I am enclosing a very rough sketch indicating what my idea would be as to the necessary buildings for the new Citadel. Of course, I do not propose the sketch as a plan to be adopted because I could suggest myself a great many changes which I think would improve it, but only as an idea of a general layout so as to give the architect a suggestion on which to work. There are numberless details about each one of the buildings specified which would have to be gone into with the architects in making the final plans. The first thing, of course, would be to have a map of the grounds and then the distribution and layout of the buildings could be adapted to the ground which we would occupy.
