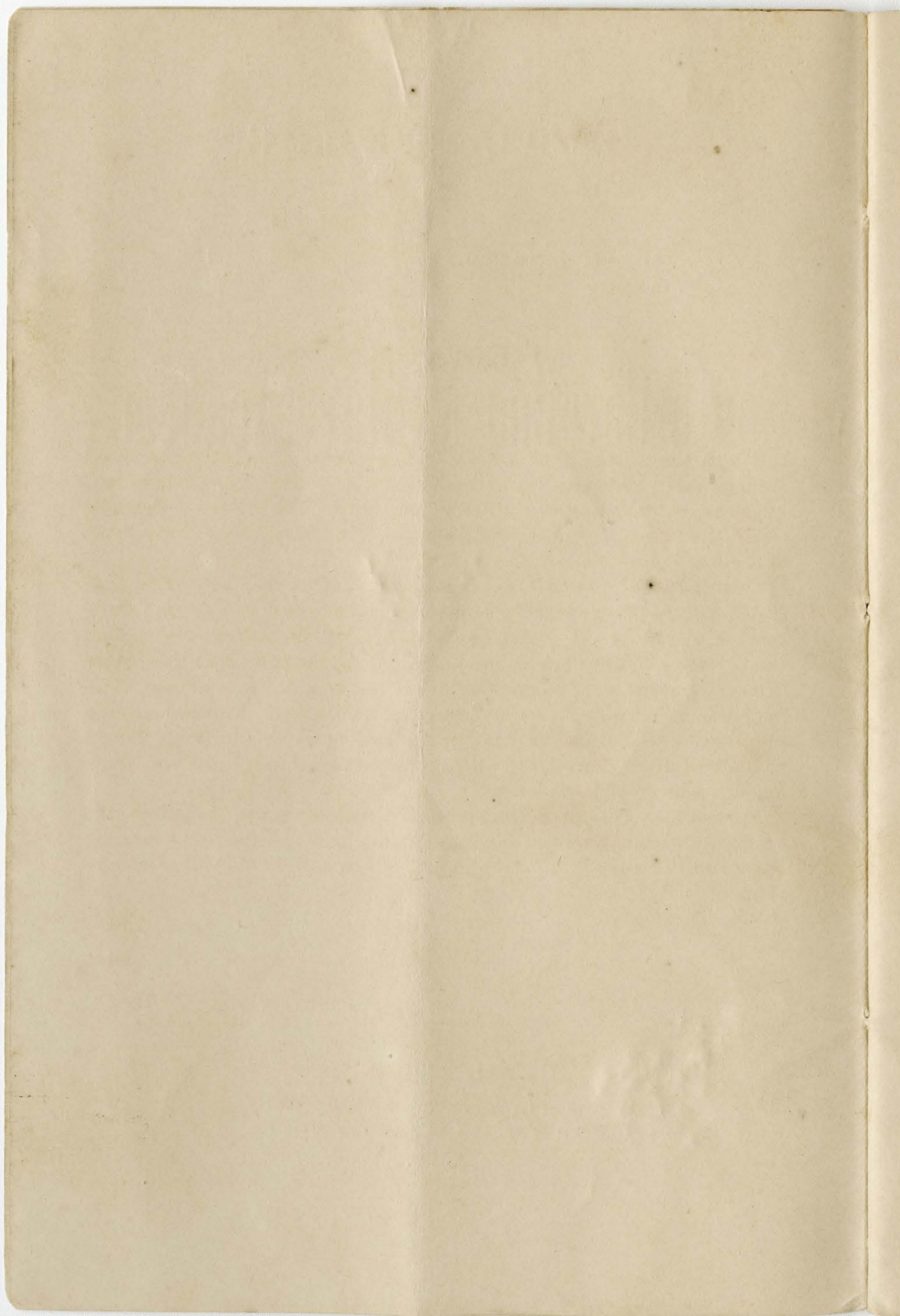

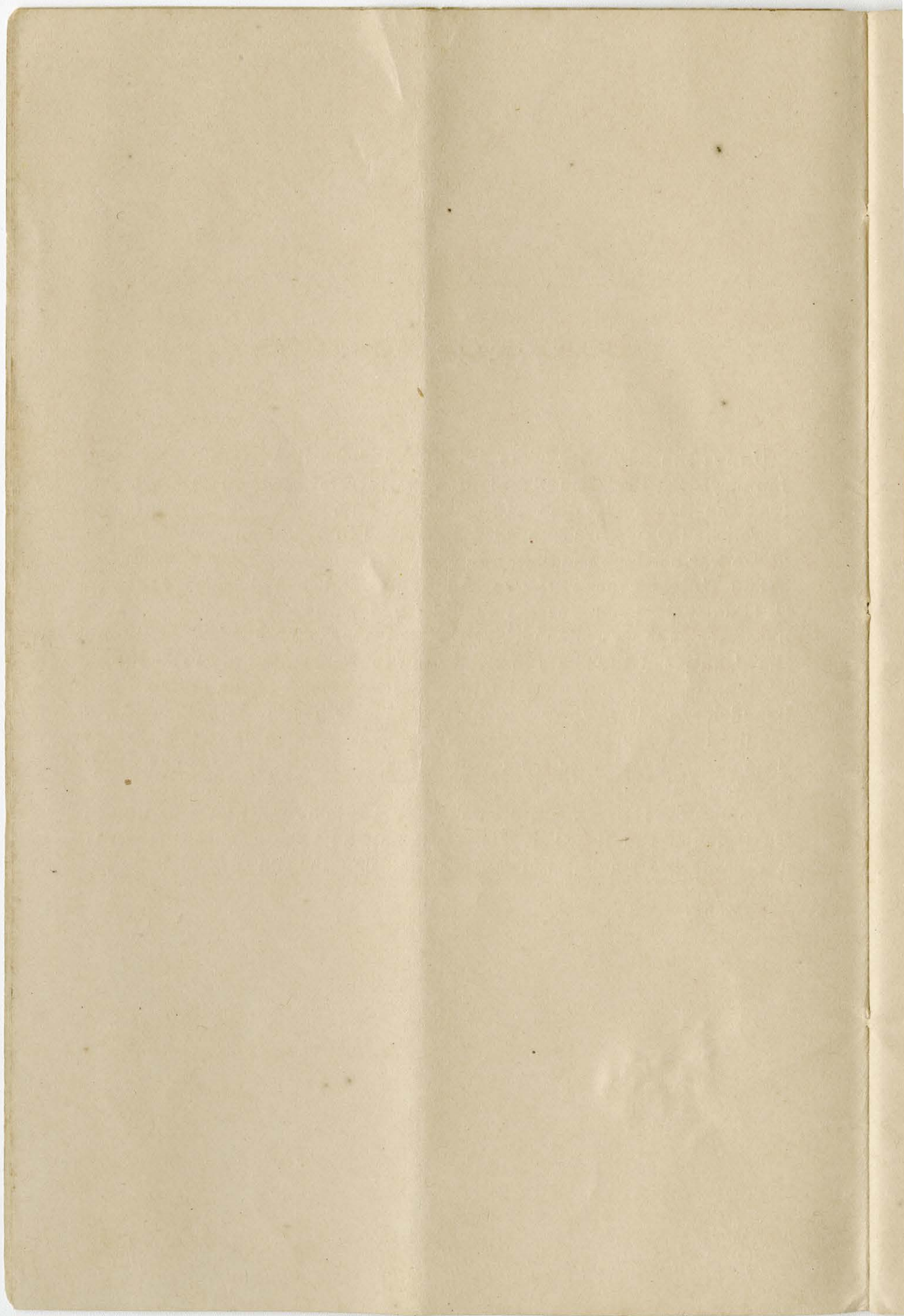


REMARKS.

UNDER the authority of an Act of the General Assembly, approved January 31st, 1882, the Board of Visitors re-opened, on October 1st, 1882, the South Carolina Military Academy. The School, originally established December 20th, 1842, continued in operation until the close of the war between the States, in 1865.

