WASHINGTON, DC - 14 JUNE 1949 - General Clark went to the Pentagon Building at 0830 hours and at 0915 had a conference with General Omar Bradley, Army C/S. He spent the morning at the Pentagon visiting with various sections and went to his mother's apartment for lunch. He spent the afternoondowntown with Mrs. Clark, and dined at home.

\* \* \* \*

WASHINGTON, DC - 15 JUNE 1949 - General Clark went to the Pentagon Building at 0900 hours and at 1045 had a conference with Lt. General Wedemeyer, Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations. At 1200 hours he called on Mr. Gordon Gray, Secretary of the Army. He lunched at home and returned to the Pentagon Building at 1430 hours and at 1500 participated in a television broadcast to accompany the showing of CRUSADE IN EUROPE, presented by TIME and LIFE magazines, following which he returned to his mother's apartment.

WASHINGTON, DC - 16 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at the Pentagon Building at 0900 hours and at 0930 saw Colonel Kraus of the Organization and Training Division, Department of the Army. At 1000 he had another conference with General Wedemeyer and at 1030 was interviewed by Mr. George McGill, Army Editor of the Armed Force magazine. He had lunch with Mr. John J. McCloy, recently appointed High Commissioner to Germany, and Mr. Paul Hoffman, Director of Economic Cooperation Administration.

WASHINGTON, DC - 17 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at the Pentagon Building at 0930 hours and at 1000 saw General Akin, Chief Signal Officer of the Department of the Army. At 1130 he went to the White House where he had a talk with President Harry S. Truman. Following his appointment with the President, he returned to the Pentagon Building and had lunch with General Dwight D. Eisenhower. Following lunch, the General went to the Airport, accompanied by Mrs. Clark, Lt. William Clark, and went to Cleveland, Ohio. They were met at the airport by Mrs. William Stevenson, wife of the President of Oberlin College, and Mr. Joseph Silber, chairman of the MTO Red Cross reunion. The party went directly to the Hotel Cleveland where the party was the guest of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railroad Company in the Greenbrier Suite. General and Mrs. Joseph P. Sullivan arrived later in the afternoon and stayed with General and Mrs. Clark.

CLEVELAND, OHIO - 18 JUNE 1949 - General Clark spent the day in his suite resting and preparing his talk before the Red Cross reunion and at 1900 hours, accompanied by Mrs. Clark, General and Mrs. Sullivan, Bill Clark and Captain Dallam, went to the reunion cocktail party, followed by the reunion banquet in the Hotel Cleveland. Following dinner the General was the principal speaker.

CLEVELAND, OHIO-SAN FRANCISCO - 19 JUNE 1949 - General and Mrs. Clark and party departed for the airport at 0830 hours. They took off for San Francisco, stopping at Cheyenne, Wyoming to refuel, arriving Hamilton Field at 1900.

SAN FRANCISCO - 20 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and spent the early part of the morning opening his mail and catching up on correspondence. At 1115 hours he saw Colonel Gray, JA, and 1130 Captain Robert W.

Berry, the new Naval Liaison Officer. At 1145 hours he went to see Ann's new studio on the Post and then went to his quarters for lunch. He played golf in the afternoon with Bill Clark and Colonel Woodward, and spent the evening at home.

SAN FRANCISCO - 21 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at the office at 0900 hours and at 0930 hours saw Mr. Michael Desmond of the San Francisco Police Department, a friend of Mrs. DeWitt Taylor. At 1000 he saw Colonel Paul R. Goode and together they went to see the new prefabricated house constructed by the Non-Commissioned Officers Club. At 1115 hours he saw Colonel Samuel Browning, the acting Chief of Staff of the Unification Headquarters. He had lunch at home and in the afternoon played golf. In the evening, the General and Mrs. Clarkhad a group of friends in for a movie.

SAN FRANCISCO - 22 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0845 hours and at 1000 saw General Lester, Commanding the San Francisco Port of Embarkation. At 1100 hours he saw Colonel Goode regarding construction of the new housing. He lunched at home and had as guests Captain and Mrs. Frank Talbot, former Navy Liaison Officer who is departing for duty at Bremerton Navy Yard, Seattle, and Captain Robert W. Beery, the newly-arrived Navy Liaison Officer. He played golf in the afternoon with Bill and Colonel Woodward and Jim Naulty, the Club professional. In the evening, together with Ann and Bill, the General and Mrs. Clark went to the quarters of Lt. Colonel and Mrs. Hill for cocktails, followed by smorgasbord and dancing.

SAN FRANCISCO - 23 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0830 hours and at 0900 hours saw the three Italian Attaches from the Italian Embassy in Washington. They had arrived to pay their respects to General Clark, who had invited them to Sixth Army area for a tour of inspection. The General spent the remainder of the morning with various staff officers. He lunched at home and in the afternoon went fishing. At 1730 hours General and Mrs. Clark went to the Officers Club where they gave a receptionfor the Italian Attaches - Captain Franco Baslini (Navy), Colonel Carlo Unia, (Air), Lt. Colonel Umberto de Martino (Military - Army).

SAN FRANCISCO - 24 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0930 hours and at 0945 saw Rear Admiral Joseph E. Stika, commander of the 12th Coast Guard District. At 1015 hours he saw Lt. Colonel Gray, the JA, and at 1100 had a conference with Colonel Woodward and General Davidson. He lunched at home and played golf in the afternoon. He had dinner at home with his family.

SAN FRANCISCO - 25 JUNE 1949 - General Clark went fishing at 0500 hours, but due to rough weather came back in about 0800 hours. He played golf during the afternoon and at 1700 went to the apartment of Captain Robert Beery for a house warming. Following that he and Mrs. Clark went to dinner as guests of Consul General and Mrs. Benedetto D'Acunzo in honor of the Italian Attaches.

SAN FRANCISCO - 26 JUNE 1949 - General Clark played golf this day and spent the evening at home.

SAN FRANCISCO - 27 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 1000 saw Mr. Ettore Della Giovanna of the newspaper D'ITALIA, who saw the General for an interview for the Italian newspapers. At 1115 hours he saw Lt. Colonel Gray. He lunched at home and returned to his office at 1400 hours. At 1500 hours he saw Mr. Senior, the Canadian Consul, and returned home about 1630 hours. He had dinner at home with his family.

SAN FRANCISCO - 28 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 1000 saw Brigadier General Watson, Commanding General of the Southern Military District. He lunched at home and played golf in the afternoon with Bill and Colonel Woodward. He had dinner at home.

