WRANGELL-ST. ELIAS NATIONAL PARK AND PRESERVE

Q: Dall sheep is apparently the big attraction for the commercial hunting guides, their clients, and some other sport hunters with airplanes. But a recent National Park Service/ ADF&G study determined that 81% of the sheep are already in the Preserve.

Doesn't further massive reductions in the Park for the sheep hunters seem a little extreme?

- Q: Your propsal removes even more of the Park (3.1 million acres) than S. 49 (2.3 million), Why?
- A: ?
- Q: If 81% of the Dall Sheep are already in the Preserve, what would be the percentages under S.49 and the administration proposals?
- A: Mr. Horn will have to research this one.
- Q: Where has subsistence hunting traditionally taken place in the Park?
- A: Only in the three small road-accessible park portions, not in the remote sheep country that the guides and hunters fly into. (Subsistence hunters in the bulk of the Wrangells cannot use airplanes for hunting).
- Q; Since the vast bulk of the park acreage that would be opened by the administration and S. 49 is <u>not</u> used by subsistence hunters, can the "equity argument" be used to justify opening these unhunted park areas to the trophy hunters?
