

MEMORANDUM FOR: Lee V. Gossick, EDO

In response to your memorandum concerning the April 23 meeting between the Mattson Task Force and Bryan Eagle and Peter Strauss, I believe it is appropriate to make it available to Dr. Myers. You should convey it to the Committee as soon as possible.

I note that on page 2, point 4 of the memo indicates that during the meeting "An information package was put on the table before the Commissioners and staff, but was not left. No request that it be left was made, and NRC had inadequate secure document storage facilities for highly sensitive finiterials." I do not recall any such package, and I think in view of the circumstances it is important that the Commissioners review it. I, at least, would like to do so. I believe we now have the proper storage facilities, or in any case it can be brought by for reading. Please make arrangements for it to be made available to myself and Mr. Kennedy as soon as possible.

As a final matter, I find it rather irregular that the memorandum of the April 23 meeting was classified today, after it was requested by Dr. Myers. This raises serious questions about our administrative controls over classified information. If the material is properly classifiable, it should have been so classified when it was prepared.
