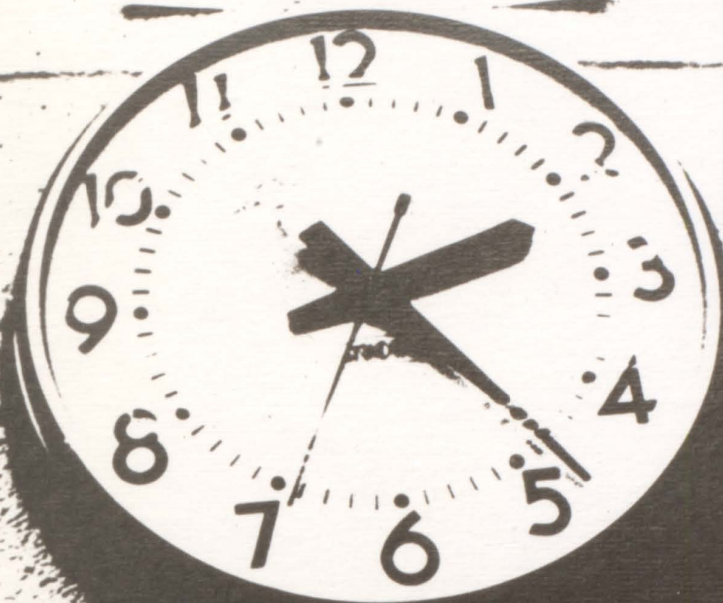


Spirit Week

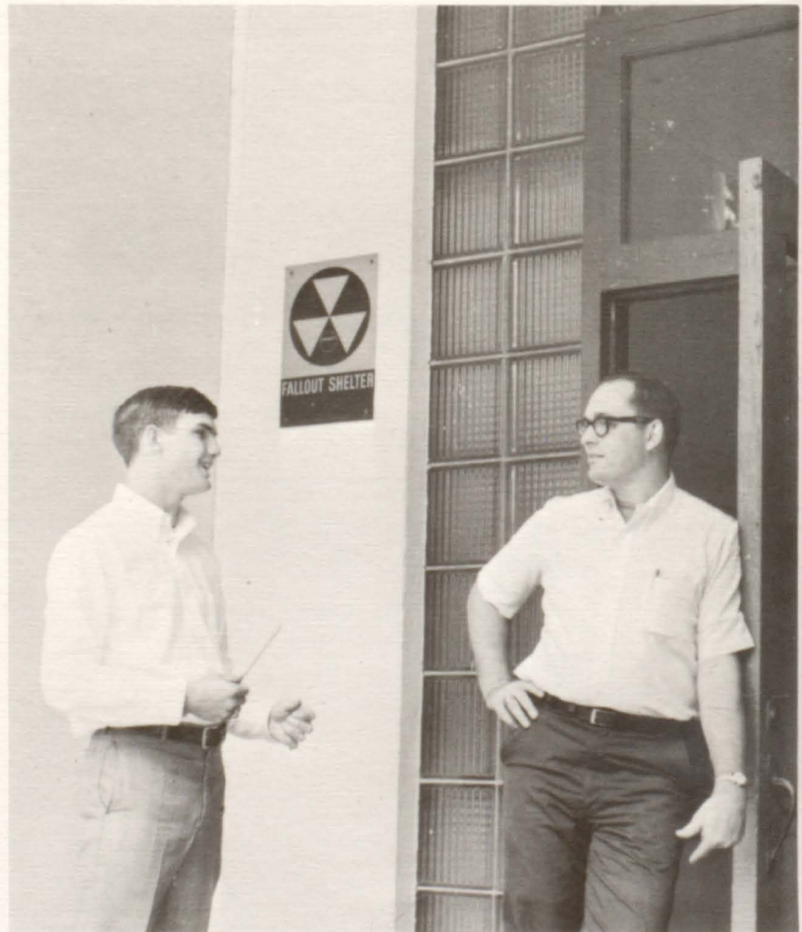






Fellowship of Christian Athletes

Rammettes

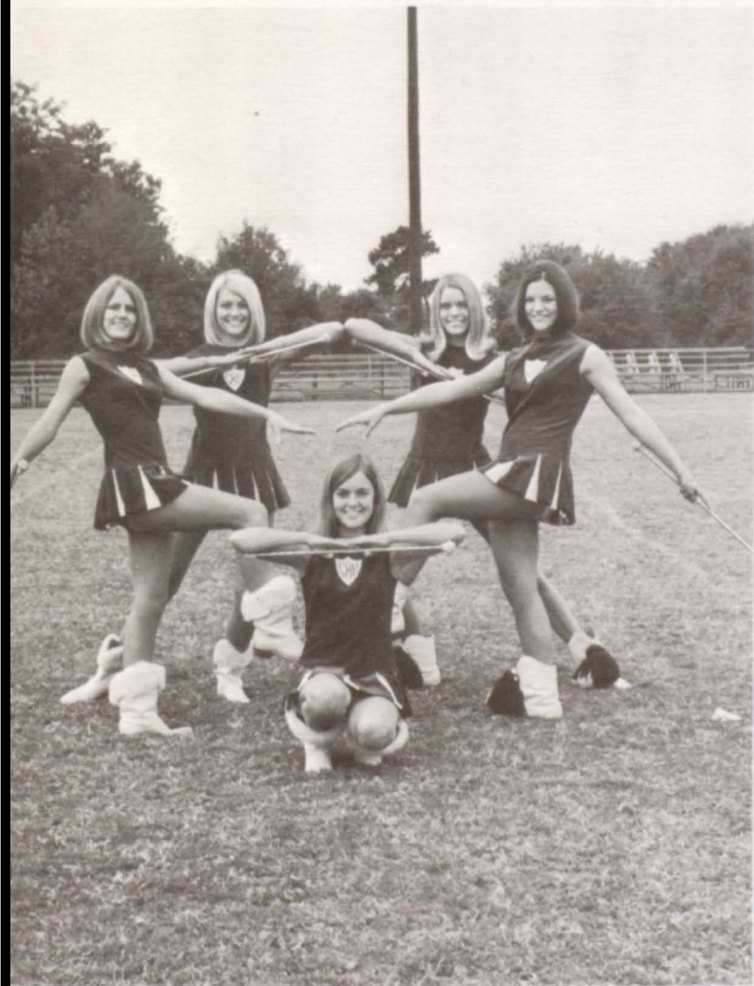

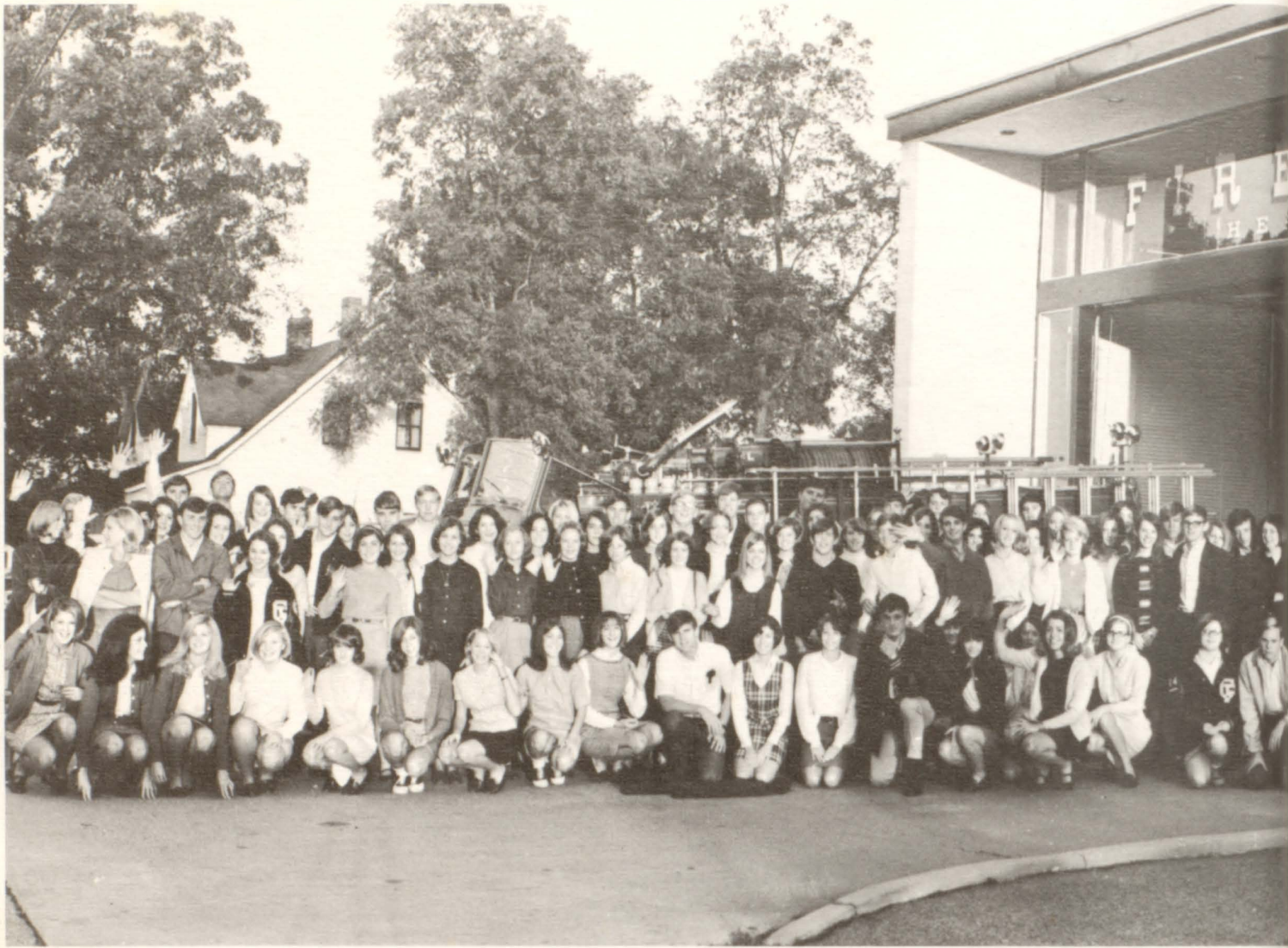
Majorettes