SAN FRANCISCO - 29 JUNE 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and saw General Lawton, Commanding General of the Sea Coast Branch of Artillery School . At 1030 hours, accompanied by Mrs. Clark and Bill, the General went to Hamilton Field and departed for the Northwest.

FORT LEWIS - CAMANO ISLAND, WASHINGTON - 30 JUNE, 1,2,3,4 JULY 1949 - General Clark inspected units at Fort Lewis and Fort Worden and Port of Embarkation, Seattle, and over the Fourth of July weekend visited at Camano Island with the Griffiths.

FORT LEWIS-HAMILTON FIELD, CAL. 5 JULY 1949 - General Clark returned by car to Seattle this morning and at 1335 hours took off from Gray Field for Hamilton Field, California, arriving at 1700 hours. He spent the evening at home.

SAN FRANCISCO - 6 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0815 hours and immediately saw General Davidson, C/S. At 1100 hours he saw Brigadier General McKittrick, acting Commander, Department of the Pacific, U. S. Marine Corps, who made an official call. He lunched at home and played golf in the afternoon with Bill, Colonels Pesek and Woodward. The General and Mrs. Clark had dinner in the evening at the home of Lt. Col. and Mrs. Frederick Eichorn.

SAN FRANCISCO - 7 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 0930 saw Colonel Robert McBride, the new Army Comptroller. At 0945 hours he saw Colonel Whiteside, the new Chemical Officer. At 1000 hours he received a call from Admiral Nuber, USN retired, and Captain Robert Berry, the Naval Liaison Officer. At 1100 hours he saw Mr. Herbert Cummings, son of Nathan Cummings, and at 1130 hours saw Colonel Oxx. He lunched at home and played golf in the afternoon with Bill. He dined at home with the family.

and at 1000 hours went to Fort Mason for the renaming of the USAT GENERAL DARBY. He spent the afternoon conferring with various staff officers. At 1800 hours the Clark family went to the quarters of Colonel Browning for cocktails and supper.

SAN FRANCISCO - 9 JULY 1949 - General Clark spent the day fishing with Colonel D'Orsa and Sergeant Flint, with/much success.

SAN FRANCISCO - 11 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0845 hours and at 0900 saw General Hayden, CG of the Anti-Aircraft Artillery moving to the Hanford and Fort Lewis, Washington, area. At 0950 hours General Clark called on Rear Admiral J. E. Stika at the Appraisers Building in San Francisco, and from there went to the office of Rear Admiral Lynde D. McCormick in the Federal Building. He then went to Treasure Island where he was received by an Honor Guard by Admiral George D. Murray, Commander of Western Sea Frontier. The General lunched at home and returned to the office until 1530 hours when he went out for a short round of golf.

SAN FRANCISCO - 12 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 0930 hours received a call from Rear Admiral J. H. Doyle and Colonel John Keliher of the MIKI staff. At 0945 hours he saw Special Agent Weyand of the FBI, and at 1000 saw Brigadier General C. Lynn Fox, CG of the 91st Division, ORC. At 1100 hours the General and Colonel McMahon went to the University of San Francisco to call on the President of the University Father Dunne. He lunched at home and spent the afternoon playing golf. At 1015 hours General Clark met the newly-assigned MIKI staff officers and at 1045 saw Lt. Col. Eichorn, the Post Ordnance Officer. At 1215 hours he had lunch with Mr. Coblentz, publisher of the Call-Bulletin, at the Family Club, from where he returned about 1500 hours. At 1830 the Clarks went to dinner at the Vincent DaMassa's.

SAN FRANCISCO - 14 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 0930 hours saw Lt. Colonel W. R. Woods who came in to say goodbye prior to his reassignment as PMS&T of Brown Military Schools. At 0945 the General saw Major Ward B. Waits, former Assistant Secretary General Staff, who was being reassigned to Fort Ord as Provost Marshal. At 1000 he had a conference with Captain Berry and the MIKI public information officer. At 1130 hours

he saw Chaplain Patrick Ryan and the four visiting chaplains who were enroute to the Far East command at invitation of the Department of the Army - Rabbi Leo Jung (Jewish), The Rev. Matthew Miller (Catholic), The Rev. J. Warren Hastings (Disciples of Christ) and The Rev. O. P. Kretzmann, President of Valparaiso University. The General lunched at home and played golf in the afternoon. At 1930 hours, with the family, he went to the opening of the new Enlisted Men's Service Club at the Presidio.

SAN FRANCISCO - 15 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 1000 saw Major Koeber of the CIC, and at 1100 saw Mr. Katz, representative of the 509th Parachute Infantry Association. O'Sullivan and Colonel Boyd, the senior National Guard Instructor. The group made a tour of inspection of the camp and participated with Lt. Governor Goodwin McKnight at the Governor's Day review of the National Guard encampment. Following the review, the group lunched as guests of General and Mrs. O'Sullivan. Immediately following lunch, General Clark and his party returned to San Francisco. He played a round of golf with Bill that late afternoon.

SAN FRANCISCO-ENROUTE TO CHICAGO - 17 JULY 1949 - General Clark, accompanied by Colonel Gray, Bill and Sgt. Flint, went fishing and spent the day on the water. SAN FRANCISCO - 22 JULY 1949 - Ann's birthday. The General remained at home until 1915 hours, helping Ann open her birthday gifts. He arrived at the office at 0920 hours and at 0930 hours saw Colonel John Stokes, Jr., newly-assigned Chief of Staff, Central Military District. At 1000 hours the General had a G-3 conference with Colonel Slocum, and at 1030 he saw Major General Bethea, Surgeon of the Far East Command, who called on the General accompanied by Brigadier General Frank Cole of Letterman General Hospital. The General lunched at home and in the afternoon played

golf. The Clarks had a few guests in for dinner and a movie for Ann's birthday.

SAN FRANCISCO - 23 JULY 1949 - General Clark went fishing and had a successful day. He caught eight salmon, one weighing thirty pounds.

SAN FRANCISCO - 24 JULY 1949 - General Clark played golf during the day and in the evening at 1730 hours he and Mrs. Clark were hosts at a reception honoring the Atomic Energy Committee who were visiting the Bay Area.

SAN FRANCISCO - 25 JULY 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0820 hours and saw warious members of the staff. He lunched at home and returned to the office at 1345 hours. He saw General Roberts, CG of the ORC 13th Armoured Group. He retrned home at 1600 hours and at 1700 hours he and Mrs. Clark went to the residence of Mrs. Ambrose Nevin Diehl for an At Home honoring Madame Pandit, Ambassadress to the United States from India. They had dinner at home.

