



Although the Clark Street cemetery is in ruin, several good stones survive. Dating from ca. 1780, slate stones have skull or tree symbols. One \*double stone is decorated with skulls.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (discuss religious affiliations, major period of use, importance within town).

Near the Tewksbury line, and surrounded by ca. 1960-1970 development, the small Clark Street cemetery was used between ca. 1650 and 1850.

The earliest burial is reported to be 1650, the oldest stone visible is 1708.
