## POST-ELECTION POLL RELEASED BY TSONGAS

A post-election poll done for U.S. Senator-elect Paul Tsongas released today shows that 81% of the electorate cast ballots for the candidate of their choice in the Senate election; 15% said they voted against a candidate's opponent.

The poll of 532 registered voters was conducted November 13-16 by Tsongas' chief legislative assistant and campaign pollster, Richard Arenberg. It is the 28th poll he has done for Tsongas during the four years he has worked for the Congressman.

In a poll question which tested a voter's strength of support for his choice in the Senate race, 46% said they supported their choice very strongly; 36% said fairly strongly and 15% said not very strongly at all.

When asked what served as a voter's primary source of information used to make the ballot choice 31% of those polled said newspaper articles, 18% said television news, 14% said televised debates, 7% said television ads, 3% said newspaper ads, 3% said radio news, 2% said leaflets and other campaign literature and 22% said other sources.

Questions asked to elicit information about the demographics of the vote produced the following information:
