

Mr. Speaker, today I wish to bring to the attention of my colleagues the impressive and illuminating discussion between Robert McNamara, President of the World Bank, and journalist Bill Moyers, which was aired on national television on February 6, 1975.

In this interview on the role of The World Bank in today's economic and financial circumstances, Mr. Moyers asked some probing questions relevant to such present-day difficulties as the high cost of food and fuel and the shrinkage of available natural resources, and Mr. McNamara explained the planet's growing interdependence and its concomitant need for us all to help each other.
