

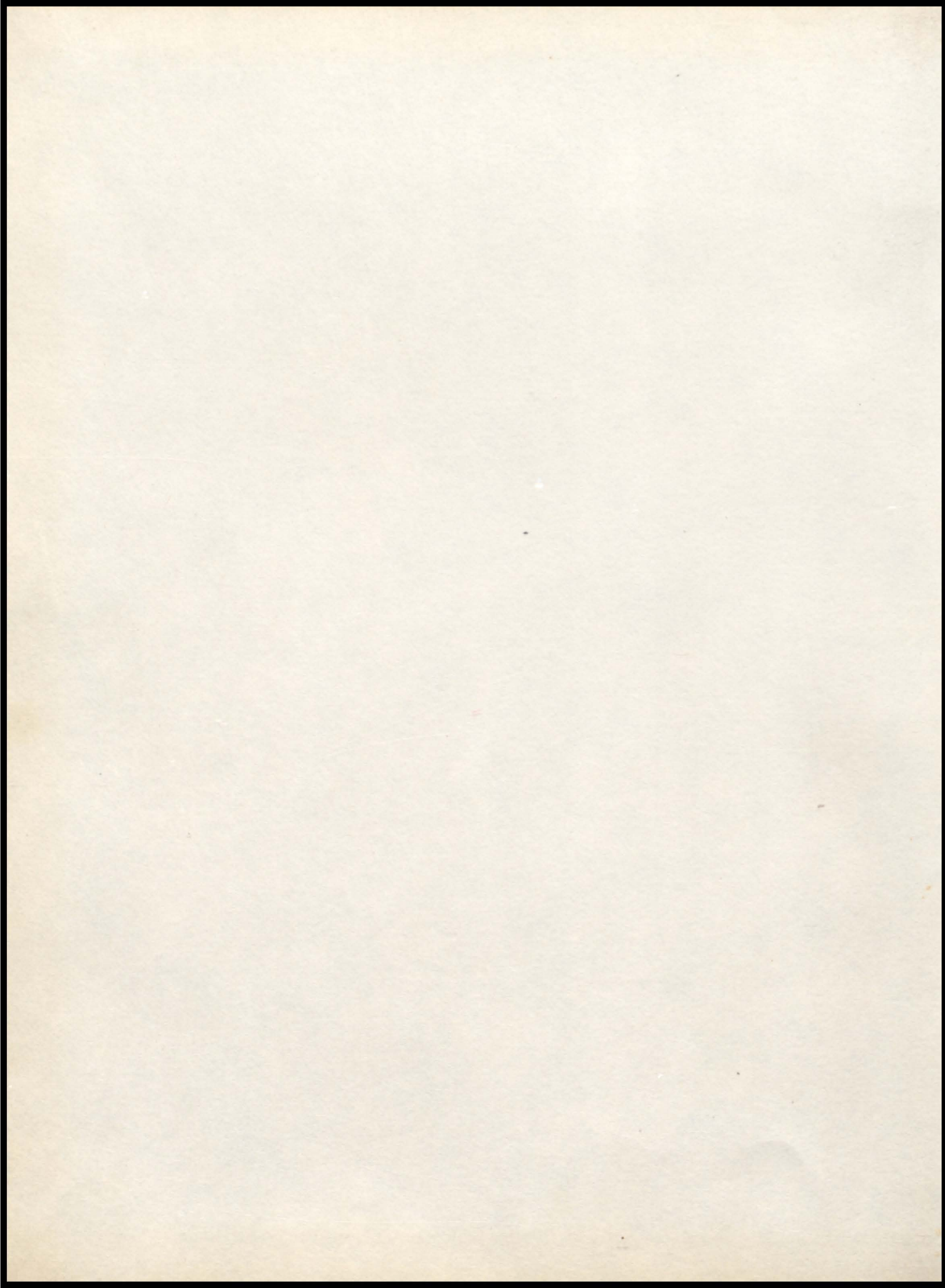

