- * The Senate goes into session today at 11 AM. The Senate will consider S.730, the Crop Insurance bill and/or S.1003, the Climate Control bill. At 2:45 PM, the Senate will vote, en bloc, on 7 State Department nominations.
- * Highlights of Paul's schedule:
 - -Meeting with Everett mayor, Ed Connolly
 - -Meeting reps from Mass. Broadcasters Assn.
 - -Address, Nat'l Conference of Christians and Jews in Little Rock, Ark.
- * The Senate yesterday passed, by unanimous consent, the authorization bill for the Marine Sanctuaries Act.
- * The HOUSE today will begin voting on the First Concurrent Budget Resolution, H. Con. Res. 115. Prospects of defeating the Gramm-Latta Substitute do not look good by all reports.
- * The Foreign Relations Committee will hold hearings this afternoon on the nomination of Robert Neumann to be Ambassador to Saudi Arabia.
- * Foreign Relations is also continuing its mark-up of S.784, the State Dept. Authorization; S.991, the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency authorization; S.849, the ICA authorization; and S.847, the Supplemental for FY81 and the FY82 and FY83 authorization for the Board of International Broadcasting.
- * Foreign Relations will also vote today on several nominations including nominees Holdridge, Eagleberger, and Malone.
- * The Small Business Committee will hold hearings on the SBA size standards proposals today.
- * The Select Committee on Ethics will hold a closed meeting on Senator Williams' convinction in the ABSCAM matter.
- * The Senate is likely to consider the FEC Authorization and/or S.533, the public buildings legislation this week. The Senate will likely consider the First Concurrent Budget Resolution on Thursday. Since targets in the first budget resolution are not binding, it is not, at this time, expected that there will be extensive Democratic efforts to amend the resolution on the floor.