They arrived at 1145 hours and were met by the Marine Guard of Honor. General Clark went on a tour of inspection of the 13th Armored in training and saw their field firing. At 1415 hours he went to the Karlsbad Hotel at Oceanside, and then, accompanied by Mrs. Clark, was a guest of General and Mrs. Roberts at the Del Mar Racetrack for lunch and the races. Hodge, who was killed in a plane accident sometime ago, but just recently found. SAN FRANCISCO - 28 AUGUST 1949 - General Clark called his mother this day as it was her wedding anniversary. General and Mrs. Clark were guests of Admiral and Mrs. McCormick for luncheon at their quarters 62, Treasure Island. In the evening they were guests of Colonel and Mrs. Paul R. Goode for cocktails and then dinner at the club.

SAN FRANCISCO - OROVILLE, CALIF. - 29 AUGUST 1949 - General Clark left this morning, accompanied by Mrs. Clark, and drove to Oroville where they were met by Mr. Vincent DaMassa, who took them on a tour of the orchards in that vicinity. At noon General and Mrs. Clark were guests of the Rotary Club of Oroville, and the General addressed that group. They then returned to the Presidio where they remained that evening

at their quarters attending to packing details.

SAN FRANCISCO - 30 AUGUST 49 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and attended to routine office matters and saw various staff membmers. At 0955 he saw Brigadier General Frederic B. Buther. At noon the General returned to his quarters for lunch and remained there throughout the afternoon. At 1930 hours General and Mrs. Clark attended the formal dinner given by Major General and Mrs. Walter W. Robertson, the deputy commanding general, at their home, honoring the Clarks on their departure.

SAN FRANCISCO - 31 AUGUST 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0815 hours and at 0830 hours saw Wendell Witter of Dean Witter and Company regarding his investments. He attended to routine matters and at 1000 hours had a haircut. At 1100 hours a decoration ceremony was held in the lobby of Headquarters Building. At 1115 Dr. Van Woerden, the Consul General of The Netherlands called to say goodbye to General Clark before his departure for new station at Ft. Monroe. The General then saw Colonel Browning after which he returned to his quarters for lunch and the afternoon. At 1730 hours General and Mrs. Clark attended a cocktail party given by Colonel and Mrs. LeCount Slocum, followed by a dinner hosted by Colonel and Mrs. William C. McMahon, in the Anza Room of the Officers Club.

SAN FRANCISCO - 1 SEP TEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and attended to routine business matters and saw various members of his staff. He returned to his quarters for lunch and at 1345 hours attended the Ladies Club meeting and fashion show. He said a few words of farewell. General Clark played a short round of golf and at 1900 was guest of honor at a Farewell Dinner given by the City of San Francisco in the Gold Room of the Hotel Fairment.

SAN FRANCISCO - 2 SEP TEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0915 hours and attended to correspondence and saw several staff officers. He returned to quarters at 1130 hours and saw Sgt. Clair Herron, currently at Letterman General Hospital, and whom the General had met in Hawaii. The General returned to the office for a short time after lunch and returned home again to do some packing. At 1630 hours he went to the Parade Ground for a Guard of Honor and parade and them to the Officers Club for a farewell reception, attended by officers and civilians.

SAN FRANCISCO - 3 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark went fishing this morning and returned to quarters in the afternoon. In the evening the General and Mrs. Clark attended the formal dinner dance given by Colonel and Mrs. William Woodward at the club after cocktails at their quarters.

SAN FRANCISCO - 4 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark spent this day packing and playing golf. At 1800 hours they went to the quarters of General and Mrs. Garrison Davidson for a cocktail party. Spent evening at home.

SAN FRANCISCO - 5 SEP TEMBER 1949 - The Clarks had breakfast at the quarters of Colonel and Mrs. J. M. Pesek. They finished packing and at 1600 hours about 80 officers and their wives arrived for a farewell drink prior to the departure time of 1700 hours. At this hour, the General and Mrs. Clark, accompanied by Colonel and Mrs. Edwin B. Howard, drove to Oakland and boarded the CITY OF SAN FRANCISCO enroute to Chicago.

6 SEPTEMBER 1949 to 14 SEPTEMBER 1949 - ENROUTE - General and Mrs. Clark were enroute to their new post at Fort Monroe, Viginia. They stopped off at Chicago, Muncie, Indiana, and spent a weekend at Jeffersonville, Indiana with Brig Gen. and Mrs. Joseph P. Sullivan. They picked up a new Cadillac sedan in Muncie and drove the balance of the trip.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE, VIRGINIA - 14 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General and Mrs. Clark and Ann arrived at Fort Monroe in the General's personal car at 1230 hours. Colonel and Mrs. E. B. Howard followed intheir car. General Clark was met at the Main Gate by Colonel Fickett, the Deputy Post Commander, and Lt. Colonel C. Coburn Smith. General Clark's aide, and escorted by MP guards to the Band Stand area at the corner of Ingalls and Fenwick Roads, across from the Hotel Chamberlin, where a Guard of Honor and 17-gun salute greeted the future Chief of Army Field Forces. Stepping from the driver's seat and dressed in civilian clothes, General Clark was met by Major General Robert C. Macon, Deputy Chief of Army Field Forces, and reviewed the Guard of Honor consisting of the 50th Army Band and Company "C" of the 503rd Military Police Battalion. General Clark then talked with Lt. General Wedemeyer by telephone, as well as Brig Gen Gar Davidson, Chief of Staff Sixth Army. He spent the balance of the day at his quarters.

FORT MONROE - 16 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark remained at his quarters all day.

FORT MONROE - 17 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0830 hours and conferred with General Devers from 0900 to 1000. He then initiated a telegram of congratulations to the Air Force on the 2nd anniversary of its autonomy. He left his office at 1130 hours. That evening General and Mrs. Clark were dinner guests of General and Mrs. Fred Blesse at their quarters.

FORT MONROE, MIRGINIA - 18 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark remained at his quarters during the morning. Official calls were made by Section Chiefs 1600 to 1730 hours.

FORT MONROE, VIRGINIA - 19 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0830 hours. He had a conference with General Devers and Dr. Atanasoff, Scientific Adviser, from 0900 to 1000 hours. He lunched at home and at 1400 hours an orientation briefing was held by Training Section. Bill Clark arrived at Langley Field at 1230 hours. While at Langley Field, General Clark called on Major General W. D. Old, CG, 9th Air Force, and was visited at Base Operations by Major General Robert M. Lee, CG, Tactical Air Command. General Clark spent the early hours of the afternoon in his office and then returned to his quarters.

