ADDITIONAL DESCRIPTION

ADDRESS Two Warnesit Court

Two Wamesit Court is part of a group of small frame vernacular houses which date ca. 1830 but were moved to their present site about 1860. Until late 1992, when #7 was demolished, there were six of these 1 1/2 story houses, arranged in two groups of three attached units facing each other across a central alley. Two Wamesit Court, which connects to #4 and #8, is a single family residence. The house is now five rather than six bays across because two of the 1/1 sash have been replaced by a single large window unit. The main entrance is at the fourth bay and secondary entrances are located in a side ell and a small shed ell at the end. Vinyl siding covers the original clapboards.
