On Monday, the Senate will consider the nominations of Myer Rashish to be Under Secretary of State for Economic Affairs, Chester Crocker, to be Assistant Secretary of State for African Affairs, and Charles Wick to be Director of the International Communication Agency.
- \* The Foreign Relations Committee will vote today on the nomination of Ernest Lefever.
- \* On June 8, the Foreign Relations Committee will hold hearings on the nominations of Thomas Enders to be Assistant Secretary for Inter-American Affairs and J. William Middendorf to be Permanent Representative of the U.S. to the O.A.S.; On June 10, the Committee will hold hearings on international terrorism tactics, and the proposed Convention on the Physical Protection of Nuclear Material and the proposed International Convention Against the Taking of Hostages.
- \* The Subcommittee on Separation of Powers continues its hearings on June 10 and 12 on S.158, establishing a congressional finding and declaration that human life begins at conception.
