This modest Queen Anne has details that are reminiscent of many of Frederick Stickney's buildings: Butler School, Old Ladies'. Home. Sunray brackets ornament a porch with turned posts and support large gabled roof dormers.

The southern section of Woburn Street developed slowly after the street and half a dozen subdivisions were laid out in the 1880's. The area remained part of Tewksbury until 1906 when it was part of a large annexed territory. This house was one of the first built in the area.