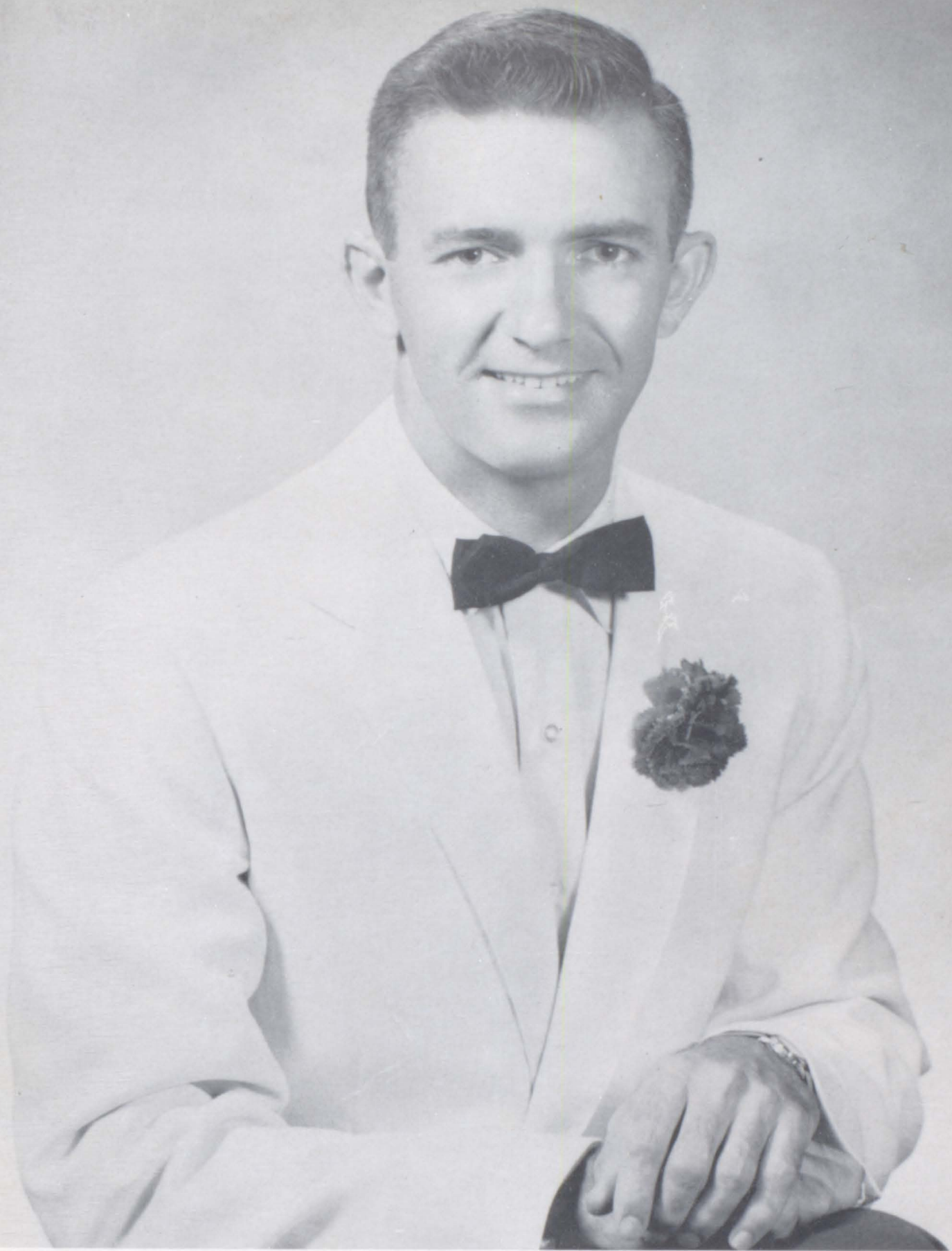
Foreword