FORT MONROE, VIRGINIA - 20 SEP TEMBER 1949 - Bill Clark left for West Point this morning, flying from Langley Field. General Clark arrived at the office at 0830 hours. He attended a briefing by Developments Section at 0930 hours; at 1130 hours he received Major General Clarkson, CG, 3rd Infantry Div; and Brig Gen John H. Church came in at 1145 hours to pay his respects on his departure from Fort Monroe to his new assignment in the Far East Command. He attended to routine office matters and at 1330 received a report of the program on Armour Development and Anti-Tank Developments. The General spent the evening at home.

FORT MONROE - 23 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at the office at 0830 hours. At 0930 a briefing was held on changes in Circular 64. Sections involved were Adjutant General, Fiscal, Chaplain, Personnel. General Clark had lunch at home and continued his contacts with various officers on his staff. At 1830 hours General and Mrs. Clark attended a cocktail party given by Major General and Mrs. Macon at the Officers Beach Club.

FORT MONROE-WASHINGTON, DC - 24 SEP TEMBER 1949 - General Clark and Colonel Smith departed at 0715 hours for Washington, DC. They landed at the National Air Port at 0830 hours and at 0900 hours conferred in the Pentagon Building with General Collins, C/S, and also with the chief of the section pertaining to Guided Missile.

General Clark visited with his mother at 1230 hours and at 1340 went to National Airport for departure to Fort Monroe. He arrived at his quarters about 1550 hours. He remained at home during the evening.

FORT MONROE - 25 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark spent a quiet day at quarters. At 1800 hours he attended a stag reception and dinner given by Admiral Blandy, the Commander-in-Chief, Atlantic and U. S. Atlantic Fleet, in honor of the members of the Joint Civilian Orientation Conference at the Naval Base. At 0200 hours this day daylight saving time went off.

FORT MONROE - 26 SEP TEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at the office at 0830 hours. At 0930 hours a briefing was held on Field Artillery Program and Developments, and Tactical Air Support. At 1330 hours, General Clark attended a briefing on AAA and Air Defense. The Peninsula Civil Leaders sponsored a dinner in honor of General Devers and General Clark at the Chamberlin Hotel at 1815 hours. Governorelect John S. Battle extended the official welcome of the State and Peninsula to the two Generals. The farewell address for General Devers was given by G. Alvin Massenburg, Elizabeth City -County delegate and speaker of the Virginia House of Delegates. Others present at the dinner were Mayor Leo J. Taylor of Phoebus. Mayor George C. Bentley of Hampton, Mayor R. Cowles Taylor of Newport News. Supervisors Chairman J. F. Smith of York County, Supervisors Chairman T. Abernathy of Warwick County and Supervisors Chairman J. G. Crenshaw of Elizabeth City County. Judge Frank A. Kearney of Elizabeth City County-Newport News Circuit Court was master of ceremonies, and S. S. Bortner, president of the Peninsula Association of Commerce presided. Entertainment was provided by the nationally-famous Circus Saints and Sinners of American Entertainment Troupe.

In the afternoon the General attended to routine office matters and then returned home for the balance of the day and evening. At 1730 hours General Irvine came in for cocktails, as well as Colonel and Mrs. Ed Howard, General and Mrs. Macon, Lt. Colonel and Mrs. Smith, and Major Jaccard.

FORT MONROE - 28 SEPTEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0835 hours and attended to routine office matters. At 1105 hours General Halsey, General Parker (DA Provost Marshal) came in for a courtesy call. At 1130 hours he saw General Macon on Army matters and then returned to quarters for lunch. FORT MONROE-WASHINGTON, DC - 29 SEP TEMBER 1949 - General Clark left his quarters 0715 hours and was airborne at 0730 enroute to Washington. He was accompanied by Major Jaccard; Lt Colonel Smith drove up the previous day. At 1000 hours General Clark attended a meeting of the Research and Developments Board in the Pentagon Building. Prior to that he had been briefed at 0900 by Colonel Klepinger, as well as General Beasley from Fort Monroe. General Clark left the meeting at 1400 hours and lunched with General Haislip and General Collins, C/S. Following lunch he talked on the telephone with General Matt Ridgway, personally to General Aaron Bradshaw, and then called General Irvine. He spent the evening with his mother.

WASHINGTON, DC - FORT MONROE - 30 SEP TEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at the Pentagon at 0900 hours when he looked at the film being made by the Signal Corps of the war activities of the General. At 1030 hours he conferred with various Army Sections in the building. He lunched with his mother and at 1600 hours he and his mother were picked up and taken to General Collins' quarters. He left General Collins' quarters at 1630 hours and participated in the final review for the retirement ceremony for General Devers. He was interviewed by Washington pressmen and pictures taken of him with his mother. Mrs. C. C. Clark returned home at 1730 hours and General Clark took off from National Airport at 1800 hours accompanied by General Beasley, General Zimmerman and Major Jaccard. He arrived at his quarters at 1915 hours and spent the evening with his family.

FORT MONROE - 1 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark played golf this morning with General Blesse and Colonel Gurney. Judge Michael A. The party returned to quarters about 1130 hours and had lunch with Judge Musmanno, Colonel and Mrs. Howard, Colonel and Mrs. Smith, Major Jaccard, and Miss Dorothy Davis, the latter having arrived this morning for duty. At 1400 hours, Colonel Abrams escorted Judge Musmanno on a tour of the Post and surrounding territory. Judge Musmanno left on the 1820 place for Pittsburgh. The Clarks then went to cocktails at the quarters of Lt. Colonel and Mrs. Sladen. They dined at home.

FORT MONROE - 3 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0800 hours and saw various staff officers and attended to correspondence. At 1000 hours he saw 1st Lt. Ralph D. Skidmore, whom he had as a pilot in Europe and who is seeking admission to the Regular Army. At 1130 hours the General addressed all officers at a meeting in the Post Theater. He returned to quarters for lunch and remained there until 1830 hours when he and Mrs. Clark and Ann received guests at an official reception and supper at the Officers Beach Club.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE-FORT BRAGG, N.C. - 4 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark, accompanied by Colonel Smith, departed his quarters at 0740 hours and was airborne from Langley Field at 0800 hours. He attended the Presidential Review for President Truman,

and then a luncheon held at the Officers Club for the President. Following this the entire party went out to observe the drop of a battalion of airborne troops. Upon completion of the drop and other demonstrations in the field, the group returned to Pope Field and departed immediately after the President took off, 1635 hours. The General landed at Langley Field and returned to his quarters for the evening.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 5 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark attended to office matters during the greater part of the day. At 1730 Mrs. Clark, the General and Ann attended the AT HOME of Admiral and Mrs. Davis at the Navy Base, Norfolk. Upon returning from Norfolk, Mrs. Clark was given a surprise party at her quarters in honor of her birthday. This occasion was attended by Colonel and Mrs. E. B. Howard, Lt. Colonel and Mrs. C. C. Smith and Major Jaccard.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE-NEW YORK - 6 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark, accompanied by Mrs. Clark, Ann and Major Jaccard. departed Fort Monroe at 0730 hours and arrived Washington, DC at 1115 hours. They then took the train for New York at 1515 hours. At the Astor Hotel they were met by Bill Clark and Robert Christenberry. General Clark and Mrs. Clark had dinner at the home of Mr. Herbert Hoover. Also in attendance that evening were Mr. and Mrs. Roy Howard.

