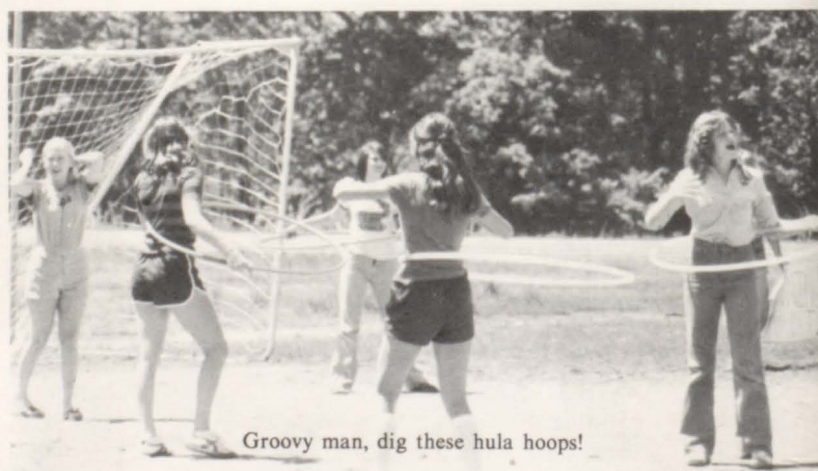
# FIELD DAY

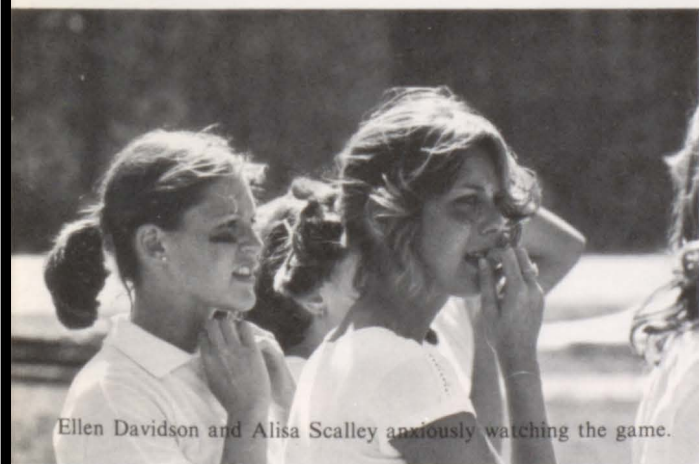

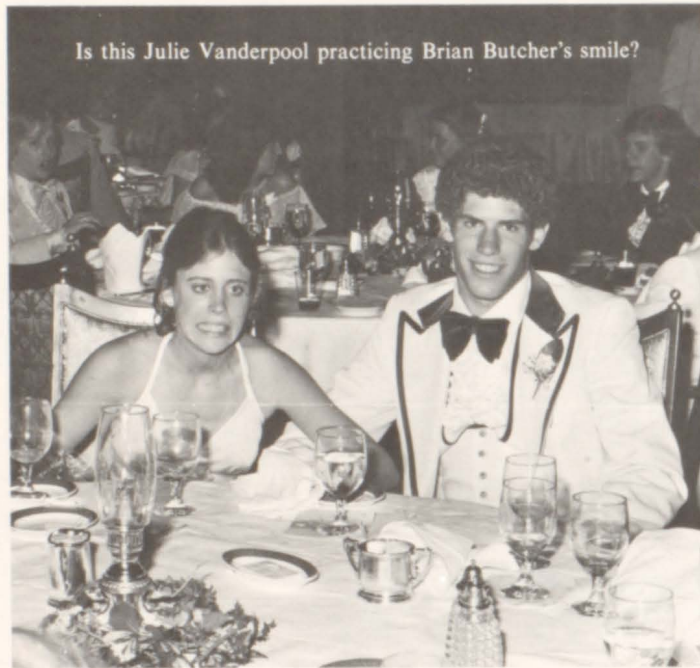

But by the time I get there I could eat the lunch, fork, and tray, too.