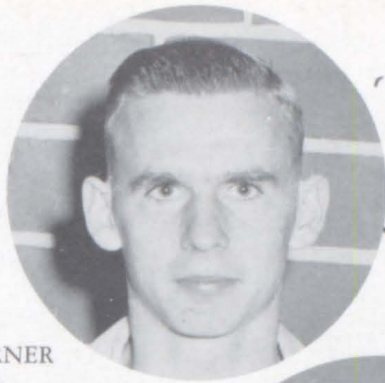

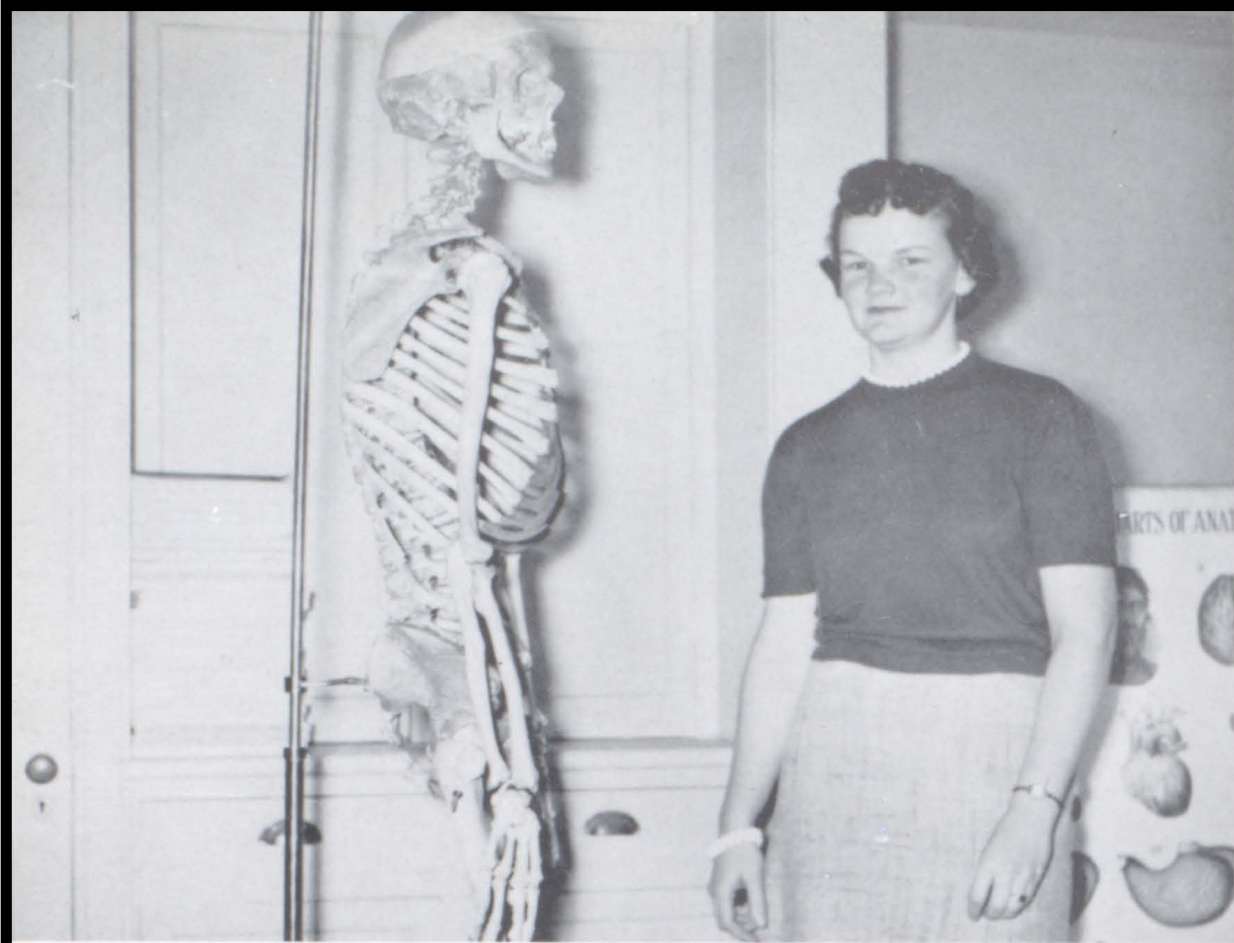

