can go to the 9th Corps at  
St. Phil. The 5th Corps. Hqn.  
and troops will start to the

states early in March. I hope  
that when the troops have  
finished, you and mother  
will be allowed to come  
over for a visit.

taken at the 8th Corps. I sent

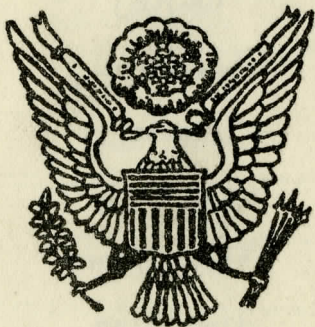