\* \* \* \*

NEW YORK - 7 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark departed at 0915 hours for Headquarters First Army. He caught the 0945 hours ferry and on arrival was greeted by Lt. Gen. W. B. Smith and a 17-gun salute and Guard of Honor. General Clark and General Smith, along with the Deputy Commanding General, held a conference with other staff members. The General departed headquarters and went to the home of General Smith. He then departed First Army and then called on General Julius Ochs Adler and Mr. Sulzburger (re Road Back to Rome) of the New York Times. He then returned to the Astor Hotel and lunched with Clarence Budington Kelland. Later in the afternoon he called Brig General Charles Saltzman and Mr. Robert Raymond. The General had a cocktail party at 1730 hours in Suite 5024 attended by Mr. and Mrs. Robert Christenberry, Brig Genl and Mrs. Saltzman, President of the VFW Mr. Lewis, Public Relations Council of VFW, Admiral Lovett, retired, Mr. and Mrs. Robert Raymond, Brig General Ralph Tate, who dropped in. After dinner in the Colonial Room of the Astor Hotel, the General attended SOUTH PACIFIC.

\* \* \*

NEW YORK-FORT MONROE - 8 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark and party departed New York by train at 0930 hours. They arrived in Washington at 1315 hours. The General stopped to see his mother and then drove to Fort Monroe, listening enroute to the Army-Michigan football game. The party arrived Monroe at 1800 hours and remained at quarters throughout the evening.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 9 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark practiced golf this morning and remained at home throughout the day.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 10 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0815 hours, attended to various staff matters, and at 1030 hours received a courtesy call from Dr. Reid, located at Langley Field and connected with matters on the development of the Air Force. At 1100 hours Vice Admiral Hall, Commandant of the Armed Forces Staff

College at Norfolk, called to pay his respect. Prior to these calls the General had an orientation on the status of tactical air support. Lt. Colonel Jensen gave the presentation. That evening the General and Mrs. Clark received callers at home.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE-WASHINGTON - 11 October 1949 - General Clark and nine other members of his staff went to Langley Air Force Base for a presentation given by General Lee and his staff on the tactics and techniques of air support for the Field Forces. The presentation was held from 1000 to 1200, after which the group had lunch at the Officers Club and then returned to Fort Monroe. The General returned to his office in the afternoon and then took off by plane for Washington at 1830 hours, accompanied by Major Jaccard. He attended the dinner given by the Italian Ambassador honoring General Clark and Minister of Defense Randolfo Pacciardi. He returned by plane after the dinner and reached his quarters about midnight.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 12 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived early at his office. He received Masons from Newport News, who called to pay their respects. French General Paul Cherriere arrived by plane this morning and was received by a Guard of Honor and a 13-gum salute. After a brief conference at the Headquarters with General Clark, General Cherriere was taken out to the Officers Beach Club for a luncheon attended by officers in the Headquarters who had known Cherriere. Following the luncheon, General Cherriere and his party went to Langley Field and were flown back to Washington. In the evening the General attended the Junior Chamber of Commerce (Peninsula) dinner at the Hotel Chamberlin. There he gave a 30-minute talk.

\* \*

FORT MONROE - 13 OCTOBER 1949 - At 1030 this morning General Clark met the Italian Minister of Defense Randolfo Pacciardi and party at Langley Air Force Base. They then returned to Fort Monroe where a Guard of Honor was drawn up and a 19-gun salue was fired in honor of His Excellency. Upon the termination of the honor, the Minister, his wife and party were taken to General Clark's quarters for a brief time, after which the Minister and other men were brought to Headquarters and a presentation on the functions of the Army Field Forces was given by Colonel Costello in the Conference Room. At the termination of the conference, the entire party was taken to the Officers Beach Club where a large luncheon had been arranged. About 50 persons attended. At the end of the luncheon, the party and a few of the officers accompanied the Italian visitors to the pier where a Navy Barge carried them to the USS MIDWAY, anchored at Norfolk Navy Base. After honors had been rendered to the Minister, the party was aboard and shown about the carrier and then returned to Fort Monroe about 1530 hours. The entire party was escorted back to Langley Field where honors were again rendered upon their departure, both from Monroe and Langley. The plane took off at 1550 hours. Gem ral and Mrs. Clark that evening went to the Fashion Show given at the Officers Beach Club and sponsored by the Dramatic Club of the Women's Club. The General made a short address.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 14 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark spent the morning at his office and received Admiral Davis, Commandant of the 5th Naval District, who paid his respects. At 1000 hours, Mr. Straighter and three other Red Cross officials paid a courtesy call and discussed Red Cross problems with the General. General Clark rested in the afternoon and in the evening went to the home of General and Mrs. Bradford for cocktails.

FORT MONROE - 15 OCTOBER 1949 - General went on a fishing trip with Mr. Joe Adams and Mr. J. H. Borders, both of the Newport News Ship Building and Drydock Co. He returned around noon, rested in the afternoon, and in the evening met the F. McKenzie Davisons who had arrived in their yacht The Marymac and docked at Old Point. They had cocktails on board and dinner at the Chamberlin Hotel.

\* \* \* \* . \*

FORT MONROE - 16 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark played golf this day and in the evening General and Mrs. Clark were dinner guests of Colonel and Mrs. Fickett.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE-DETROIT, MICHIGAN - 17 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark attended to routine office matters in the morning and after lunch at his quarters took off from Langley Field at 1330 hours for Detroit, accompanied by General Beasley and eight other staff officers. The group arrived Detroit at 1630 hours where they were met by Mr. Andrew Kirkpatrick and other officials of the United Foundations Torch Drive. General Clark, along with General Beasley, Mr. Atanasoff and Colonel Smith, stayed at the Hotel Statler; and the balance of the group went to the Sheraton. That evening the entire group of officers was invited to an informal dinner given by Mr. Wilson, president of General Motors.

