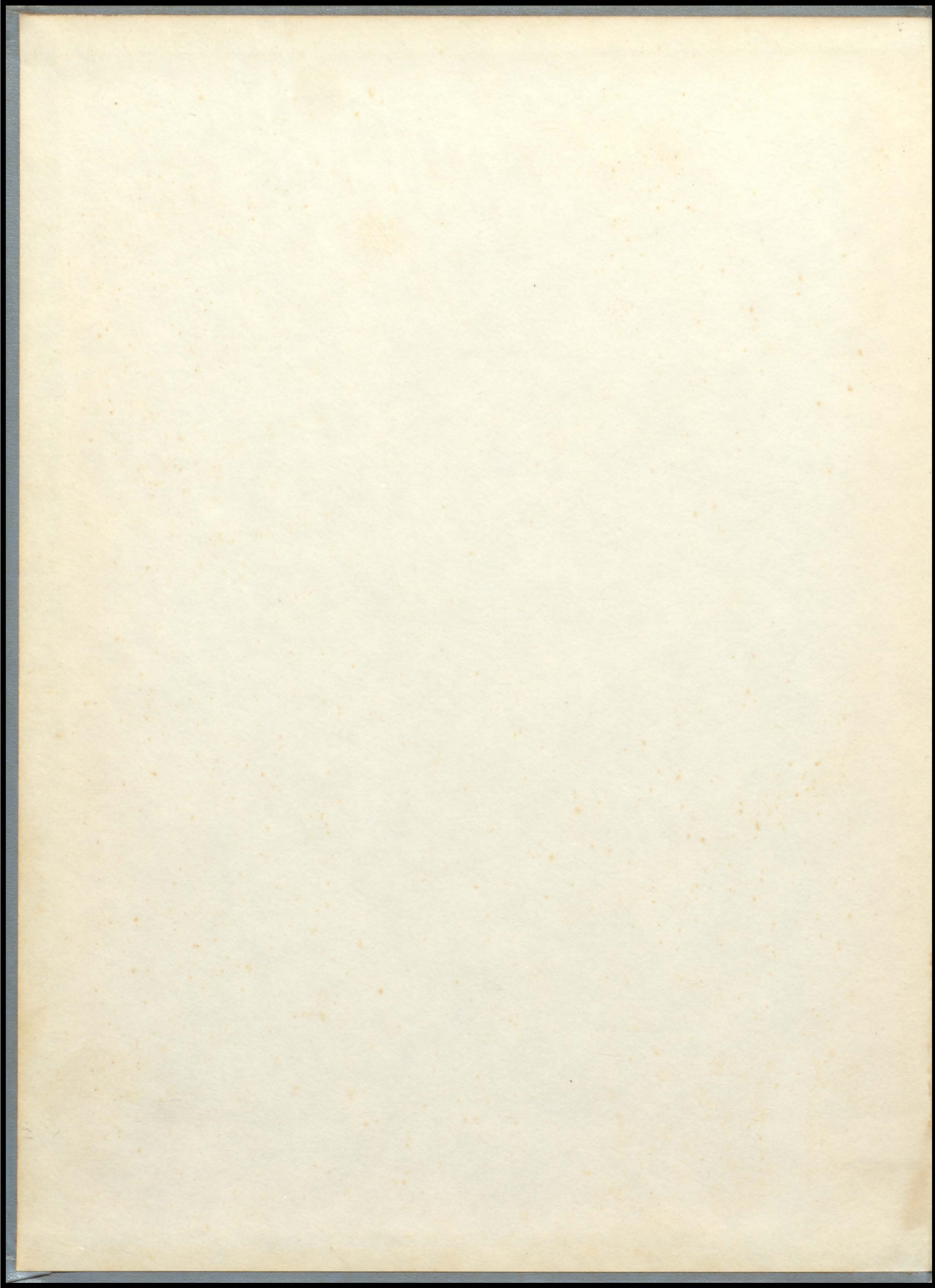
