CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Designating "Appropriate Technology Week".

Whereas April 27 through May 1 has been designated as "Appropriate Technology Week" throughout the United States; and

Whereas appropriate technology is energy saving, anti-inflationary, labor intensive, decentralized, easily maintained, envi-

ronmentally sound, capital saving, and fosters free enterprise and competition; and

Whereas the American people, industry, and labor should be made aware of the realization and potential of appropriate technologies; and

Whereas Federal, State, and local governments should promote and encourage further development, refinement, and deployment of appropriate technologies; and

Whereas the realization and the promise of appropriate technology will be observed and celebrated on the Washington Mall from April 27 through May 1, 1979, through the ACT '79 Fair/Conference: Now, therefore, be it

- 3 1979, be proclaimed "Appropriate Technology Week", and
- 4 that the people and the representatives of government, indus-