\* \* \* \*

DETROIT, MICHIGAN - 18 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark went to the Detroit Arsenal to hear the presentation being given in connection with the development of the Army Tank Program. He had to leave at 1100 hours in order to attend the luncheon being given at the Hotel Statler to open the Torch Drive. The General made a few remarks and then returned to his hotel. At 1430 hours he held a press conference which lasted until about 1515. At 1645 Mr. Kirkpatrick called for the General and took him to an informal buffet dinner at the Detroit Club. Host was Mr. John S. Coleman, president of the Foundation. At the completion of the dinner, General Clark was taken to the City Hall where he met city officials and officials connected with the Torch Drive. He then was escorted to the initial point of the parade and at 1900 hours drove up the line of march of the parade to the huge torch erected in front of the City Hall. At this point he inspected the National Guard unit and stood in the reviewing stand where he observed the parade marching past. At 1945 hours he delivered a 10-minute speech at the termination of which he pressed the button and lighted the torch, signifying the beginning of the Torch Drive. Soon thereafter he was driven to the Olympia - a large auditorium - where he again made an address to the assembled thousands of volunteer workers. He then returned to his hotel to retire.

\* \* \* \*

DETROIT-FORT MONROE - 19 OCTOBER 1949 - In the afternoon of the previous day, General Clark had received a call from Mr. Gordon Gray, Secretary of the Army, requesting the General to be present in Washington on Thursday and Friday this week to appear before the Congressional Armed Forces Committee. Therefore he cut short his plans and departed Municipal Airport at 0830 hours and landed at Langley Field about noon. He was accompanied by General Beasley, Mr. Atanasoff and Colonel Smith. During the afternoon the General worked in his office in an effort to get together data in connection with Armed Forces Headquarters' work on unification. He telephoned to General Bick in Washington requesting that Col. Francis H. Oxx fly from Denver to meet him in Washington the next morning.

FORT MONROE-WASHINGTON - 20 October 1949 - General Clark departed by plane for Washington at 0800 hours, arriving the Pentagon Bldg. at 0920. At 1000 hours he attended a conference in Mr. Stephen Early's office. The conference also was attended by General Eisenhower and Chief of Staff, General Collins. The General then had a short talk with Mr. Symington, Secretary of the Air. He then was advised that he would appear before Congress at 1400 hours this day. In the meantime, Colonel 0xx had reported in and together they worked on getting some data together for the 1400 hours meeting. The General lunched in his office; at 1400 hours went to appear before the House Armed Service Committee. He testified for one hour. Then he went to see his mother and arrived at the airport at 1620 hours and immediately took off for Fort Monroe, arriving about 1730. He remained at home that evening.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 21 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office and attended to routine office matters. He was briefed by Colonel Jensen for the Eglin Field, Florida indoctrination course. He then was briefed by Lt. Col. Ritchie on the National Guard convention in Montgomery, Alabama. He was briefed by General Halsey and Colonel Costello on the formation of the Joint Airport Board at Fort Benning. The General played golf in the afternoon and in the evening had a small cocktail party honoring Colonel Oxx, followed by a dinner at home.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 22 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark went fishing with Mr. Clark, Mr. Joe Adams and Mr. Borders. He returned about 1230 hours, rested in the afternoon, and went to cocktails at the quarters of Colonel and Mrs. Kingman. The family dined at home.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 23 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark had a golf game this morning and in the afternoon took care of some dictation. That evening the General and Mrs. Clark went to the Beach Club for dinner as guests of Lt. Colonel and Mrs. Walter.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 24 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark remained at home with a bad cold. He cancelled his trip to Eglin Field, Florida, and his speaking engagement before the National Guard Convention at Montgomery, Alabama.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 25-26 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark remained at home due to his cold, but did some dictating, etc. in his study at his quarters.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 27 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0830 hours. He attended to routine office matters and then at 1000 hours saw General Halsey on the Manpower Board Report. At 1030 hours he dictated letters. At 1105 General Evans of the Office of Reserve Affairs called from Washington, DC. At 1115 he again saw General Halsey concerning tanks. At 1120 he saw General Macon. The Generallunched at home and returned to the office at which time he saw Mr. Cullen, President of the West Point Alumni Association, NYC, who called to pay his respects. General Clark left the office at 1600 hours and remained at home that evening.

FORT MONROE - 28 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at the office at 0815 hours. At 0930 hours Mr. Joe Morris, representative of Harper and Brothers publishing company

book, memoirs of the war. At 0935 hours General Saville called from Washington regarding the Fort Leavenworth air transportation difficulties, and at 1100 hours General Clark called General Chamberlin, 5th Army CG, on the same subject. At 1105 hours the General took Mr. Morris to his quarters where they had lunch and continued discussion of the book. They returned to the office and at 1430 hours Mr. Morris took the plane for Little Rock, Arkansas. At 1400 hours General Clark saw General Holmer from Fort Bliss, Texas regarding his prospective trip to Fort Bliss. At 1430 hours Major General Mueller, Deputy CG of 3rd Division, called on General Clark to discuss his appointment as umpire for PORTREX operation of Mid-Atlantic States. After further discussions with General Halsey and General Mueller, the General departed for his quarters. In the evening he dined with his family, the Howards and Major Jaccard at Tony's Restaurant in Phoebus.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 29 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark played golf during the day and remained at home in the evening.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 30 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark played golf in the morning. At 1600 hours he attended a reception at Langley Air Force Base Officers Club honoring General and Mrs. Hale, the new Commanding General of the Air Base.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 31 OCTOBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0830 hours. At 0900 hours he saw General Halsey re Manpower Board, and again at 0930 re the Equipment Panel. At 1100 hours Brig Gen Shoe, CG, Armed Force Institute, Norfolk, Virginia, paid his respects. At 1145 hours a retirement ceremony was held for Colonel V. W. Batchelor, retiring head of G-2. General Clark had lunch at home and returning to the office saw Colonel Fickett at 1330 hours re post matters. At 1400 hours two representatives of Lockheed Aircraft Co. of Burbank, California called to pay their respects. The General attended to routine office matters and at 1600 hours saw General Halsey. He remained at home during the evening.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 1 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and immediately saw General Halsey. At 1000 hours Major General Willis Hale, new CG of 9th Air Force Base at Langley Field called to pay his respects. At 1030 Mr. Hunt of Norfolk Intelligence Division called re Colonel Ports, oh a routine checkup. General Clark attended to routine office matters in the afternoon and at 1800 hours went to the quarters of Colonel and Mrs. Porter for a cocktail supper.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 2 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 1000 saw General Halsey to receive a briefing on the Joint Board. In the afternoon he attended to routine office matters. At 2030 hours, accompanied by Mrs. Clark, Ann, Colonel and Mrs. D'Orsa and Major Jaccard, General Clark boarded the Pennsylvania Railroad Cape Charles Ferry, arrived Cape Charles at 2235 hours and boarded the train at 2335 for New York.