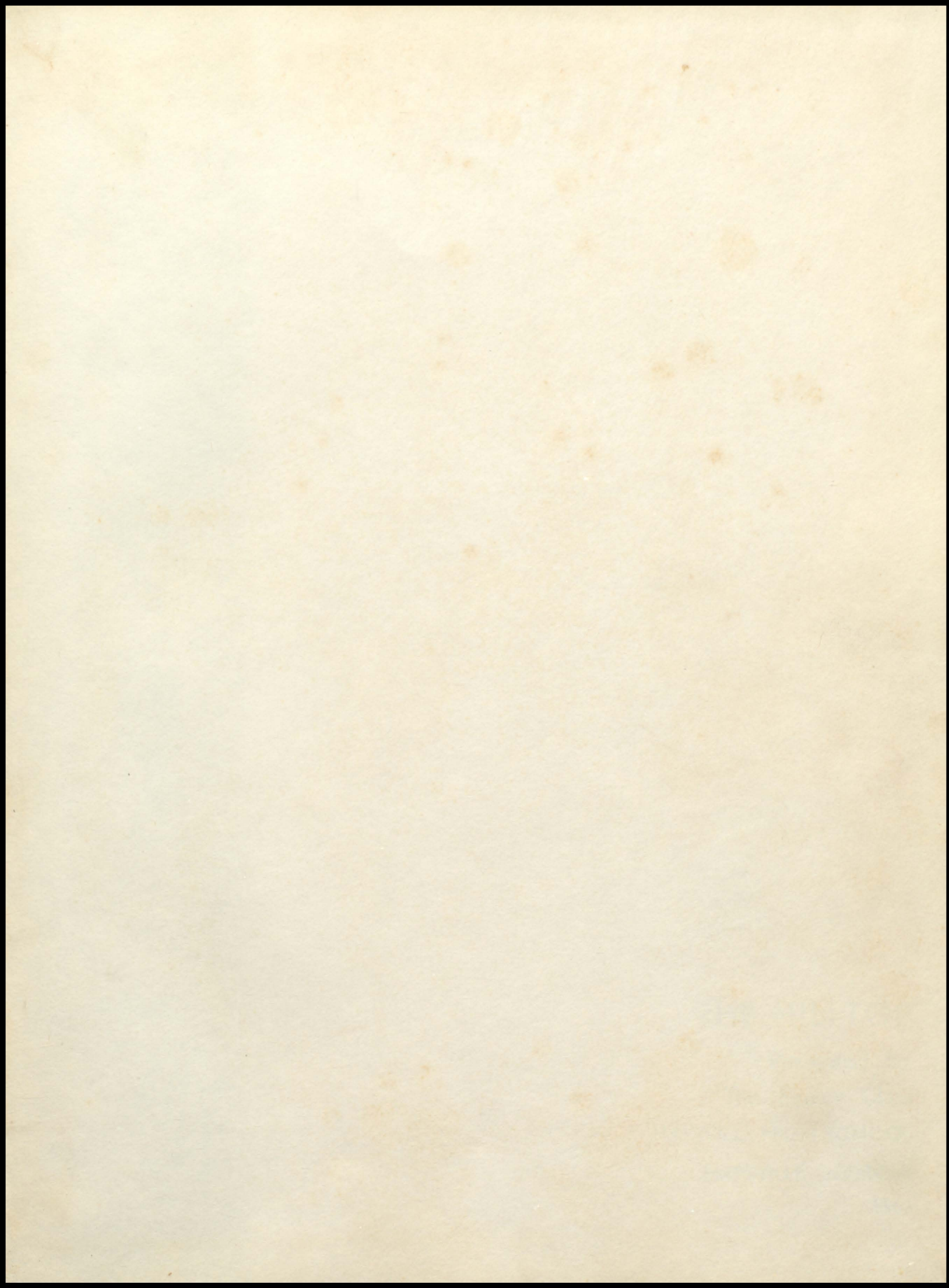