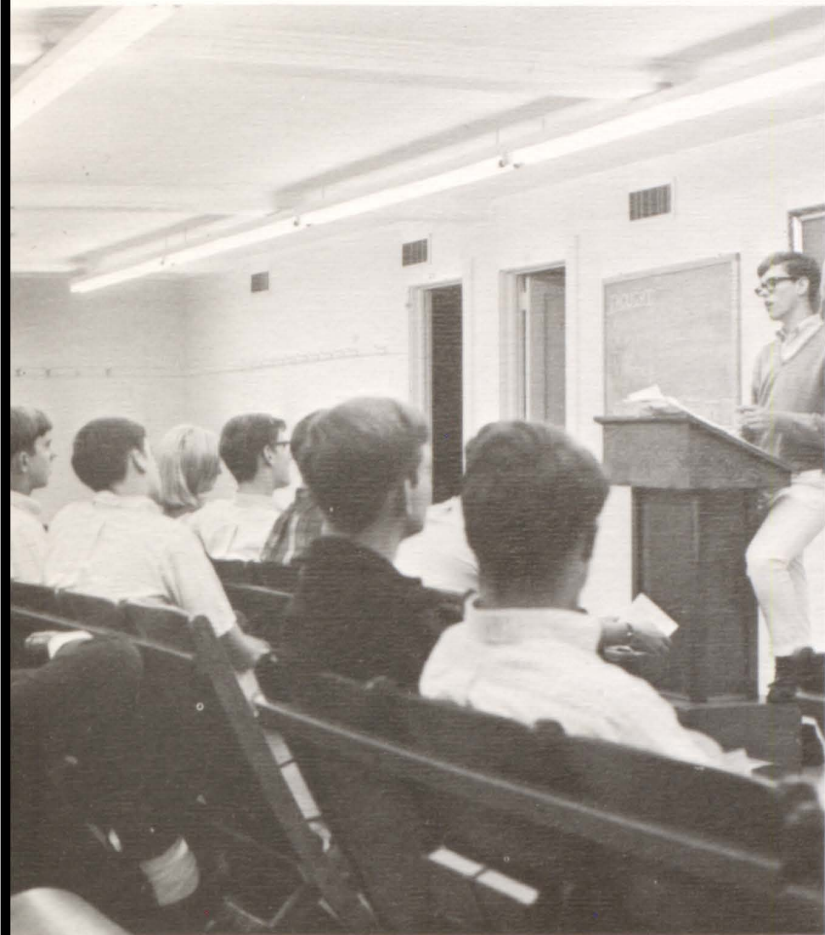




Civinettes

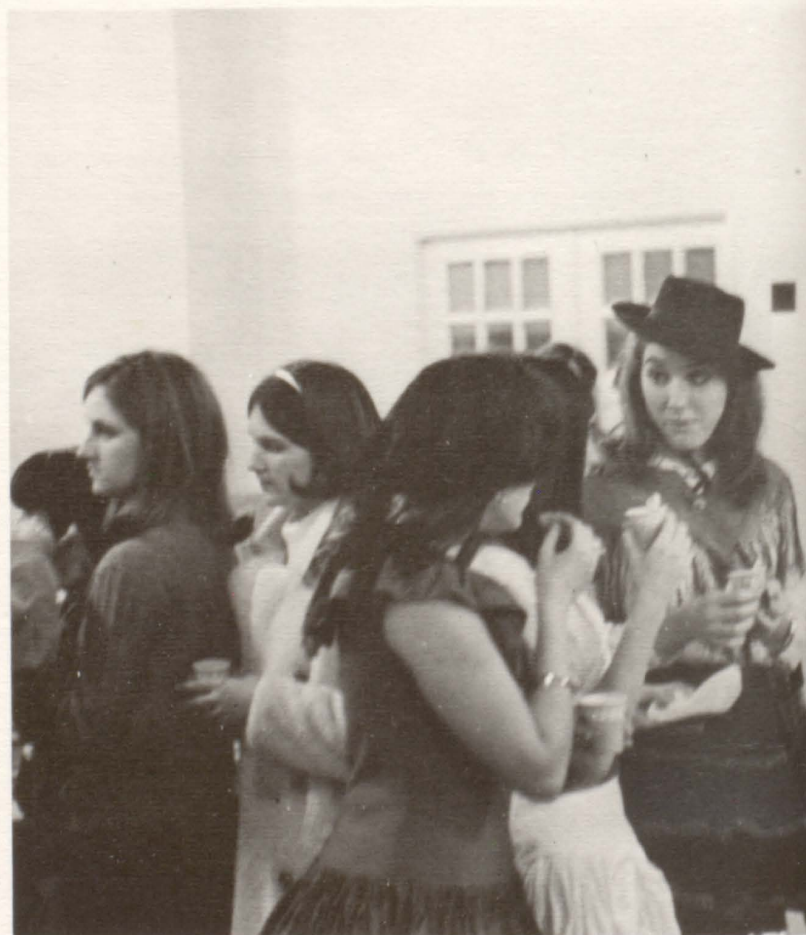




Spanish Club

To most people DCT students are just "those lucky kids that get out after fourth period." However, there's a lot more to being on DCT than getting out early. First, a student must find a job in which he can learn a vocation. This includes such jobs as working a machine shop, cashiering in a bank, or being a mechanic. Next, he must set up schedule in school to include four major academic courses during the first four periods. Finally, he must obtain a work permit and fill out endless forms and questionnaires concerning his job. The DCT program is particularly useful for students who are not planning to attend college, for it gives them practical experience and on-the-job training.

