ADDITIONAL DESCRIPTION

This particular form of three-story multiple family dwelling with symmetrical bay windows on the facade linked by recessed porches appears frequently in the Acre. Dating, like most, from the early twentieth century, this building has the typical decorative feature of a broad cornice with elaborate brackets and pendant drops over the outermost corners of the bay windows. The small yard has been covered with asphalt.

ADDITIONAL HISTORICAL INFORMATION

The first building was constructed on this site in approximately 1860. A small building was built at the rear of the lot about 1890. J. J. Higgins owned the property at that time.

The building at the front of the lot was replaced by the current building in approximately 1910. In 1924 the property was owned by W. and M. Cassis. The building at the rear of the lot was torn down after 1936, perhaps in the 1940s.