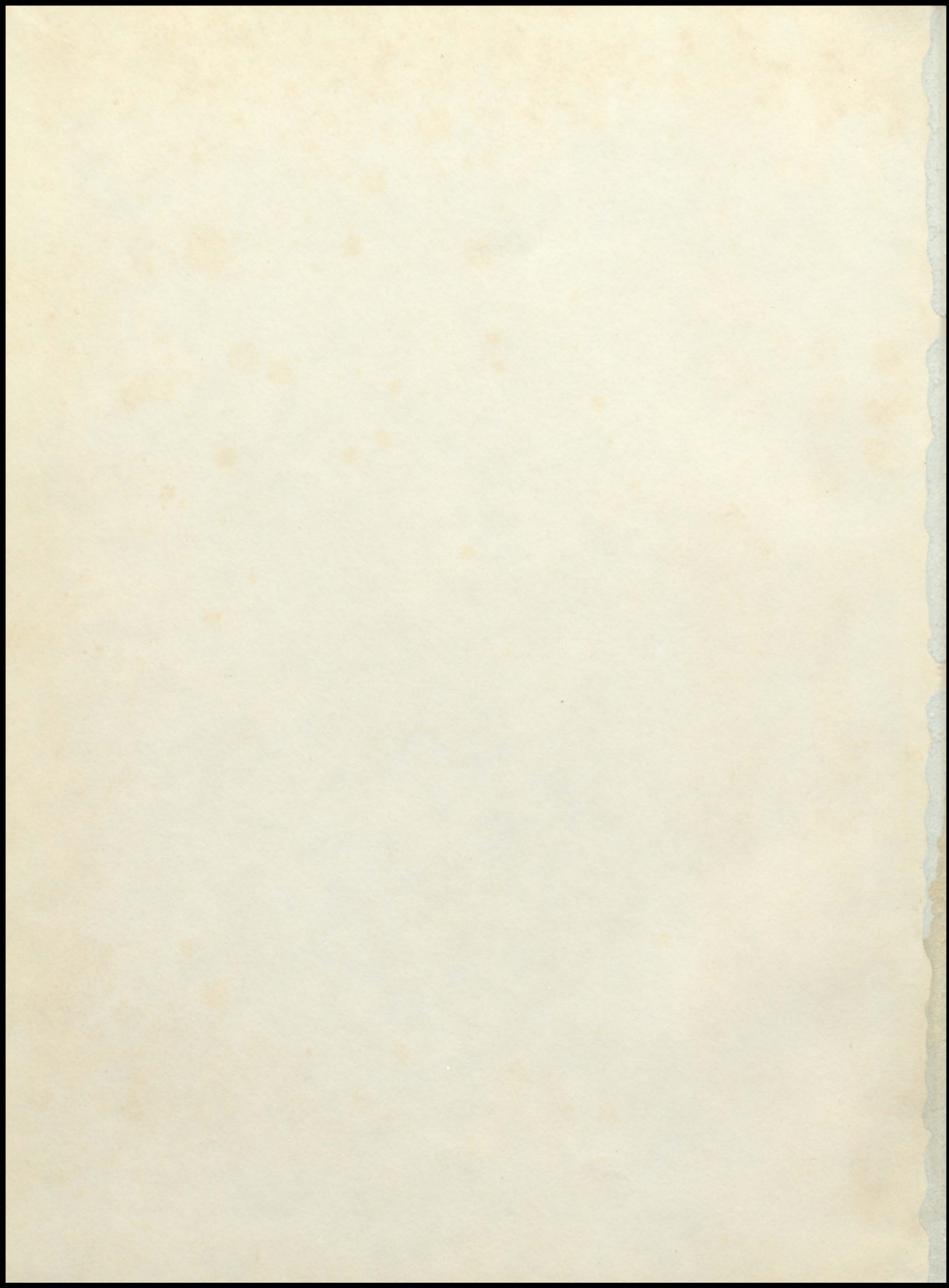

