To authorize appropriations for fiscal year 1980, for procurement of aircraft, missiles, naval vessels, tracked combat vehicles, torpedoes, and other weapons, and research, development, test, and evaluation for the Armed Forces, and to prescribe the authorized personnel strength for each active duty component and of the Selected Reserve of each Reserve component of the Armed Forces and of civilian personnel of the Department of Defense, and to authorize the military training student loads, and for other purposes.

ECONOMIC SANCTIONS AGAINST ZIMBABWE-RHODESIA

Sec. 802. It is the sense of Congress that the President shall remove economic sanctions against Zimbabwe-Rhodesia when he determines, after consultation with Great Britain and other interested states, after periodic monitoring of events in Zimbabwe-Rhodesia to determine whether there is a broadening of political participation and movement toward genuine majority rule, and after consultation with Congress, that the removal of such sanctions is in the national interest of the United States.
