ARCHITECTURAL SIGNIFICANCE (describe important architectural features and evaluate in terms of other buildings within community)

Houses built by Lowell's major corporations for their agents were spacious, elegant and located in the finest neighborhoods. #305 Andover is no exception. A two story pedimented portico with composite capital columns dominates the facade. An inner portico projects from the fanlit entrance.

Well set back from the street on a rise overlooking the river, the house is an imposing addition to the neighborhood.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

After a fire destroyed 285 Andover Street which had served as the Merrimack Manufacturing Company agent's residence since the 1870's, the corporation erected two houses on the property. This is the later of the two and was used through the 1930's by the company.

Its first occupant was John Pead, agent from 1896-1904.