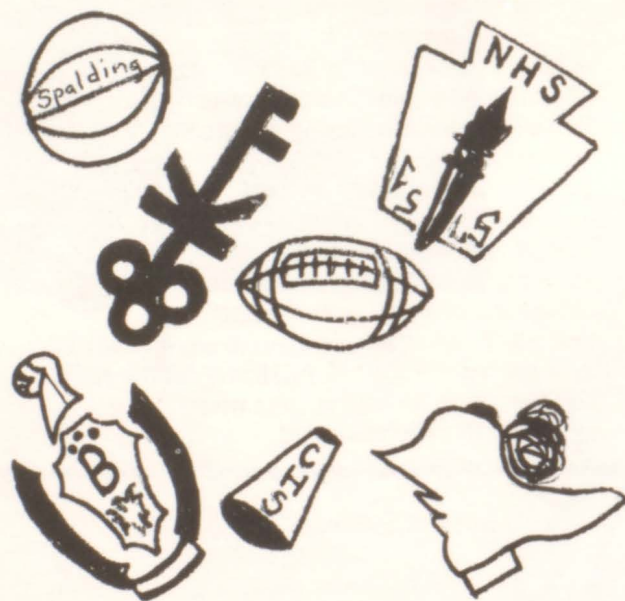
Could it be the homework that gives me a pain?

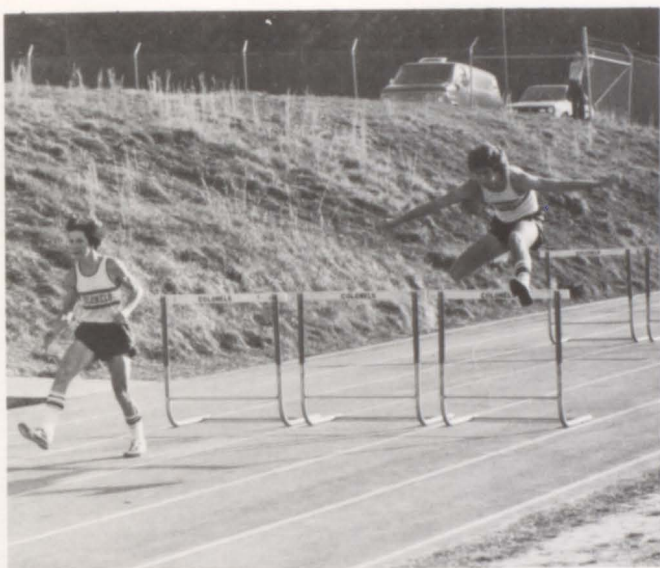

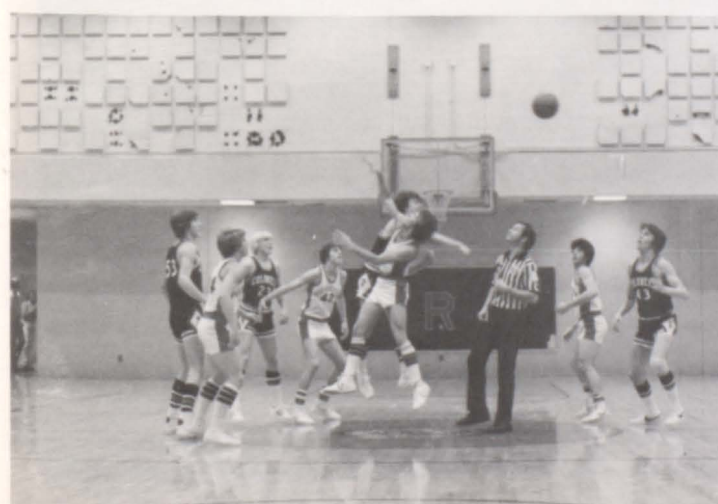