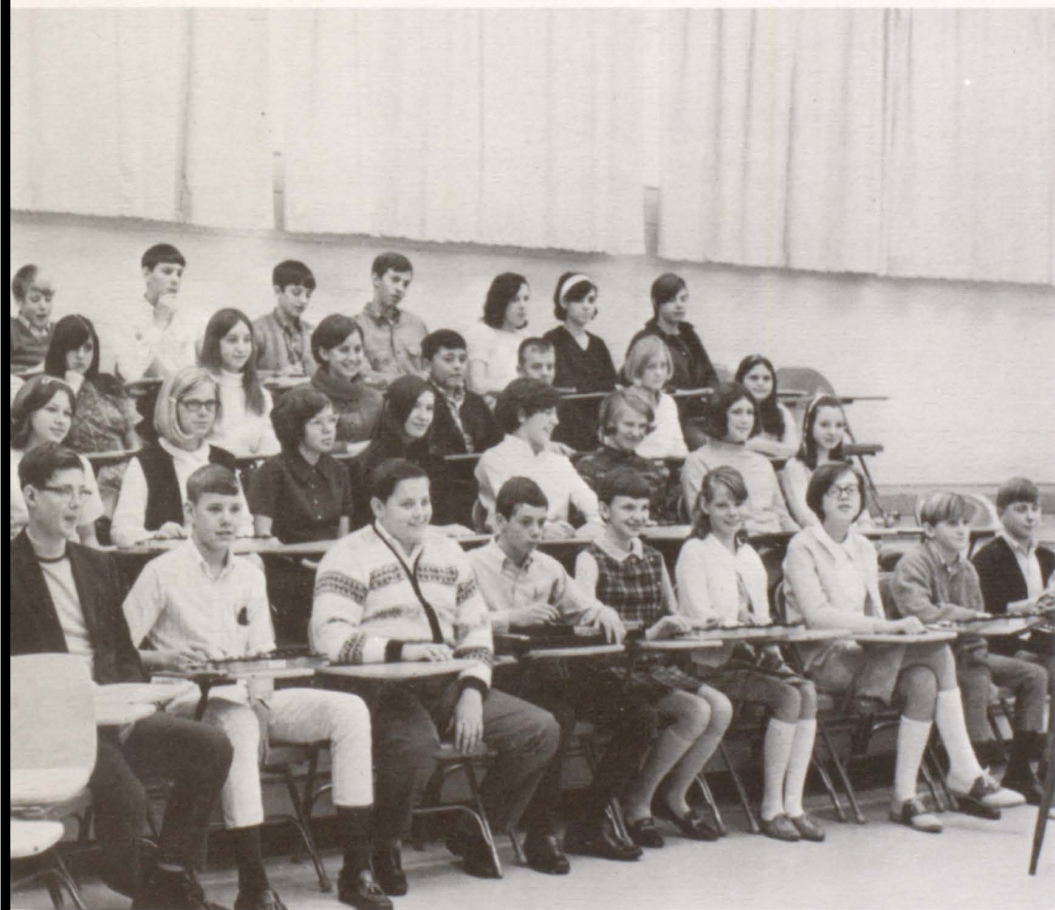
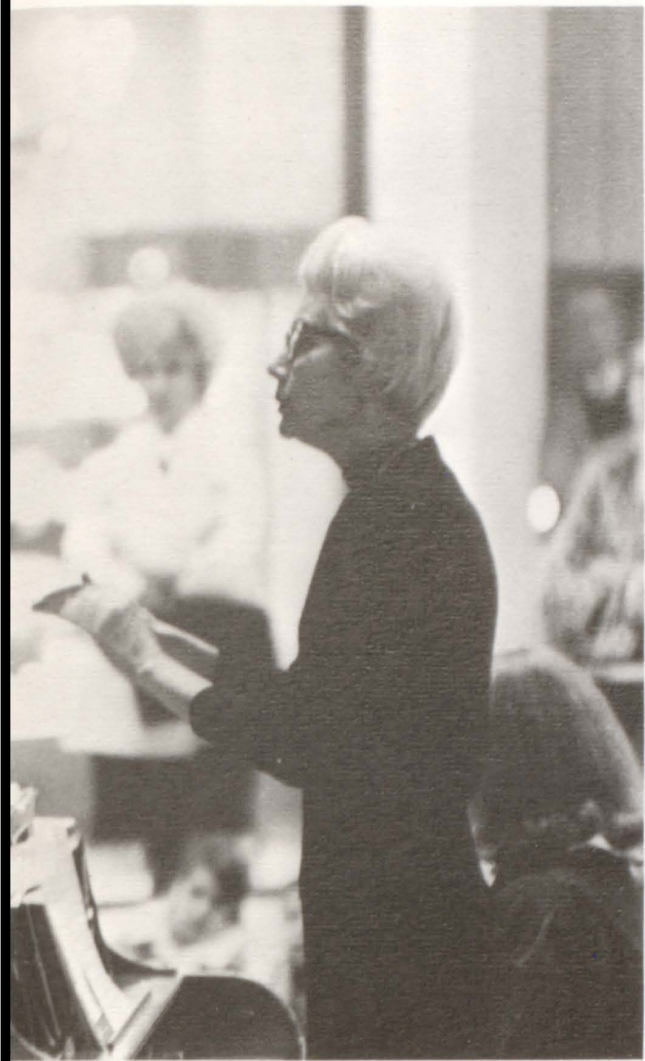
Chorus

