Aries 1975 was published in association with Mr. Bill Wolfe of Atlanta and Hunter Publishing Company of Winston-Salem, N.C. Mr. Bill Kellam of Hewett Studios was the professional photographer. The cover design was done by Mr. Ken Kendricks of Phoenix Publishing Co. in Underground Atlanta and Miss Pat Drew, faculty advisor. The paper is Hunter Naturel, and the sixteen page senior section is parchment. The type and headlines are optima: 8 pt., 10pt., and 24 pt. Approximate total cost was \$5000, 450 copies were sold at 8.00 per book.
