Q: S. 49 converts the entire park to preserve, and the administration changes 120,000 acres of park to preserve in order to provide "quality goat hunting."

How much of the park's goat habitat would be made preserve under your proposal? Under S. 49? How much goat habitat in is Native ownership?

- A: According to research done by the Alaska Coalition, using ADF&G data, the administration would remove 42% of the goat habitat; S. 49 100%
- Q: Where are protected populations of mountain goats found elsewhere in the new national parks in Alaska?
- A: Wrangell-St. Elias souther portion; Glacier Bay addition
- Q: What is the effect of your and S.49's proposal on these other goat areas?
- A: In the Wrangells, S.49 takes 43% of the goat habitat out of the park. The administration deletes 54%.

In the Glacier Bay addition, S. 49 drops 60% out of the park; the administration 100%