The Cadets consist of two classes, pay and beneficiary. The pay Cadets pay \$300 per year—a sum deemed sufficient to cover all their necessary expenses. Beneficiary Cadets are, by law, apportioned among the Counties of the State in proportion to representation in the House of Representatives. The pay Cadets are received from any State. The beneficiary Cadets, who are given free education and maintenance, are required to teach, after graduation, for two years in the Free Public Schools of the County from which they respectively received their appointment in the Academy.

Applications for appointments to the Academy must be made to the Chairman of the Board of Visitors, from whom the applicant receives a warrant directing him to report at a designated time to the Superintendent.

When any Cadet has a number expressing his demerit on the general Conduct Roll greater than 200 for his Fourth Class Year, 170 for his Third Class Year, 150 for his Second Class Year, 130 for his First Class Year, such Cadet is declared deficient in conduct, and is immediately suspended ; and his case is reported to the Board for action at its next meeting.

For instruction in Infantry Tactics and in military police and discipline, the Cadets are organized into a Battalion of four Companies, under the Superintendent, each Company being commanded by an officer of the Academy. The Cadet officers are selected from "those Cadets who have been most active and soldier-like in the performance of their duties, and most exemplary in their general deportment." In general, the officers are taken from the First Class; the Sergeants from the Second Class; and the Corporals from the Third Class.

COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.

The branches of study taught at the South Carolina Military Academy are grouped under the following departments:—

APPOINTMENT AND ADMISSION OF CADETS.

QUOTA OF BENEFICIARY CADETS.—Sixty-eight beneficiary Cadets, maintained and educated at the public expense, are provided for. By the Act reorganizing the Citadel two were at first assigned to each County. These are not yet graduated. When they are, each County of this State, will be entitled to the following number, the apportionment being on the basis of County representation in the House of Representatives:

PAY-CADETS.—Pay Cadets will be received from without as well as from within the State. This class of Cadets will not be subject to the competitive examinations which determine the selection of beneficiaries from the several Counties; but in presenting themselves for admission, will, in common with the selected beneficiary applicants, be examined by the Academic Board as to their qualifications under the standard prescribed.

TIME AND MANNER OF APPLYING, AND TIME OF EXAMINATION.—All applications for admission into the Academy should be addressed to the Chairman of the Board of Visitors before October 1st, and the candidates, on receiving their appointments, will repair to the Headquarters of the Academy by such day as the Board of Visitors may fix, and report themselves to the Superintendent. They will be examined by the Academic Board. Admission will not be permitted at any other time.

COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR BENEFICIARY CADETS.—The competitive examinations for selection of Beneficiary Cadets from the Counties, will be held during the month of September, at the respective County seats, and the candidates will, at as early a day as possible, make application to the Chairman of the Board for permission to appear before the examiners.

RENEWAL OF APPLICATION.—Application for Cadet appointments to the Academy, if not granted, must be renewed the next year, in order to be again considered. This renewal may be effected by letter to the Chairman of the Board of Visitors, merely stating the fact of such renewal.

MORAL AND PHYSICAL QUALIFICATIONS.—Applicants for Cadetships, both beneficiary and pay, must not be less than 15 nor more than 19 years of age at the time of admission. They are required to be of good moral character, free from contagious diseases, and of a physical conformation and development which will qualify them for military service.

KNOWLEDGE REQUISITE FOR ADMISSION.—The standard of educational qualification to enter the Fourth Class in the Academy is ability to read and write English with facility, Arithmetic completed, and a knowledge of the elements of English Grammar, of descriptive Geography, and of the History of the United States.

NON-RESIDENT.—No Beneficiary pupil shall be received into the Academy who is a non-resident of the State.

FORM OF APPLICATION, &c.—All applications for Beneficiary Cadetships in the Academy shall be made upon a printed form, which will be furnished on application to the Chairman of the Board.