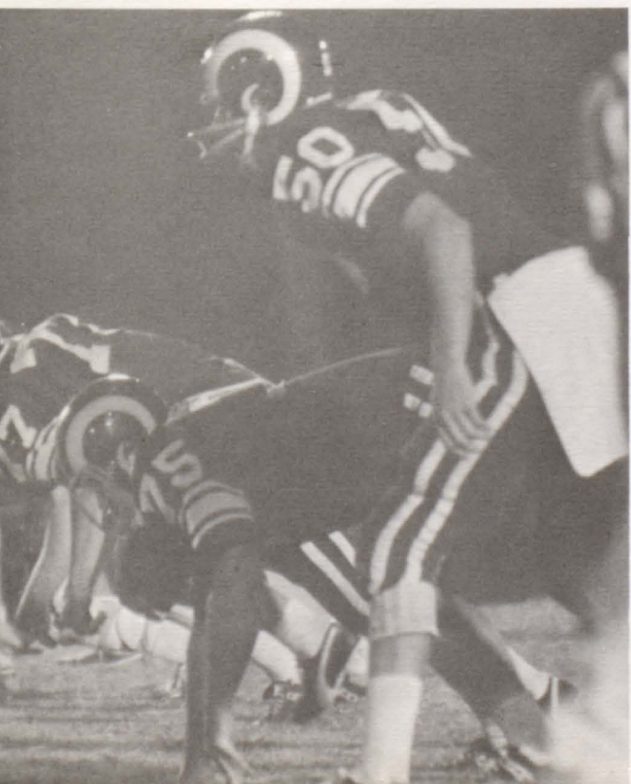
