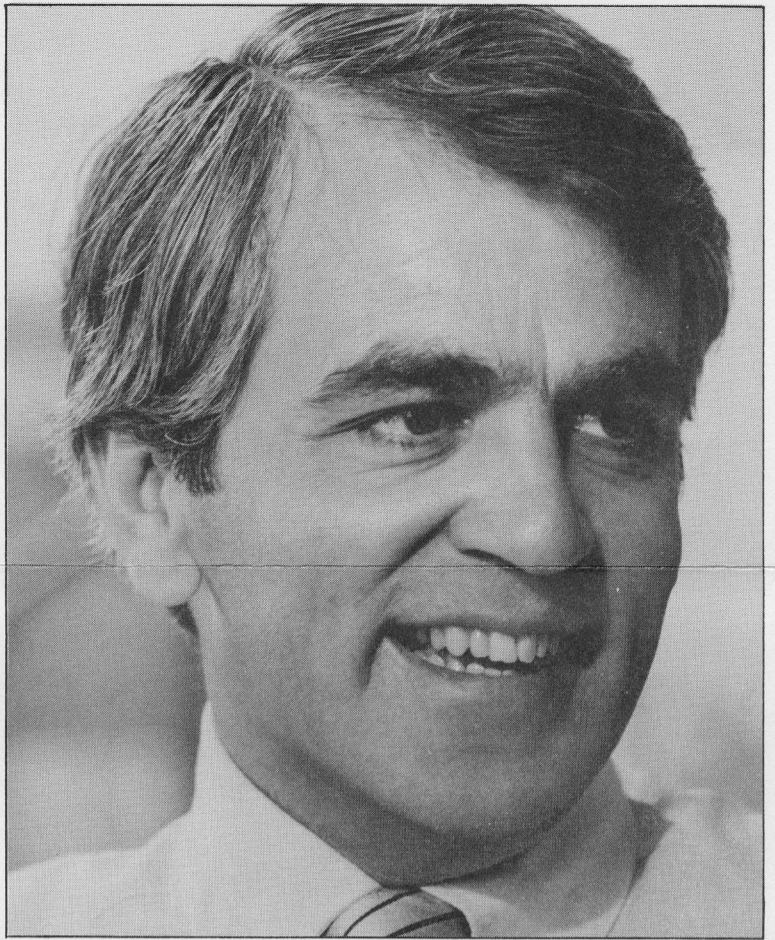


# About Paul Tsongas

Since his election to the Senate in 1978, Paul Tsongas has shown the same rare commitment to equality and human rights as he did in his years in the U.S. House of Representatives (1975-1978) and earlier as a Peace Corps volunteer in Ethiopia.

- Paul Tsongas authored the Gay Rights legislation to prohibit employment discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation.
- He authored legislation for emergency funding for AIDS research.
- He is the principal sponsor of the Equal Rights Amendment.
- Paul was one of only four Senators to oppose Reagan's massive increase in military spending from the outset.
- He was one of the six original Senate co-sponsors of the Nuclear Freeze Resolution.
- A member of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee, Paul Tsongas has strongly advocated arms control, opposed increased military involvement in Central America, and exposed human rights abuses in South Africa, Latin America, the Soviet Union and around the world.
- A leading environmentalist, Paul Tsongas led the fight for the Alaska Lands Act and the Solar Conservation Bank and against acid rain.
