



More Than a Building, College Park







The Basis of Communication

Language skills are among the most important skills that a student must learn to master. Communication, not only among those who speak the same language but also among those whose languages are different, is becoming vitally important in our modern age. Besides the required five years of English, College Park offers for advanced students a special "13th year" English course. Another course available to advanced students is the class for the improvement of reading skills. Students seeking a background in foreign languages may study three years of Spanish and as much as four years of Latin.

Whether a student is on the academic, business, or general course, classes in mathematics are provided. Advanced students may go as far as calculus in their study of math. College Park students have been recognized by scholarships and other honors for outstanding ability in mathematics. Six calculus students attended the Georgia Mathematics Convention held in Atlanta.

General Science

Variety of Math and Science Courses

To keep pace with the scientific age in which we live, the youth of today must include scientific knowledge in their scholastic backgrounds. Courses in natural science, general science, biology, chemistry, human biology, and physics are offered at College Park. Chemistry and physics classes are provided with a laboratory and modern lab equipment. Members of the science classes are encouraged to take the annual field trip in February to the nuclear reactor at Oak Ridge, Tennessee.








In high spirits and under clear skies, College Park students pranced down Main Street to the tune of the marching band and the chattering crowd.