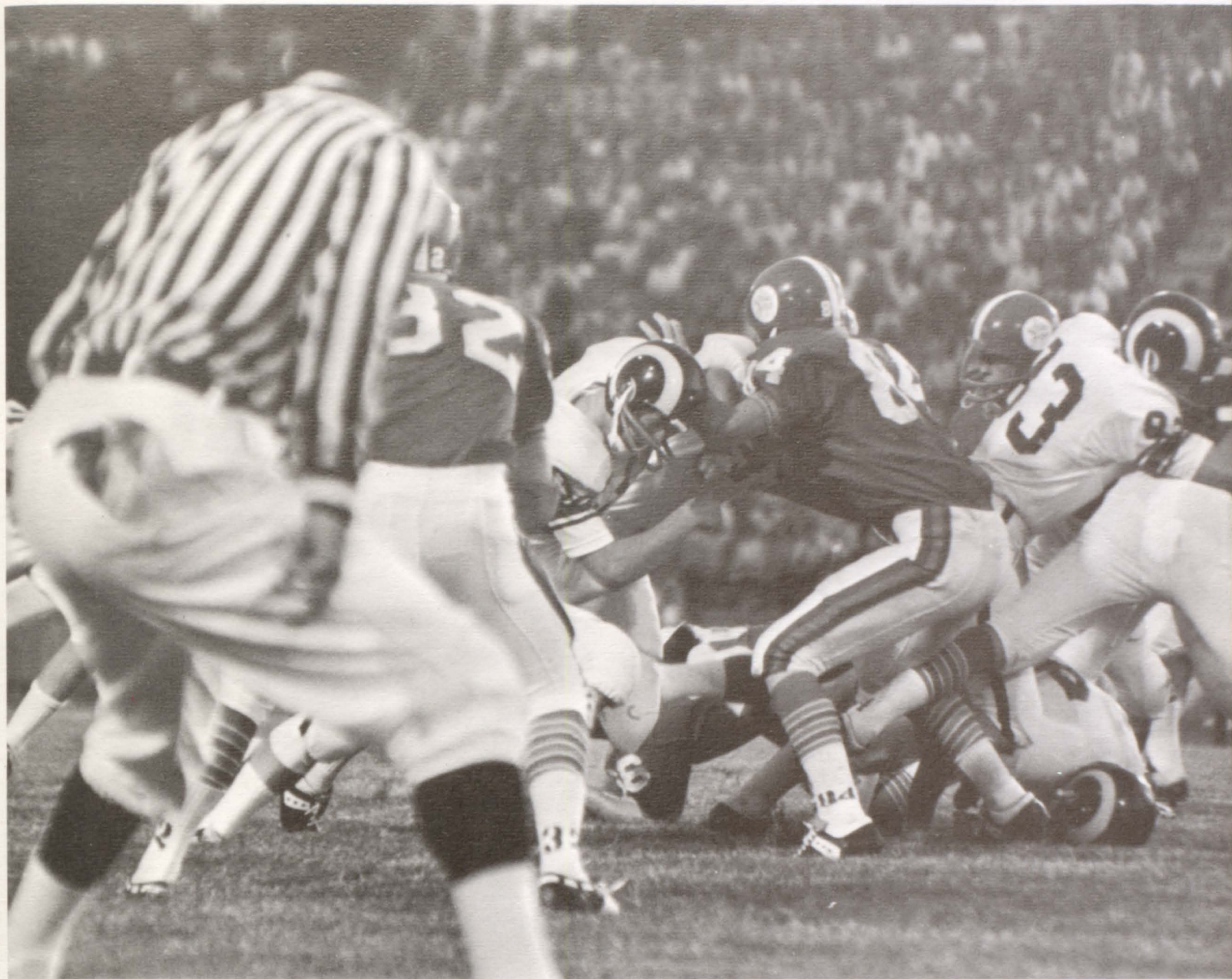




