Interrelations of administration, faculty and students dominate the process of learning at Sandy Springs H. S. Students acquire knowledge not only from books and lectures, but also through individual research and conferences with their respective teachers, thus widening the perspective of their intellect and appreciation.

Glimpses into typical daily scenes of S.S.H.S. life portray many faces of learning. The delighted smile on the face of a math student as the solution of a problem comes to him, the satisfied expression of a coach as he watches his boys execute new football plays, the rapt attention displayed by students as they relive great events in American History, and the exclamation of a science student when his experiment succeeds reveal the continuous realization of the pleasure attainment of knowledge gives to students and teachers alike.

Sandy Springs High School was guided through four years by Principal Reid Gillis. In his years as chief administrator, he helped the student body to reach new heights of accomplishment.

Mr . Gillis received his B.S. degree at Florida State University and his Masters of Education degree in Counseling at Georgia Southern. He also received his Masters in Administration.

Mr. Gillis served his military duty in the Navy. He had his basic training at Bainbridge, Maryland, and then served on the U.S.S. Absecon AVP 23.

Outside of school associations, Mr. Gillis is a Deacon of the Austell Presbyterian Church.

## Counselors Guide Students

Guidance counselors are available to the students to provide help and direction through the high school years. Each person can consult them about class schedules and be guided into academic areas that will best suit his capabilities. He can receive information on colleges and be advised on available scholarships.

The counseling office conducts standardized tests of achievement and mental maturity. From the results of these tests, each student can be helped to evaluate himself and be given vocational guidance for the future.


## Language Arts . . . A Tool

 For Higher LearningExpression of one's ideas and the interpretation of the ideas of others are taught through studies in English usage and great literature. Students are encouraged to master the principles of grammar and to express themselves creatively with the pen. Reading is proved a source of pleasure and wisdom with the studies of American and English literature. David Copperfield and Julius Caesar, Our Town, and Macbeth highlight the four years in that order.

French and Latin are offered to students on first, second, third, and fourth year levels. Spanish is taught through the third year level. Courses of this nature help a person to become more universal by learning about foreign people and their lives through the knowledge of their language.

Journalism encourages growth through writing clear and original ideas. Reporters and editors alike work hard together to publish a bi-monthly paper for the students.
