PROPOSED GUIDE FOR U.S. POLICY IN THE MIDDLE EAST

FUNDAMENTAL OBJECTIVES

- Israel's right to exist and survive within secure and recognized borders.
- 2. Resolution of the Palestinian question through urgent negotiations.
- 3. A stable, secure and peaceful Lebanon governed by Lebanese.

SPECIFIC POLICY PRINCIPLES

- 1. The disarming of the PLO guerrillas in Lebanon.
- 2. Safe passage out of Lebanon for the PLO to a country acceptable to them and their hosts.
- 3. PLO recognition of Israel's right to exist, according to U.N. Resolutions 242 and 338.
- 4. Resolution of the Palestinian issue through a determined adherence to the Camp David accords and urgent autonomy discussions.
- 5. Inclusion of Jordan and other moderate Arab states in the Camp David Peace Process.
- 6. Linkage between urgent progress on the Camp David autonomy talks and absence of PLO military and terrorist activity.
- 7. Evacuation of Syrian and Israeli troops from Lebanon.
- 8. Deployment in Lebanon and specifically southern Lebanon of an international peace-keeping force with sufficient strength and authority to be effective until the Lebanese army is able to replace it.
- 9. Provision of American assistance and expertise in significant quantities, in cooperation with other donors, for the immediate disaster relief and the long term economic reconstruction of a stable, peaceful, and secure Lebanon.