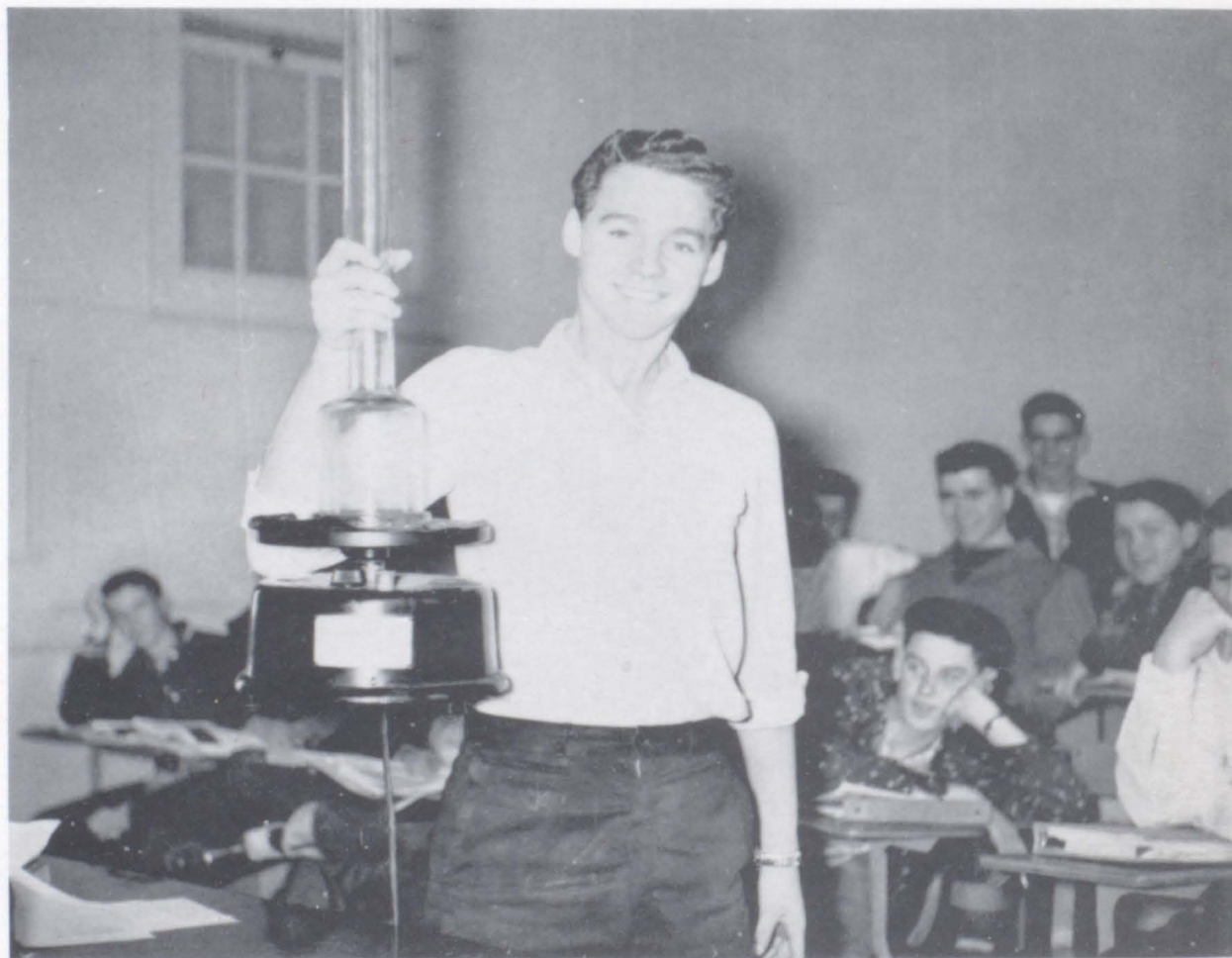

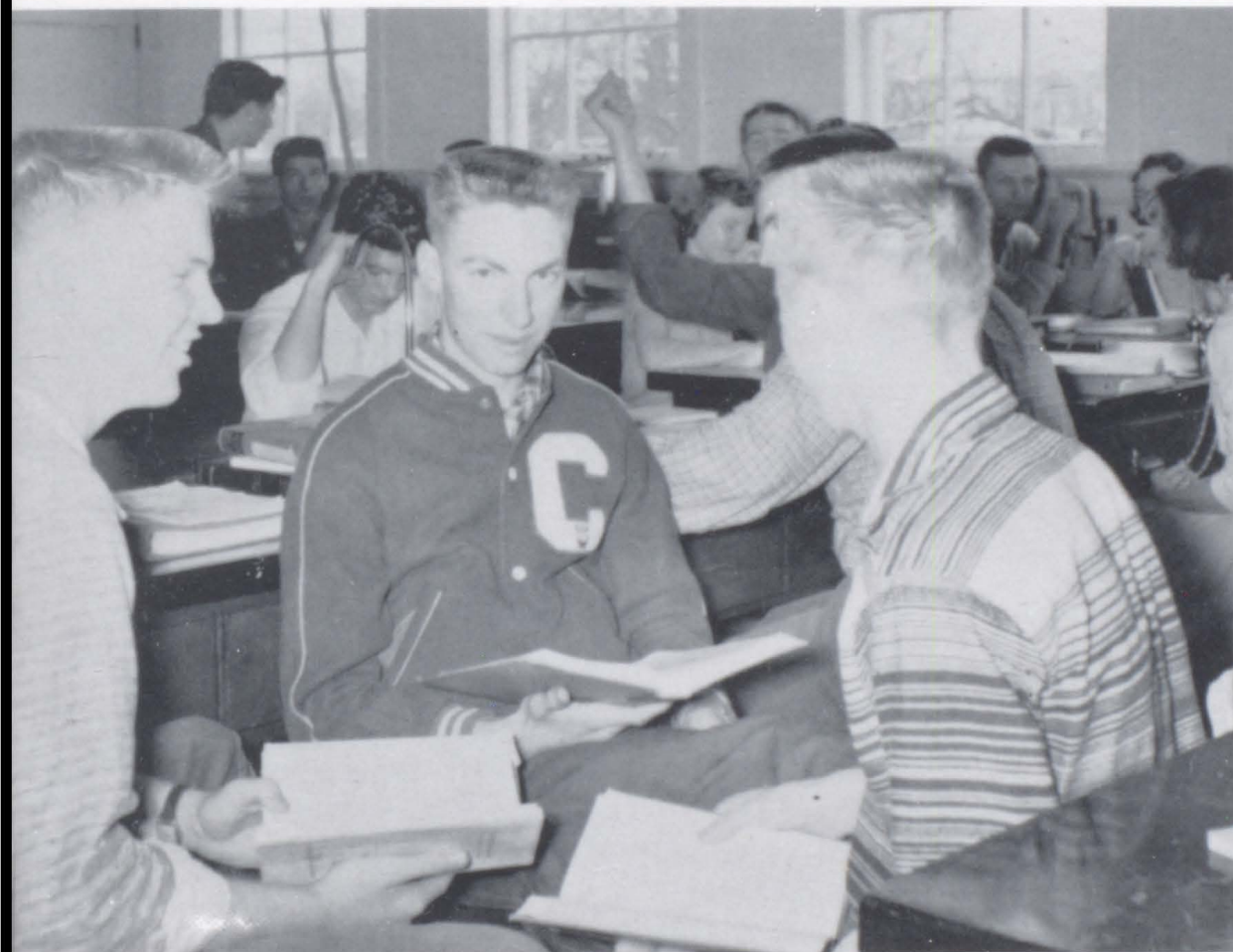

