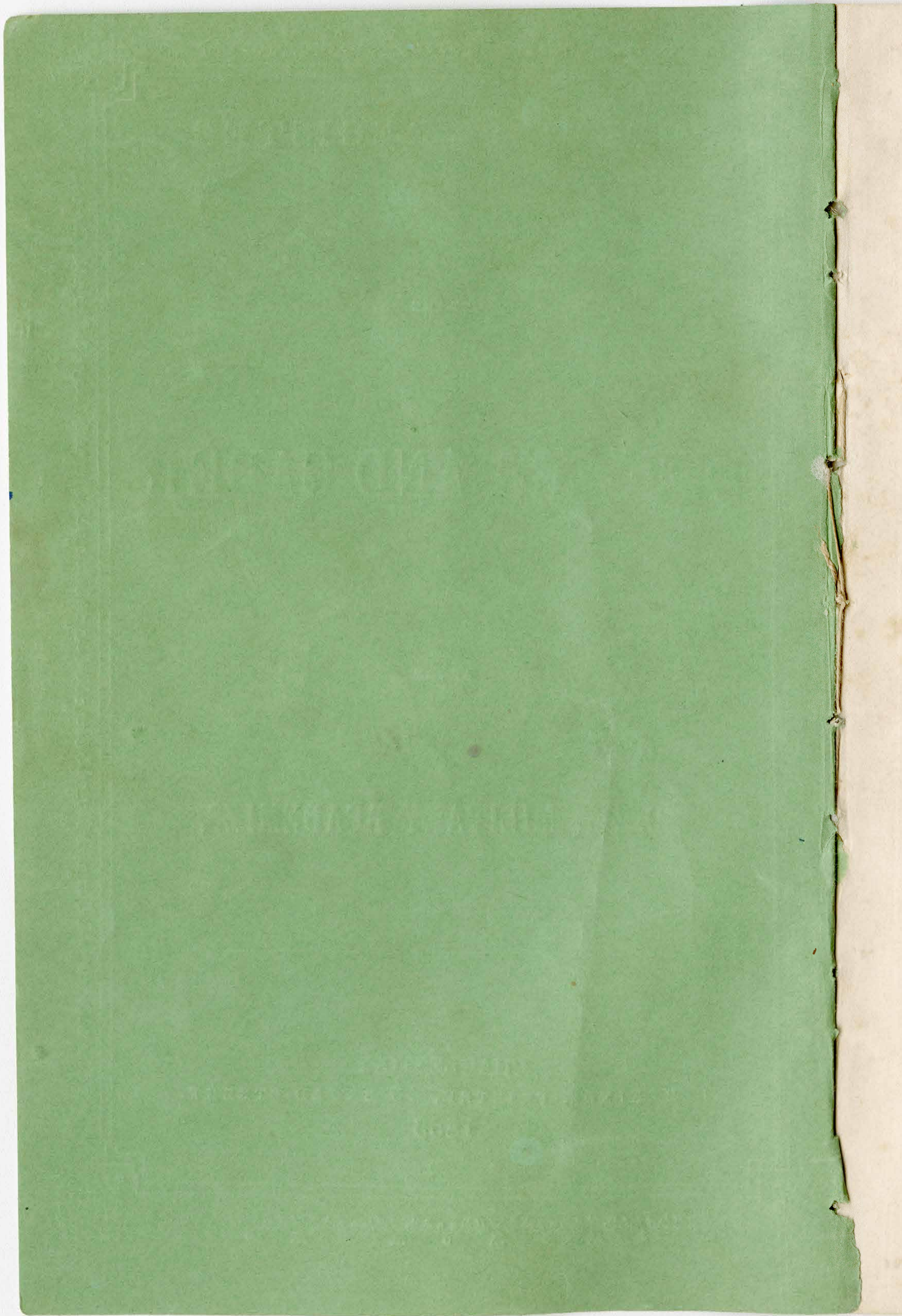

## R E M A R K S .

---

Two Arsenals, containing the arms and munitions of war of the State of South Carolina, the one located in Charleston and the other in Columbia, were formerly guarded by two companies of enlisted soldiers, at an annual expense of \$24,000. By an act of the General Assembly, of 1842, this appropriation was transferred, to the support of two *Military Schools*, which were fully organized in 1843, upon the basis of the Regulations of the U S. Military Academy of West Point and the officers and Cadets required perform the duties of a guard, for the Arsenals.

The "Arsenals Academy," in Columbia, is auxiliary to the "Citadel Academy," in Charleston. All Cadets of the former, who, from their standing and conduct, deserve to be continued at the Institution, are transferred after one year to the Citadel Academy at Charleston.

One half the number of Cadets appointed to these Academies are Beneficiaries of the State, and have all their expenses met from the annual appropriation. In making selections from candidates for beneficiary appointments, preference is given to those who are recommended by the commissioners of Free Schools, but no applicant will be admitted who does not submit testimonials of fair moral character, or who is less than fifteen or more than nineteen years of age, or who is below five feet in height, or afflicted with any disease, or infirmity which would render him unfit for Military Services, or who may bring with him at the time of presenting himself any disorder of an infectious or immoral character.

