

CETA TITLE VI DISCRETIONARY  
FUND ALLOCATION

Attached is the allocation of \$69 million in public service employment funds to State and local governments. These funds represent the balance of the CETA Title VI appropriation and are being allocated by the Secretary to prime sponsor areas which experienced significant increases in unemployment subsequent to November, with performance incentives going to those prime sponsor areas which demonstrated the capability to utilize the regular Title VI funds effectively and quickly.

Allocations were calculated according to the unemployment situations in program agent and balance of prime sponsor areas. Only those areas which had a December unemployment rate of 4.5 percent and also experienced an increase of at least .6 percent in their unemployment rate when compared to their average for the three month period of September through November were eligible for this additional funding.

Approximately 90 percent of the total \$69 million was allocated to qualifying areas as determined by the proportion of the increased number of unemployed in their areas, (the difference between December and September, October, November average number of unemployed used for regular Title VI allocations) as compared to the increased number of unemployed in all such qualifying areas.

The remaining 10 percent was allocated only to those qualifying areas in prime sponsor jurisdictions which were at or above 100 percent of their end of January 1975 prime sponsor enrollment plans (reports are only submitted by prime sponsors), using the same procedure explained above.
