- * The Senate goes into session at 11AM today. The legislative program is uncertain. However, the Senate is likely to consider the conference report on HR 3512, the Supplemental Appropriations bill for 1981.
- * The Foreign Relations Committee, this morning, holds hearings on the Law of the Sea.
- * This afternoon, the Foreign Relations Committee holds closed hearings on the Lefever nomination. The Committee is likely to vote tommorrow. It is expected that they will vote to report the nomination UNFAVORABLY to the full Senate. A difficult and close floor fight can be expected.
- * Paul's speeches on the Housing bill yesterday and a colloquy with Chairman Garn appear in the <u>Congressional Record</u> on pages \$5702-\$5703; \$.5720.
- * Paul's Energy Tax Credit bill (S.1323) was introduced yesterday. The Tsongas speech, the bill's provisions, a summary of the bill, and Sen. Kennedy's speech in support of the bill appear in the <u>Congressional</u> Record on pages S5759-S5761.
- * There were two votes on the floor yesterday on the Housing and Community Development bill, S1197. On final passage, Paul voted NO.(The bill passed 65-24 with 24 Democrats voting no.) Also, Paul voted YES on the Proxmire Amendment (which was defeated 37-53) to strike the substantive revisions of the community development block grant program.
