Two fundamental principles must guide U.S. policy in the Mid-East:

- 1. Israel's right to exist and survive must be unequivocably assured.
- 2. The Palestinians question must be resolved through direct and urgent action.

The Tsongas Plan, based on those two principles would encompass the following specific proposals:

- 1. Armed Palestinian groups, including the PLO, must be disarmed.
- 2. Safe passage out of Lebanon for the PLO and other Palestinian guerrillas to a country acceptable to them and their hosts must be granted.
- 3. The PLO must recognize Israel's right to exist, according to U.N. Resolution 242.
- 4. The resolution of the Palestinian issue must be resolved in part through a determined adherence to the Camp David accords and urgent autonomy discussions.
- 5. The Camp David Peace Process must be broadened to include directly the state of Jordan.
- 6. In Lebanon, Syrian and Israeli troops must be evacuated.
- 7. An international peace keeping force with sufficient strength and authority to be effective, must be deployed in Lebanon and specifically southern Lebanon.
- 8. American assistance and expertise should be directed in significant quantities to Lebanon for immediate disaster relief and long term economic reconstruction.

Discussion items:

- 1. PLO prisoners held by Israel and their disposition.
- 2. Camp David Process to move ahead expeditiously as long as the PLO and Palestinian guerrillas remain unarmed, and do not engage in terrorist acts against Israel or other targets.