These applications shall be laid before the Board, and upon approval by them the Chairman of the Board shall forward to each applicant a permit to appear for examination before the Special County Examiners.

There will be selected by the Superintendent of Education, three suitable persons in each County, who shall constitute the Board of Special Examiners for that County. Such examination to be directed by the Superintendent of Education.

BENEFICIARY CADETS.

MATRICULATION PROMISE.—The term of service of the Beneficiary Cadets shall be until graduation or regular discharge, and they shall subscribe in a book to be kept for that purpose, the following matriculation promise: "I hereby engage to serve as a Cadet until graduation, or until I shall be regularly discharged by proper authority, and promise, on honor, to obey all legal orders of the constituted authorities of the Academy, and discharge the duties as Cadet with regularity and fidelity, while I continue a member thereof, and I further agree to teach for two years after graduation in the free public schools of the County whence I have received my appointment."

PAY CADETS.

PAY PUPIL TO SIGN AN OBLIGATION TO REMAIN IN ACADEMY UNTIL GRADUATION OR DISCHARGE.—No pay pupil shall be admitted in the Academy until such pupil has signed an obligation to remain in the institution until graduation, or otherwise regularly discharged; and the assent in writing of the parent or guardian of the pupil to such obligation shall be placed upon the files of the institution.

He shall subscribe the following matriculation promise:

MATRICULATION PROMISE.—"I hereby engage to serve as a Cadet in the South Carolina Military Academy until graduation, or until I shall be regularly discharged by proper authority—and I promise, on honor,

to obey all legal orders of the constituted authorities thereof, and discharge the duties as a Cadet with regularity and fidelity, while I continue a member thereof."

ASSENT OF PARENTS, &C.—"As parent (or guardian) I do hereby assent to the above obligation on behalf of my son (or ward)".

AMOUNT PAID BY PAY CADETS.—Pay Cadets shall pay annually three hundred dollars, by transmitting to the Superintendent quarterly, in advance, seventy-five dollars—which sum of three hundred dollars shall be in full of subsistence, clothing, tuition, books and stationery, medical attendance, and all charges and expenses whatever, for the year. Upon failure to pay the sum required, within ten days after the time specified, the Cadet shall be discharged.

NO MONEY REFUNDED.—No pay Cadet who may be discharged, suspended, dismissed or expelled, shall be entitled to be refunded any part of the money paid in advance.

CLOTHING.

The issue to each Cadet shall not exceed for any one year, the following articles of clothing, viz :

1 Uniform Coatee, gray cloth ; 2 pair of gray cloth trousers for winter ; 2 pair of White Drilling and 4 pair of Brown Drilling Trousers for summer ; 1 Forage Cap, blue cloth ; 1 Dress Hat ; 1 Fatigue Jacket for winter, of gray cloth ; 2 Fatigue Jackets for summer, of Brown Drilling ; 6 Shirts ; 12 Collars ; 3 pairs Drawers ; 1 pair Suspenders ; 2 Black Cravats ; 6 Pocket Handkerchiefs ; 6 pair Socks ; 2 pair Shoes ; 2 pair White Gloves ; 1 Shoe Brush ; 1 Dressing Comb ; 1 Fine Comb ; 1 Clothes Brush ; 1 Hair Brush ; 1 Tooth Brush ; 2 pair Sheets ; 2 Pillow Cases ; 2 Towels.

BADGES OF MILITARY DISTINCTION.—Cadets acting as officers and non-commissioned officers, shall be designated by badges, as prescribed for U. S. Military Academy.

THE PRESCRIBED DRESS ONLY WORN.—No other dress than that prescribed shall be worn by a Cadet, on any occasion, without permission from the Superintendent, nor will any Cadet be permitted to keep in his possession any other articles of dress.

ACADEMIC DUTIES.

The Academic duties and exercises begin on the 1st of October and continue until August 1st. Examinations of the several Classes are held the closing week in February, and in July. After either examination, Cadets found deficient in studies and conduct are discharged from the Academy, unless for special reasons the authorities should otherwise decide.

