## TALKING POINTS:

- The total growth of women in public office in Massachusetts has been consistent with the United States (8\%).
- From 1975 to 1980, the increase of Massachusetts women officeholders in county office has increased seven times while the national percentage has only doubled. (OR the percentage of women holding county office in Massachusetts in 1981 is greater than 3 times the national percentage).
- The percentage of women holding congressional office in Massachusetts has declined by $7 \%$, but still remains above the national percentage.
