ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

24 Albert is an excellent example of the gable-roofed 2 1/2 story Queen Anne built throughout the Highlands in the 1890s. A turned spindle porch is characteristic.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

24 Albert was the first house built on Albert Street, which was platted in the early 1890s primarily by Caleb Smith. At the time of its construction, there were few houses south of Forrest Street.
