Mr. Tsongas introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on _____

A BILL

To amend the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973 to establish a Commission on National Service.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That
- 3 this Act may be cited as the "Presidential Commission on
- 4 National Service Act'.
- 5 Sec. 2. The Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973 is
- 6 amended by adding at the end thereof the following new title:
- 7 'TITLE VII--COMMISSION ON NATIONAL SERVICE
- 8 'FINDINGS AND PURPOSE
- 9 'Sec. 701. (a) The Congress finds that--
- 10 '(1) young people have demonstrated, through various
- public and private programs, that they can be effective
- in providing services to society;
- 13 ''(2) existing opportunities for full-time volunteer
- 14 service are available only to a small percentage of
- 15 American young people;
- 16 ''(3) there are many important, yet unmet, social
- 17 needs that could be met through the services volunteered
- 18 by young people;
- 19 '(4) youth unemployment rates are consistently high;
- 20 ''(5) there is a need for opportunities for young
- 21 people from all segments of society to provide service

and to be productive members of our society; and 1 2 ''(6) serious questions are being raised about the 3 ability of a peacetime all-volunteer Armed Forces to enlist the men and women necessary to meet the Nation's 5 military needs. 6 '(b) It is the purpose of this title to establish a 7 Presidentially appointed Commission to study the feasibility of organizing a large-scale system for national service, 8 9 where participants would serve for one year or more, and which would have both non-military as well as military 10 options available to all young people. 11 ' ESTABLISHMENT OF COMMISSION 12 13 "Sec. 702. (a) The President shall appoint a Commission on National Service which shall be composed of twenty-five 14 members as follows: 15 16 ''(1) one Member of the House of Representatives; 17 ''(2) one Member of the Senate upon the joint 18 recommendation of the majority and minority leaders; 19 ''(3) two military leaders; ''(4) four individuals from the various Federal, 20 State, and local voluntary agencies; 21 ``(5) two individuals representing the elderly 2.2 23 community; 24 ''(6) four individuals representing the various 25 private voluntary organizations; ``(7) two individuals representing the academic 26 27 community; 28 ''(8) one individual representing organized labor; 29 "(9) one individual representing the business 30 community; and ''(10) seven individuals representing a cross-section 31 of American youth. 32 33 Of the seven individuals appointed under paragraph (10), 34 three shall be high school students, two shall be college

- 1 students, and two shall be of high school or college age who
- 2 are not full-time students.
- 3 ''(b) The President shall make efforts to select
- 4 minorities and women to serve on the Commission.
- 5 ''(c) Thirteen members of the Commission shall constitute
- 6 a quorum for the transaction of its business.
- 7 ''(d) The President shall appoint a Chairperson from
- 8 among the members of the Commission.
- 9 ''(e) The members of the Commission shall be appointed
- 10 not later than 60 days after the enactment of this title.
- 11 ''(f) Any vacancy in the Commission shall not affect its
- 12 powers and shall be filled in the same manner in which the
- 13 original appointment was made.
- 14 ''(g) Each member of the Commission who is not otherwise
- 15 employed by the United States Government shall receive
- 16 compensation at a daily rate equal to the daily rate
- 17 prescribed for GS-15 under the General Schedule contained in
- 18 section 5332 of title 5, United States Code, including
- 19 traveltime, for each day he or she is engaged in the actual
- 20 performance of his or her duties as a member of the
- 21 Commission. A member of the Commission who is an officer or
- 22 employee of the United States Government shall serve without
- 23 additional compensation. All members of the Commission shall
- 24 be reimbursed for travel, subsistence, and other necessary
- 25 expenses incurred by them in the performance of their duties
- 26 to the same extent that employees serving intermittently in
- 27 Government service are allowed such expenses under section
- 28 5703 of title 5, United States Code.
- 29 DUTIES
- 30 'Sec. 703. (a) It shall be the duty of the Commission to
- 31 examine several questions surrounding the issue of national
- 32 service, including but not limited to the following:
- "(1) whether a year cr more of service by recent
- 34 high school graduates would help meet the non-military

