Reagan budget proposes \$5 million for the National Trust for Historic Preservation.

Our amendment would add \$25 million for the State historic preservation programs.

This would mean a total of \$30 million for the Trust and for the State programs.

Without our amendment, the state preservation programs will have 0 funding, and will have to close down.

Our amendment provides the minimum of funds needed for keeping the state grant programs going:

States need \$15 million just to carry out federal mandates:

1. Nominations for national register

2. Certifications for tax act rehabilitation credit

3. Reviews of federal grants applications for projects which impact on preservation (180,000 reviews last year)

This leaves \$10 million for survey and planning and grants for the entire nation.

In Massachusetts, \$5 million in HPF assistance over 5 years has resulted in over \$200 million in private investment.

From an energy and economic standpoint this program is critical. Our add on provides workable program levels for the HPF

House Action on Historic Preservation

House Appropriations Committee has restored the \$8 million proposed for FY 81 recission

House authorization Committee has authorized a total of \$250 million for LWCF and HPF for FY 82, with no specific target for HPF.
