## For a strong Israel

## For firm U.S. support of Israel

Authored the Resolution calling for U.S. condemnation of France for releasing Palestinian terrorist Abu Daoud as "an unconscionable breach of international justice."

Co-sponsored the Wright/Rhodes Resolution condemning the P.L.O. attack of March 11, 1978 in Israel.

Fought for the anti-boycott law which prohibits compliance with Arab trade boycotts against Israel.

Condemned the U.N. resolution equating Zionism with racism, calling for reassessment of U.S. role with General Assembly if Israel were expelled.

## For justice to Soviet Jews

As author and co-sponsor of numerous letters, amendments, and resolutions has deplored harassment of Soviet Jews and dissidents and demanded compliance with Helsinki accords.

Secured the release of Mira Geisberg from the Soviet Union after she had been denied permission to emigrate following the escape of her husband and son to the U.S.

Worked with "Action for Soviet Jewry" to protest Soviet refusal to allow infant Jessica Katz to travel to the U.S. to receive life-saving medical treatment.

Cabled Soviet President Brezhnev to demand nullification of the sentences of "refuseniks" Ida Nudel and Vladimir Slepak.