2	''(2) what type of services would be most beneficial;
3	''(3) whether and how a system of national service
4	cculd assist the Armed Forces by enlisting the men and
5	women necessary to meet the Nation's military need;
6	''(4) how a system of national service could train
7	volunteers and increase their job opportunities after
8	service or could otherwise contribute to their education
9	and development;
1Ø	''(5) what the costs and benefits of a national
11	service system would be, including ways in which it would
12	reduce the cost of existing programs;
13	''(6) whether national service should be compulsory
14	or voluntary;
15	''(7) what the pay scale for participants should be;
16	''(8) what incentives could be used to attract both
17	minority and disadvantaged youth;
18	''(9) whether national service should be restricted
19	to include only young people;
20	"(10) what should the duration of service be; and
21	''(11) whether and how the country as a whole and the
22	participants themselves would benefit from a system of
2-3	national service.
24	''(b) The Commission shall hold regional conferences
25	throughout the United States and actively seek out the
26	opinions of young people on the subject of national service
27	and the questions as stated above in subsection (a).
28	''(c) The Commission shall actively encourage a national
29	debate on national service concerning the questions in
30	subsection (a).
31	"POWERS OF THE COMMISSION
32	"Sec. 704. (a) The Commission, or on the authorization
33	of the Commission, any subcommittee or member thereof, may,
3/1	for the nurnose of carrying out the provisions of this title.

- 1 hold such hearings and sit and act at such times and places,
- 2 and request the attendance and testimony of such witnesses
- 3 and the production of such books, records, correspondence,
- 4 memoranda, papers, and documents as the Commission or such
- 5 subcommittee or member may deem advisable.
- 6 ''(b) The Commission may acquire directly from the head
- 7 of any department, agency, independent instrumentality, or
- 8 other authority of the executive branch of the Government,
- 9 available information which the Commission considers useful
- 10 in the discharge of its duties. All departments, agencies,
- 11 and independent instrumentalities, or other authorities of
- 12 the executive branch of the Government shall cooperate with
- 13 the Commission and furnish all information requested by the
- 14 Commission to the extent permitted by law.
- 15 "ADMINISTRATIVE PROVISIONS
- 16 'Sec. 705. The Commission is authorized to--
- 17 ''(1) appoint and fix the compensation of such
- 18 personnel as may be necessary, without regard to the
- 19 provisions of title 5, United States Code, governing
- 20 appointments in the competitive service, and without
- 21 regard to the provisions of chapter 51 and subchapter III
- of chapter 53 of such title relating to classification
- 23 and General Schedule pay rates;
- 24 ''(2) obtain the services of experts and consultants
- in accordance with the provisions of section 3109 of
- title 5, United States Code, at a rate of pay not to
- exceed the rate of basic pay in effect from time to time
- for grade GS-15 of the General Schedule under section
- 29 5332 of title 5, United States Code;
- 30 ''(3) accept and utilize the services of voluntary
- 31 and noncompensated personnel and reimburses them for
- 32 travel expenses, including per diem, or authorized by
- 33 section 5703 of title 5, United States Code;
- 34 ''(4) receive money and other property donated,

- 1 bequeathed or devised, without condition or restriction
- 2 other than that it will be used for the purposes of the
- 3 Commission, and to use, sell, and otherwise dispose of
- 4 such property for the purpose of carrying out the
- functions of the Commission under this title;
- 6 ''(5) enter into agreements with the General Services
- 7 Administration for procurement of necessary financial and
- 8 administrative services, for which payment shall be made
- by reimbursement from funds of the Commission in such
- 10 amounts as may be agreed upon by the Chairman and the
- 11 Administrator of General Services;
- 12 ''(6) procure supplies, services, and property, and
- make contracts, without regard to the laws and procedures
- 14 applicable to Federal agencies; and
- 15 ''(7) enter into contracts with Federal or State
- 16 agencies, private firms, institutions, and agencies for
- 17 the conduct of research or surveys, the preparation of
- 18 reports, and other activities necessary to the discharge
- 19 of its duties.
- 20 'REPORT AND TERMINATION
- 21 'Sec. 706. (a) The Commission shall, within twelve
- 22 months from the date of enactment of this title, transmit a
- 23 final report to the President and the Congress concerning its
- 24 actions and its findings and recommendations.
- 25 ''(b) The Commission shall cease to exist on the date two
- 26 months from the date it transmits the final report unless
- 27 extended by a subsequent Act of Congress.
- 28 'AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS
- 'Sec. 707. There are authorized to be appropriated such
- 30 sums as may be necessary to carry out the provisions of this
- 31 title.".