HAPEVILLE HIGH SCHOOL



Hapeville High School, established in 1939, is a member of the Fulton County School System accredited since 1940. It has constantly increased both the size and quality of the curriculum.

Its faculty consists of forty-eight members, as against the original ten, while its Senior Class this year contains one hundred forty-nine members, nearly triple the original fifty-one. There are two of the original faculty still at Hapeville.

Starting with the original building, now the east wing, Hapeville acquired the west wing in 1948, and finally obtained the new physical education plant in 1960.

Through the years, Hapeville High's main purpose has been to prepare students for life. As the lives of former students show, this purpose has been carried out in the true spirit of modern education.

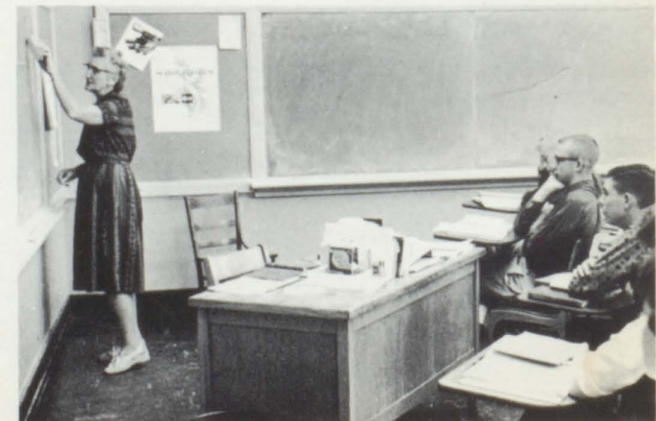

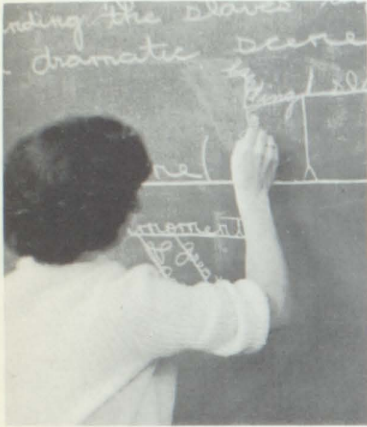


Diagram pictures SENTENCE ANALYSIS.

Five years ago the subfreshmen registration was the "most," as far as records at Hapeville High are concerned. Since then 93 have either moved away or dropped out, for now there are only 149, including transfers.

found an increase in required science, mathematics, and history; general students found English a must for every senior. Results, therefore, show these seniors to be hard working as well as hard playing.

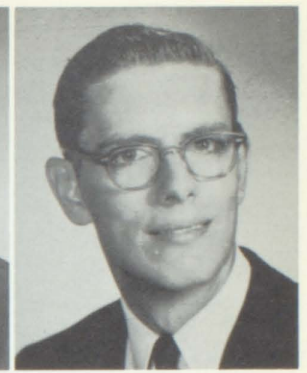
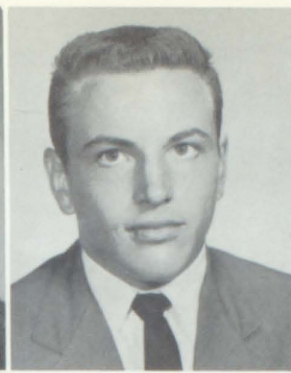