These Examinations, usually written, are thorough.

They require from Cadets close attention to study during the Session, and admit of no evasion or slighting of any part of the course.

PROBATIONARY TERM.

Cadets on entering the Academy will not be furnished with under-clothing, shoes, or uniform (except the undress suit), until after a probation of three months; at the end of which time, the Superintendent, with the concurrence of the Professors, shall have power to dismiss from the Academy all such probationary pupils as shall have shown utter incapacity, or whose conduct shall have been grossly immoral or generally improper or insubordinate.

CONDUCT.

DELINQUENCIES.—To all the recorded delinquencies of the Cadets shall be affixed a number not exceeding 10, corresponding to the degree of criminality.

DEFICIENCY.—When any Cadet shall have a number expressing his demerit on the general conduct roll, greater than 200 for his Fourth Class year, 170 for his Third Class year, 150 for his Second Class year, 130 for his First Class year, such Cadet shall be declared deficient in conduct, and be immediately suspended and reported to the Board for action at its next meeting.

MILITARY SESSION—FURLOUGHS.

MILITARY SESSION—FURLOUGHS—HOW GRANTED.—There is a suspension of the Academic studies for the months of August and September, and the instruction of those months is exclusively Military. During

said months, when the corps is not in camp, the Superintendent may on the application of parents or guardians, grant furloughs to such Cadets as shall have deserved the indulgence.

Any Cadet who shall overstay his furlough or leave of absence, will subject himself to dismissal; unless he shall produce, on his return, certificates satisfactory to the Superintendent, of his having been prevented from returning by sickness of some other unavoidable cause.

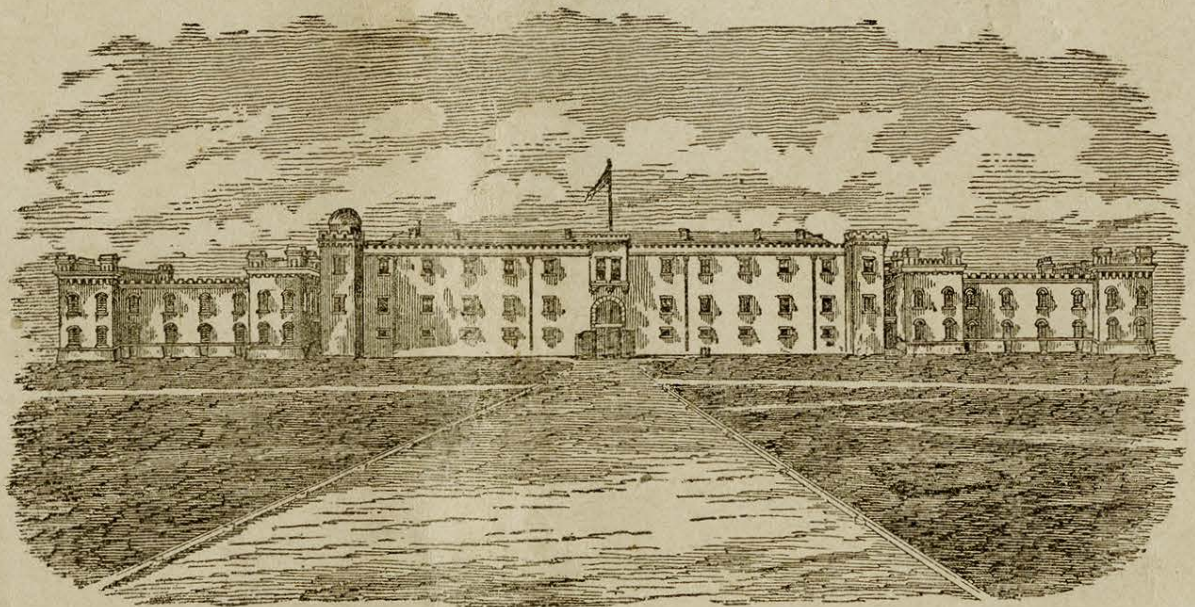
