RE: Assassination of Kennedy -- Senate Intelligence Committee Report

The Senate Intelligence Committee report on the assassination of President Kennedy reaffirms the need for a Congressional investigation into the former President's death. It is clear that the F.B.I. and C.I.A. did not, at the time, act in the best interests of the country but instead moved hastily to obstruct a thorough investigation into the circumstances surrounding the assassination.

As a cosponsor of the Gonzalez Resolution, I fully support the creation of a select committee of seven House members to study the assassination. All the questions surrounding the shooting of President Kennedy have not been satisfactorily answered; indeed some very disturbing questions have been raised. It is our responsibility to finally establish the circumstances surrounding this tragedy.