NEW YORK - 3 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark and party arrived New York at 0730 hours and the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel at 0800 where they had breakfast. The General then saw Mr. Herbert Hoover at 1000 hours, called Cass Canfield of Harper & Bros Company re his forthcoming book, called Mr. Robert Raymond reference investments, then talked with Brig Genl Charles Saltzman and then Lt. General W.B. Smith of First Army. He then took a walk and lunched at the hotel. Bill Clark arrived at 1600 hours from West Point. Later Mr. and Mrs. Robert Berenson and Lily Chiarini called on the general and had cocktails. At 1830 hours General Clark attended the cocktail and dinner honoring Mr. Irving Geist for his work as a philanthropist with disabled veterans. He was the guest of Judge Paul Rao. The General was introduced at the dinner and received a tremendous ovation. He was called upon to present a plaque honoring Mr. Geist.

\* \* \* \*

NEW YORK-WEST POINT - 4 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark departed New York for Ft. Totten, accompanied by Major General James Jaynes and Colonel D'Orsa. He returned to the hotel at noon and had a luncheon for Mrs. Jaccard with the family. Mrs. Jaccard had just arrived from a visit to France. General Clark and his party left for West Point at 1400 hours, by car, and on arrival attended a cocktail supper at the quarters of Major General Moore, the superintendent. They remained overnight as guests of the Moores.

\* \* \* \*

WEST POINT-NEW YORK - 5 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark spent the morning in and around West Point and in the afternoon saw the Army-Fordham football game. Following the game, the group had a drink at General Moore's quarters and then returned to New York, to the Hotel Astor, had a quick lunch and attended the musical comedy TOUCH AND GO. That evening they were dinner guests of Mr. Robert Christenberry.

\* \* \*

NEW YORK-PHILADELPHIA - 6 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark departed the Hotel Astor at 1100 for the Pennsylvania Railroad Station where he boarded Mr. Edwin Pauley's private to go to Philadelphia, accompanied by his family, the D'Orsas, and Glen Davis. They saw the professional football game between Los Angeles Rams and Philadelphia Eagles. They returned to New York at 1930, had supper at the Penn Station and at 2100 took the Cape Charles train enroute for Fort Monroe.

\* \*

FORT MONROE - 7 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived Cape Charles at 0600 hours. They left there at 0655 hours and arrived Old Point Comfort at 0840. General Clark arrived at the office at 0930 hours at which time he met Mr. Richardson, local Scottish Rite member. The rest of the morning he attended to routine office matters. At 1500 hours he met four Peruvian officers (Brig Gen. Morla, Dir. Military Training; Lt. Gen. Llona, Air Attache; Colonel Cossio, Army Attache; Commander Castro, Navy Attache). At 1600 hours he left his office at went to Hampton, returning home about 1700 hours. The family dined at home with the Smiths.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 8 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0900 hours and at 1000 Captain Longfellow, 60 of Naval Mine Depot called to pay his respects and waited until the arrival of Admiral Blandyat 1055 hours at Old Point Pier. An escort of 15 men awaited the Admiral and he was given a Guard of Honor and salute. After 20 minutes of discussion in the General's office, Admiral Blandy left by cruiser for Norfolk. In the afternoon the General at-

tended to routine office affairs. In the evening he went fishing with Colonel Cocke and Colonel Smith up at Yorktown Navl Mine depot, returning about 2330 hours. The group caught 21 rock trout.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 9 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0815 hours and at 0845 departed by Admiral Blandy's cabin cruiser, accompanied by General Macon and Navy Captain Reinken and Colonel Smith. They arrived Norfolk Navy Base at 0910 where a 17-gum salute was fired in General Clark's honor. Upon landing the General and party were driven to the Armed Force Staff College where the General returned the call to Vice Admiral Hall, commandant of the school. From there, General Clark went to the Naval Air Station to attend the briefing conducted by Admiral Stump on the subject of Naval Close Air Support. General Clark left the station at 1045 and arrived at Admiral Blandy's headquarters at 1100. There a Marine Guard of Honor and band were drawn up. After inspecting the Guard, General Clark conferred with Admiral Blandy for some 30 minutes. He then returned to Fort Monroe via the same cruiser. In the evening General and Mrs. Clark hosted at a formal dinner.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 10 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0820 hours and attended to routine office matters. He then was briefed by Colonel McCroskey on matters to be taken up at Fort Bliss. The General also was briefed by General Halsey on guided missiles. At 1100 the General met members of the State Jewish Welfare Board, with Headquarters in Newport News. (Messrs. Zwerdling, Beskin, Olshanky, and Rabbi Finkle). In the afternoon he inspected Building 163 and then departed for Langley Air Force Base. Here he returned the call of Major General Willis Hale. The General returned to his office for a short time and returned home to spend the rest of the evening.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 11 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark played golf in the morning. In the afternoon he took a drive. In the evening General and Mrs. Clark went to the Howards' for a drink and then to Tony's in Phoebus for dinner. Later gin rumny was played at the Howards'.

FORT MONROE - 12 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark had a conference this morning with General Bradford. He listened in the afternoon to the Penn-Army football game. He talked with Mr. Pitt, Trenton, New Jersey, re the case of Captain Walter L. Temple, a reserve officer being released from the Army. General Clark remained at home in the evening.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE-ALBUQUERQUE, NM - 13 NOVEMBER 1949- General Clark departed Langley Air Field at 0800 accompanied by General Bradford, Colonel Howard and Lt. Col. Smith. They stopped for gas at Memphis, Tenn. for 20 minutes and arrived Kirtland Air Force Base, Albuquerque, NM at 1800 hours. The entire party went to the Hilton Hotel.

ALBUQUERQUE, NM - 14 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark, General Bradford and Colonel Howard attended the special orientation course for staff officers on atomic warfare at Sandia Base. Among other members attending the course, were, Generals W. Bedell Smith, Lutes and Gillem. That evening the entire group attended a dinner given by the Albuquerque Chamber of Commerce honoring General Clark.

ALBUQUERQUE, NM - 15 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark attended the course during the entire day and went to cocktails and supper at the quarters of General Montague that evening.

