ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

This modest Queen Anne has details that are reminiscent of many of Frederick Stickney's buildings: Butler School, Old Ladies' Home. Sunray brackets ornament a porch with turned posts and support large gabled roof dormers.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

The southern section of Woburn Street developed slowly after the street and half a dozen subdivisions were laid out in the 1880's. The area remained part of Tewksbury until 1906 when it was part of a large annexed territory. This house was one of the first built in the area.