Fifty Dollars a quarter is required in advance from Pay Cadets, and is in full of every charge, *clothing included*.

All applications for admission should be made to the Chairman of the Board of Visitors, prior to their Annual Meeting in Columbia, on Friday, after the fourth Monday in November.

## EXPLANATION OF CONDUCT ROLL.

All offences against Orders or Regulations are recorded.

These offences are divided into seven grades; each of which comprises offences of nearly the same degree of criminality.

The degree of criminality of offences of each grade is expressed by a number as follows.

Example. Absent from *Reveille* Roll call, gives 3 demerit.

For each year (after the first year) that a Cadet has been a member of the Academy, his offences are made to count more, by adding to the number expressing the degree of Criminality of each offence, one-sixth for the second year--one-third for the third year, and one half for the fourth year

At the end of the Academic year, these numbers are added up and the sum thus obtained, is that found in the column of "Demerit," (See the next Page.)

The demerit for the Graduating Class is estimated for their whole sum. When a Cadet has more than 200 demerit in any one year he is dismissed.

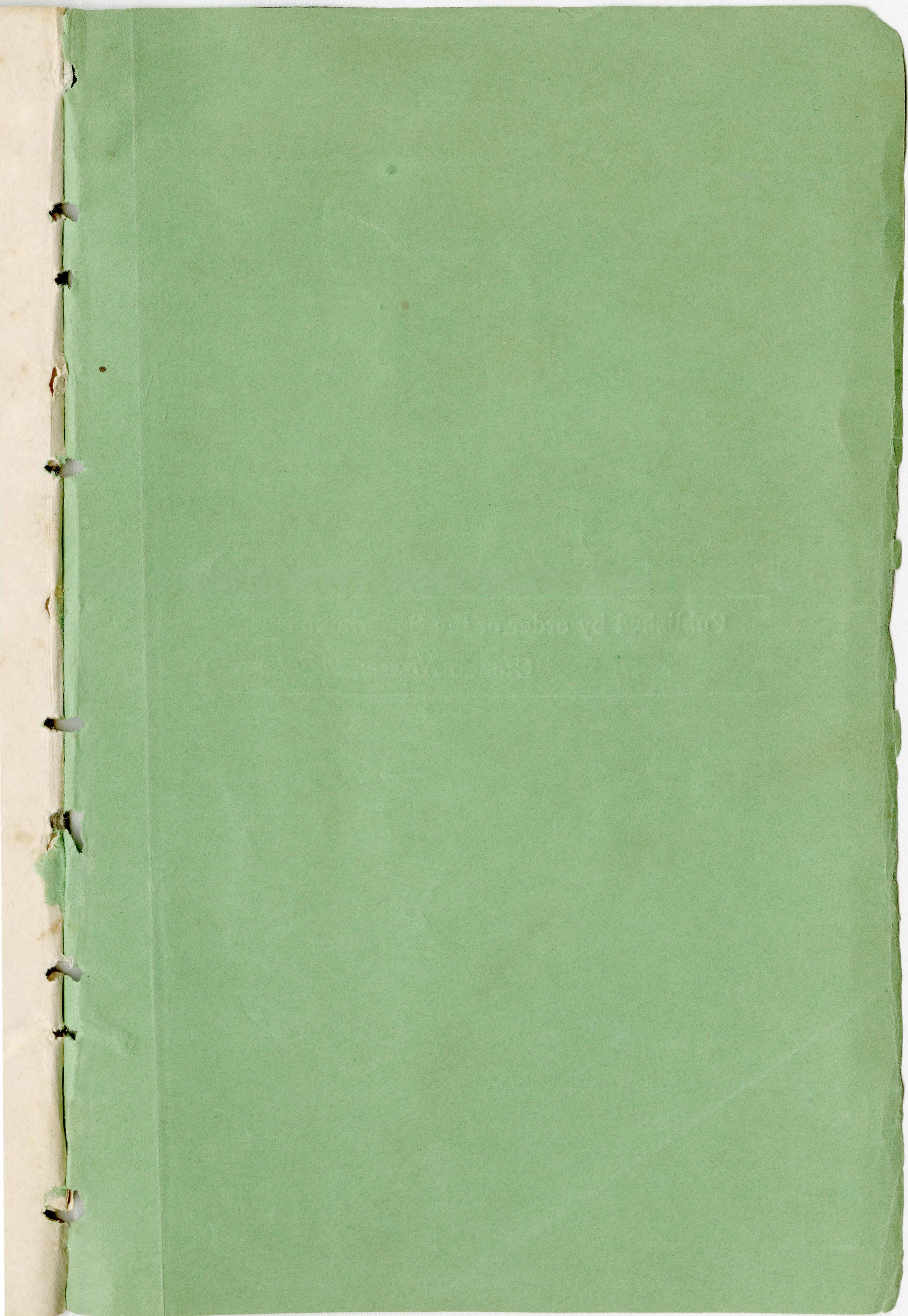
