- Tuesday's (Apr. 7) legislative agenda for the Senate is still uncertain. The Senate may take up S.694, the FY 81 Supplemental Defense Authorization and/or S.734, the Export Trade bill.
- @ The schedule for the remainder of the week has not been announced.
- When the Senate completes its business this week, it will adjourn for the Easter break until Monday, April 27th.
- The <u>Energy Committee</u> meets Tuesday for a hearing on Strategic Minerals and Materials Policy -- Paul will be out of town until 1:35 P.M.
- On Thursday, Sen. Chafee and Sen. Pell will be introducing a bill to create a <u>New England Power Authority</u>— to sell revenue bonds and to import Canadian hydro and for long range regional energy planning. (More info in Mitch's section of the Legislative Alert <u>Weekly Bulletin</u>). There may be press attention.
- The Democratic Caucus meets Tuesday to discuss Export Trading bill and the Supplemental Defense Authorization.
- The Foreign Relations Committee meets Wed. regarding foreign assistance and Thurs. regarding El Salvador.