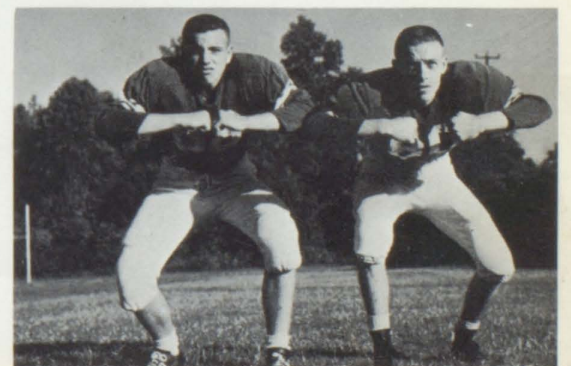

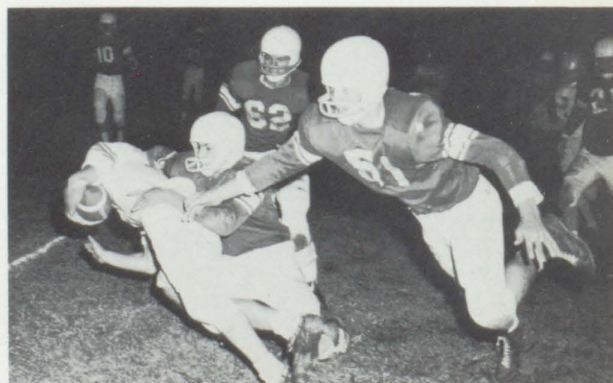
HAPEVILLE TROUNCES OLD RIVAL RAMS TO SOUND DEFEAT

OPPOSITION OUTCLASSES HORNET OFFENSIVE

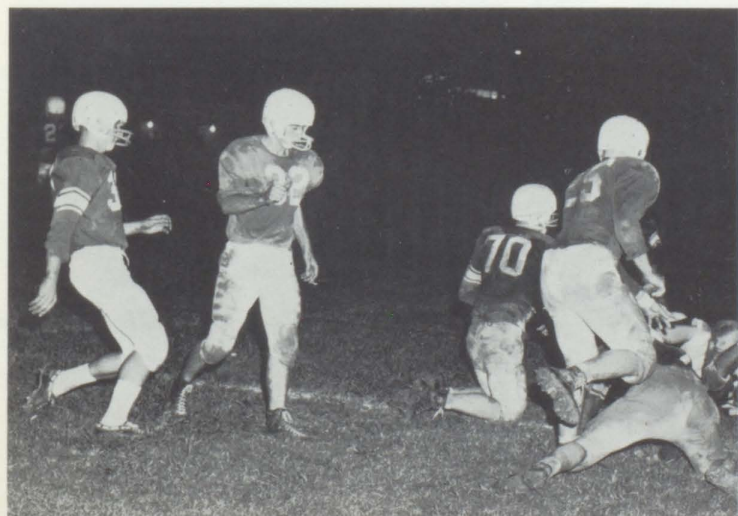

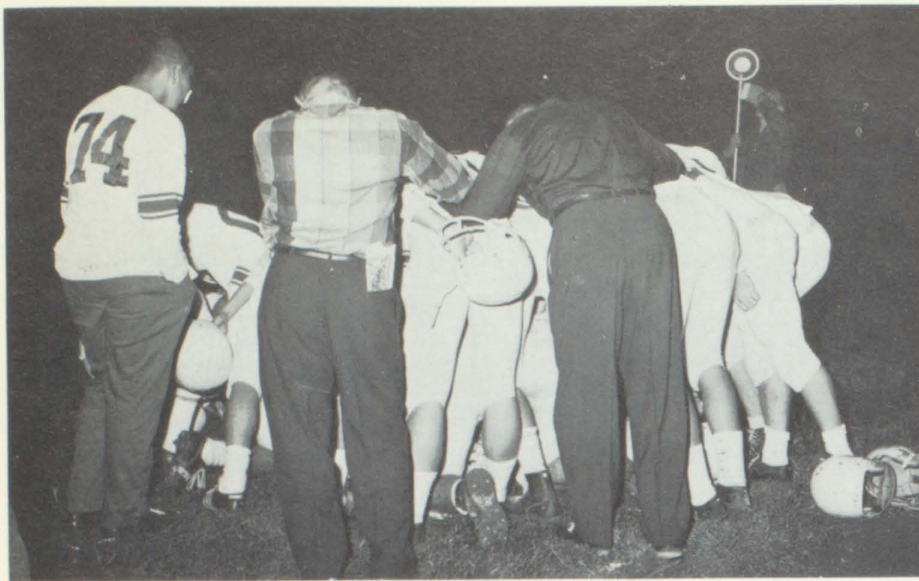

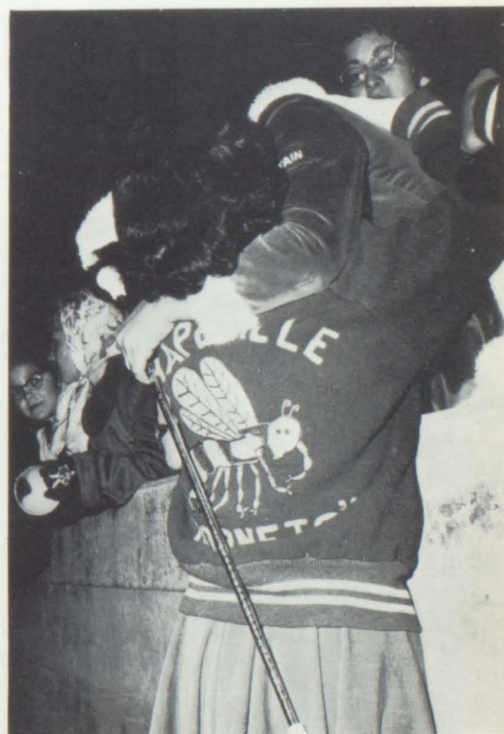