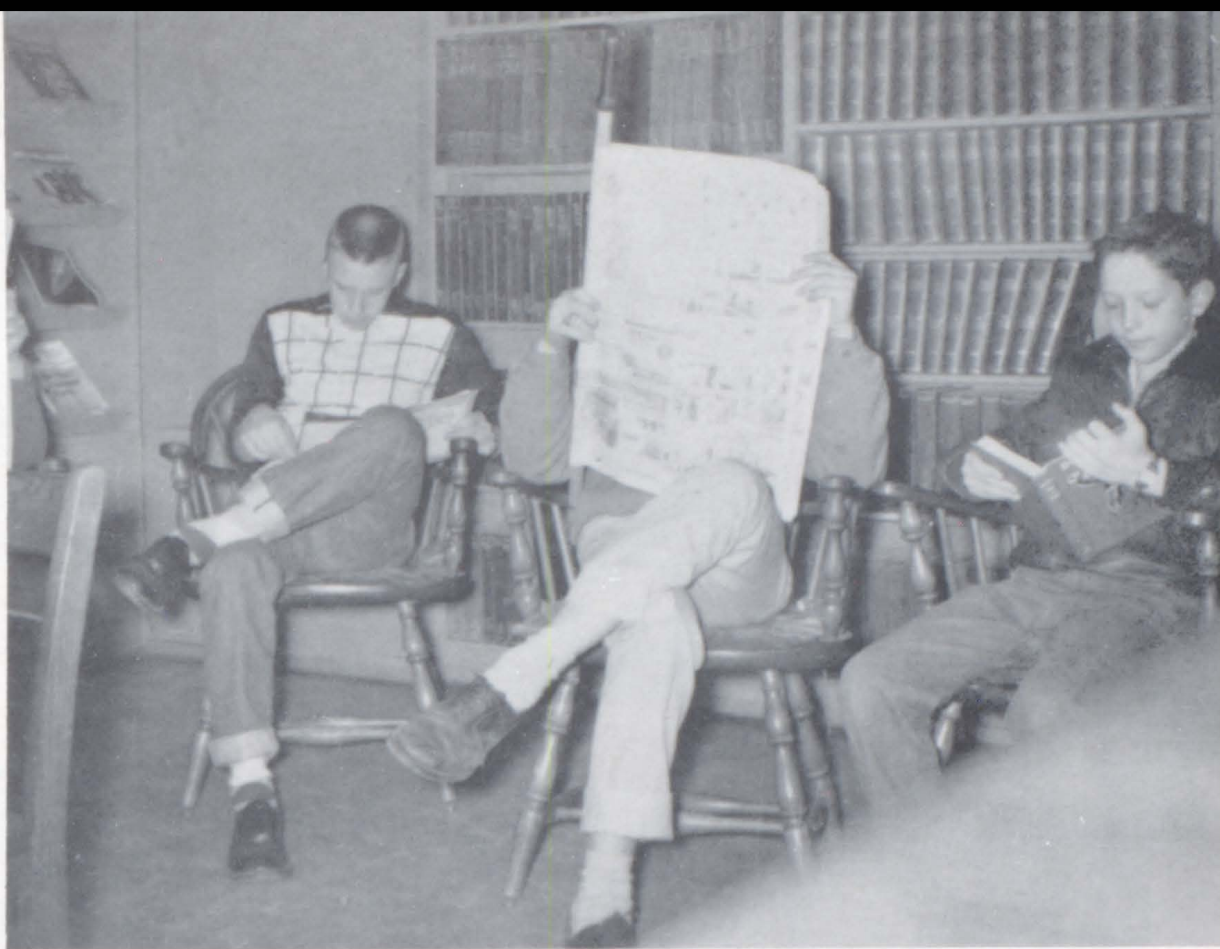

