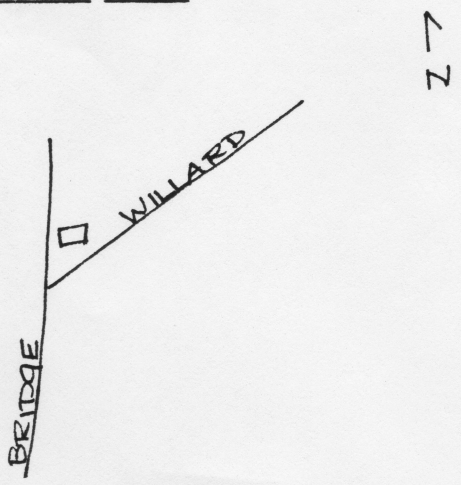

A rambling house with jerkin head dormers and gables, also used on the attached barn. Iron cresting tops the 2 story tripartite bay windows.

HISTORICAL SIGNIFICANCE (explain the role owners played in local or state history and how the building relates to the development of the community)

Despite its setting on the outskirts of the city, this house never had much land associated with it. Joseph Holtham, who is listed in the directories variously as a butcher and salesman, lived in the latter part of the 19th c. Alice Holtham, presumably his daughter, was a teacher at the Tenth St. School.
