Secretary for Land and Water Resources at DOI; G. Ray Arnett to be Asst. Secretary for Fish & Wildlife and Parks at DOI; and Robert Burford to be Director of BLM at DOI. The hearing is at 2 PM.
- \* Foreign Relations Committee is holding hearings today on S. 849, authorizing funds for FY82 and FY83 for ICA; S. 847, supplemental funding for the Board for International Broadcasting and on proposed legislation authorizing funds for FY82 for the Arms Control and Disarmament Agency.
- \* Paul is planning to stop by the New Bedford fishermen and vessel owners "Seafood Day" luncheon at 12:30.
- \* Paul will address the Council of Jewish Federations National Public Policy Institute this evening.

- \* VOTES OF INTEREST: Yesterday the Senate passed S. 694, authorizing supplemental funds for FY81 for DOD by voice vote. Paul voted against a motion to table and thus kill the Pressler Amendment to delete funding for the MX Missle System (tabled 79-15) and against a motion to table and thus kill the Bumpers Amendment to prohibit use of funds for the reactivation of the battleship USS New Jersey (tabled 69-23)