Varsity Football 1968

The College Park Rams opened up the 1968 football season with a heartbreaking loss to the Lakeshore Lancers, 13-6. The Rams showed an impressive offensive threat, but they couldn't seem to break through the Lancer line. Next, the Rams dropped a victory to the North Clayton Eagles, 19-6. It was a particularly hard loss for the favored Rams, because the score was founded more on bad breaks than bad plays. The Rams suffered their third loss in a row to the Grangers of LaGrange, with a final score of 34-6. However, the Rams held the heavily favored Grangers to a respectable 14-0 at the half, showing their true ability for the first time this season. College Park faced its first region opponent, Briarwood, (Continued)





for the fourth game of the season, and easily squelched the Buccaneers 19-6.

Unfortunately the one game winning streak was short lived, for the Rams next faced Sandy Springs, the undefeated, number one team in the state. The mighty Ram defense held the Panthers to a 7-0 lead at the half, and although the final score was 21-0, the Rams played one of their best overall games of the season.

From then on there was no stopping the Rams. They brutally stomped Region opponent Russell 42-7, with the lone Wildcat TD coming late in the fourth quarter. During one of the heaviest rainstorms ever to hit this area, the Rams swam over Hapeville with a final score of 27-0. As a homecoming gift to College Park Alumni, the Rams played the game of the week when they upset the Campbell Bears 33-0. It was a tremendous display by the quick-footed offense. The Rams posted a 33-7 victory over the South Fulton Lions, assuring themselves a chance at the Region 2AA Title. Going into the last game of the season against archrival Headland, the Rams stood 5-4-0, undefeated in region games.

The first score of the game came from Headland late in the first quarter. The Rams tied things up in the second quarter, and at the half the score was 7-7. In the middle of the third quarter Headland scored again, and College Park matched it a few minutes later. The extra point try was wide and the score stood 14-13 going into the final period. 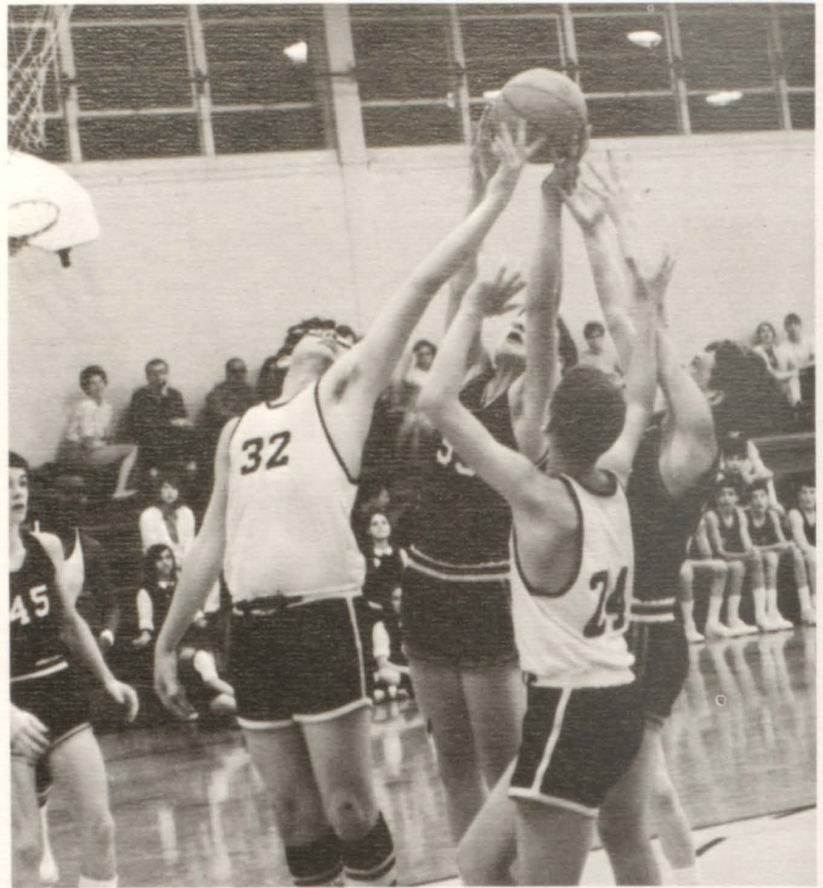
Girls' B-Team
