



Foreword







This is a typical scene in Coach Hanson's physical education class. The boys are playing volleyball. The boys are in the gym so many days a week and the other days they are in classrooms studying.




David Turnipseed, Larry Duncan, Darrell Thomas, and Jerry Cleveland are demonstrating the generation of electricity in a science class.

Truette Scales, Don Ramsey, Larry Bradberry and Merrill Jenkins are doing some work in art.




Miss Suder's phy. ed class is shown here building a pyramid.