\* \* \*

ALBUQUERQUE - ELPASO, TEXAS - 16 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark went to Los Alamos by plane from Albuquerque and returned about 1100 hours. After a quick lunch with General Montague at the Officers Club, General Clark's group departed from Kirtland Air Force Base about 1230 hours and arrived Biggs Air Force Base adjoining El Paso, Texas at 1415 hours. He was met by General Homer and was given a quick tour of Fort Bliss. Following this he addressed the officers of the Post and the Artillery School at the Post Theater. In the evening General Clark and party attended the El Paso Chamber of Commerce dinner in General Clark and party attended the El Paso Chamber of Commerce dinner in General Clark was presented with a ten-gallon hat, a western hand-tooled leather belt, and a book THE BRAVE BULLS. The General was principal speaker and made a 20-minute speech.

\* \* \* \*

EL PASO, TEXAS-WHITE SANDS-FORT BLISS - 17 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark's party left Fort Bliss with General Homer at 0700 hours for White Sands Proving Ground 50 miles to the north. Although the scheduled guided missile shoot had to be postponed, General Blackmore's staff gave an orientation and demonstration of guided missiles. Following this, the party proceeded to the anti-aircraft range, arriving about 1100 hours where the party witnessed firing with 40mm and 90mm weapons. The artillery class from Fort Sill witnessed the firing and demonstration at the same time. At the end of the demonstrations, about 1230 hours, the General's party returned to Fort Bliss for a special luncheon given at the Officers Club by General Homer. Following the luncheon, General Clark was taken to the Fort Bliss replica where prepared talks were given to the General, explaining the purpose, functions, and methods of instruction at the Artillery School. Brigadier General Charles E. Hart was in charge of this phase. Following this, General Clark and party went to the AFF Board No. 4, under supervision of Colonel C. E. Shepherd, Assistant President, where 1 1/2-hour explanation and demonstration of the functions of the Board were given. General Clark then returned to General Homer's quarters and prepared for the formal dinner and reception at the Officers Club at 1930. General and Mrs. Homer were hosts, to which were invited about 80 prominent local civilian leaders and higher ranking military personnel. The reception began at 2100 hours and the General departed with his party about 2215 hours directly for Biggs Air Force Base where the group enplaned and took off at 2230 hours for Fort Monroe

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE- 18 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark and party arrived at Langley Field at 0930 hours, having landed for gas at Memphis, Tenn. The General arrived later in the morning at the office to attend to routine matters and confer with staff officers. The evening was spent at home.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 19 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark spent the day at home and in the evening he and Mrs. Clark were guests of Colonel and Mrs. O. S. Rolfe at the Monte Carlo evening at the club. This day General and Mrs. Joseph P. Sullivan arrived for duty at Fort Monroe.

FORT MONROE - 20 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark had a slight cold this day and remained at home.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 21 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0830 hours and attended to routine office matters. In the afternoon Lt. Gen. Ennis C. Whitehead, CO of Continental Air Command, Mitchel Field, NY arrived. He was given a guard of honor, after which the party was brought to headquarters where a one-hour briefing was given them on the requirements of the Army Field Forces for air support and transportation during the coming year. In the evening, General and Mrs. Clark entertained at home in honor of Major General and Mrs. W. H. Hale.

\* \* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 22 MOVEMBER 1949 - General Chark arrived at his office at 0845 hours and attended to routine business matters. He attended a briefing held at 1000 hours on training charts and development charts, given by Generals Halsey and Beasley respectively. The General remained at home this evening.

\* \*

FORT MONROE - 23 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark arrived at his office at 0850 hours and at 0900 General Beasley gave a briefing on the research and development program. At 1000 General Halsey briefed the General for the Army Commanders meeting which is to take place next week. At 1800 hours General and Mrs. Clark went to cocktails at Lt. Colonel and Mrs. Sigerfoos. At 1900 hours the Clarks and the Howards and Smiths went to Major and Mrs. Jaccard's for dinner and cards.

\* \* \*

FORT MONROE - 24 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark inspected all the enlisted messes from 1130 to 1215 hours, accompanied by all the general officers of the post as well as the section heads. At 1300 hours General and Mrs. Clark had Thanksgiving dinner with the 503 MP Company, Captain and Mrs. Bass acting as hosts.

\* \*

FORT MONROE-WASHINGTON, DC - 25 NOVEMBER 1949 - After a brief time in the office, General Clark departed for Washington by car with his family. They left about noon. Arrived at Mrs. C. C. Clark's about 1600 hours.

\* \*

WASHINGTON, DC - 26 NOVEMBER 1949 - General and Mrs. Clark and Ann departed in the Chief of Staff, private train car for the Army-Navy game in Philadelphia. The car left 0840 and arrived at the stadium about 1130. The group returned to Washington by the same manner after the game. In the earling evening the Irving Lemauxs, Jaccards and C C Smiths were invited to Mrs. C. C. Clark's apartment for cocktails. The General spent the evening at his mother's.

WASHINGTON, DC - 27 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark spent the entire day with his mother.

\* \* \* \*

WASHINGTON, DC - 28 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark attended the Army Commanders conference from 0830 hours until 1300 hours. Other members of the General's staff attending were Generals Halsey and Beasley and Colonel Prather. After a late

luncheon General Clark returned to his mother's. In the evening, General and Mrs. Clark attended a dinner given by General and Mrs. Collins at their quarters at Ft. McNair for the Army Commanders.

\* \* \* \*

WASHINGTON, DC - 29 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark and his staff attended a second session of the Army Commanders conference from 0830 to 1300. After lunch, General Clark and the Army Commanders attended a special conference with the Chief of Staff. He returned to his mother's about 1700 hours.

\* \* \*

WASHINGTON, DC - 30 NOVEMBER 1949 - General Clark was briefed by General Beasley at 0830 hours for the Research and Development Board meeting which he attended at 1000 until about 1300. General Clark left the Pentagon Bldg. about 1630 hours for his mother's home. Mrs. Clark left this day to return to Fort Monroe.

\* \* \*

WASHINGTON, DC - 1 DECEMBER 1949 - General Clark attended the first day session of the Selection Board for General Officers of the Army. This meeting lasted throughout the day until 1745 hours. He had dinner at home with his mother.

\* \* \*

WASHINGTON-FORT MONROE - 2 DECEMBER 1949 - General Clark spent all day with the General Officers Selection Board, as well as having a conference at 1100 hours with the Chief of Staff. That evening the Clarks attended a New Year's Even party at the Casemate Club, where they were the hosts.
