In Massachusetts and the Nation

- He wrote the High Technology Morrill Act to improve science and math education.
- He was an original cosponsor of the Export Trading Company Law which now enables U.S. firms to sell more products abroad and creates new jobs here at home.
- He was one of the six original cosponsors of the Nuclear Freeze Resolution.
- He reintroduced the Equal Rights Amendment.
- He authored the Solar and Conservation Bank which will provide \$1.84 million to Massachusetts residents this fall.
- He wrote the new GI bill to provide educational assistance to veterans.

In Our Communities

Paul Tsongas and his special Economic Development Staff work with communities, local officials and businesses throughout Massachusetts to create new investment opportunities and jobs. Major accomplishments in which they played a key role include:

- creation of 1,670 new jobs in Quincy through federal assistance to three new office developments
- revitalization of downtown Malden with 1,400 new jobs committed
- model classroom computer education program in Cambridge
- preservation of the Urban Development Action Grant program that has created 25,000 new jobs throughout Massachusetts, generating over \$1.2 billion in private investment.

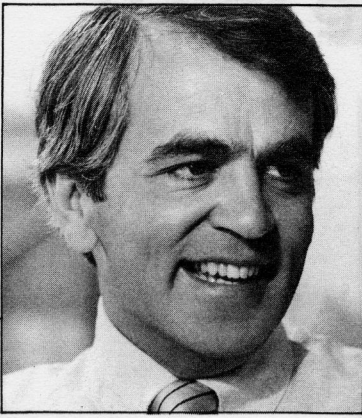

What are we doing for the next generation? That is a question I keep asking myself as I work in the Senate. It is a question I have to ask to see beyond the political pressures of the moment and judge the lasting impact of what we do.

Are we making the world a better one for our children? This concern, more than any, guides me in the areas in which I have worked the hardest:

Nuclear Arms Control: I was proud to sponsor the Kennedy-Hatfield Nuclear Freeze Resolution and I have continued to press for mutual arms reductions. What can be more crucial to the world our children will face?

Economic Development: I have long promoted cooperation between government and business to revitalize our basic industries and to build the new and growing high-technology industries that will keep our children employed in Massachusetts into the next century.

Education: I am working with school systems, local governments, parents, teachers, and businesses across the state to improve our schools, teach our children skills they'll need for tomorrow's jobs, and to provide financial support to pursue higher education.

Environment: I have fought for a clean environment for this and future generations -- helping lead the fight to control acid rain, pushing to protect the Georges Bank fisheries, funds to clean up our hazardous waste dumping sites.
