- * The Senate convenes today at 9 am. The Senate will continue consideration of the State Department Authorization. After that bill is disposed of, the Senate will resume its consideration of S. 951, the Justice Department Authorization, on which Sen. Weicker is currently filibustering the Helms anti-busing amendment.
- * The Foreign Relations Committee today holds hearings on the Israeli attack on the Iraqi reactor. Undersecretary of State Stoessel and CIA Director Casey will testify, with the later testimony coming in closed session.
- * The Energy Committee will hold a business meeting today to consider several bills and nominations.
- * Yesterday, the Senate voted to separate the Peace Corps from ACTION- the vote came on a Helms motion to table the Cranston amendment- the Senate rejected the tabling motion 45-52, and then passed the amendment by voice vote.
