### ADDITIONAL DESCRIPTION

This is a well-kept early twentieth century residential vernacular structure.

## ADDITIONAL HISTORICAL INFORMATION

Between 1845 and 1850 William Fiske, a lumber dealer and box maker, constructed a double house on this site. Before 1896, additions had extended the building back to LaGrange Court which forms the rear boundary line of the lot. A. C. Wheelock who owned several other properties in the Acre at the time owned this building for ten years or more at the turn of the century (1896-1906).

In the late 1920s, the current building replaced the predecessor on the site. At that time a separate small building facing LaGrange Court was apparently also constructed. That building was torn down in the 1970s.