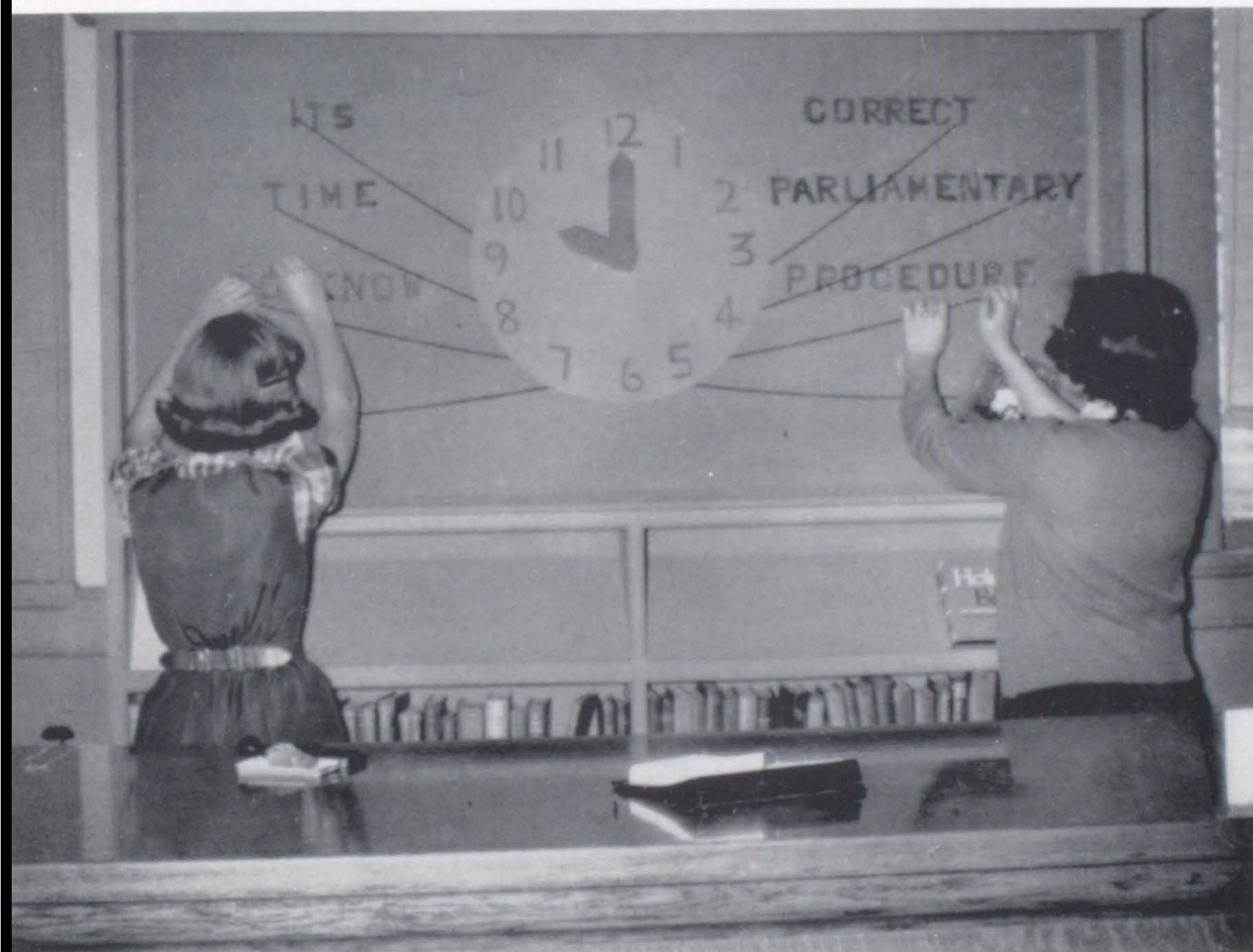
